

As a lay person who will be very much affected by the development I find the deadlines and the venue of the preliminary meeting does not allow for authentic engagement. There are 4 solar schemes proposed all within a very short space of time - the uninitiated cannot keep up and I am confused as to what is happening. The venue is distant from most citizens adjacent to the proposed project and is expensive to park at or attend especially in the working week and at peak holiday period.

This project is being presented in isolation but is really contiguous with 3 others. If permitted the projects would represent the industrialisation of vast swathes of West Lindsey. This project can be seen in isolation despite the developers presenting it in this way.

The material presented by the developers is deceptive in that it over emphasises the efficiency of solar power and under emphasises the impact on the landscape. Lincolnshire relies on agriculture, jobs related to agriculture and tourism. All of these will be detrimentally affected by the projects - this has been down played by the developers.

I do not feel engaged with a process that could have a great impact on my community. The environment is enjoyed as a holistic experience that is beneficial for mental health. Farmers have a notoriously high rate of suicide and this proposal would have a deleterious effect on residents well being.
