Purpose of the ISH

The main purpose of this ISH on Environmental Matters is to consider the matters on the agenda and which will enable me to undertake an examination of specific issues that have arisen in respect of the Relevant Representations, Councils' LIRs, other Deadline 1 submissions and the Written Representations of Interested Parties. In particular I wish to examine matters related to the following matters:

- Landscape and land use matters. In particular I will be seeking to get a full
 understanding of the effect of the development on the Character of the area
 and visual amenity of the surroundings and including in-combination effects
 with other solar NSIP developments in the area. In terms of Land use I will
 want to ensure that the impact of the development on BMV and agricultural
 production is fully understood including any cumulative effects;
- Carbon savings that would derive from the proposed development and during
 which I wish to understand the generating capacity of the generating station
 and the electricity that would be exported including from the BESS. I wish to
 also understand the operation and risks associated with the BESS. To ensure
 I have a full and proper understanding of the benefits that may derive from the
 proposed development; and
- Thirdly I wish to clarify and understand a limited number of specific issues related to a number of other topics including construction, flooding, ecology, electromagnetic fields and noise.

Applications for development consent orders are examined principally through the written process, however, hearings can be held to examine matters where this is helpful to the ExA.

There is a subject matter controlled agenda. This means that the matters for discussion on the day are those matters identified on the agenda.

I have sought to provide sufficient detail to assist the parties to prepare for the Hearings. The details set out above are indicative and I may find it necessary to include additional Agenda items or to amend the order in which the items are dealt with.

My invitations to participate in this hearing have been made on the basis that an IP is either a publicly funded or expert body with responsibility for or expertise in relevant subject matters and I am seeking their involvement to assist me in informing the Secretary of State, or that they have raised a relevant subject matter in their submissions and I have matters arising from those that I need to explore. Participation is subject to my power to control the hearing.

The objective of the hearing is to develop my understanding of the issues and consider any further issues arising, including any remaining concerns of IPs.

The event will be livestreamed and a link for watching the livestream will be posted on the project webpage of the National Infrastructure Planning website closer to the Hearing date. IPs and members of the public who wish to observe the Hearing can therefore view and listen to the Hearing using the livestream, or view and listen to the recording, after it has concluded.

Registration Process

Parties who have registered to speak (both in person and virtually) will receive a Joining Instruction email shortly before the Hearing which will include a link to the virtual event on Microsoft Teams, and a telephone number should they need to participate by telephone. To enable the Hearing to start on time at **10.00am** those attending virtually should join promptly at **9.30am** to ensure that all virtual attendees can complete the Registration Process in good time.

Procedure at ISH

Guidance under the Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 provides that it is for the ExA to probe, test and assess the evidence through direct questions of persons making oral representations at Hearings. Questioning at the Hearing will be led by the ExA. Cross questioning of a person giving evidence by another person will only be permitted if the ExA decides it is necessary to ensure representations are adequately tested or that an IP has had a fair chance to puts its case.

The hearing will finish as soon as I deem that all those present have had their say and that all matters have been covered. If there are additional matters to be dealt with, it may be necessary to defer some matters to written questions. The evidence presented orally at ISH3 should be included in post-hearing submissions and submitted by **Deadline 3 (Friday 1 September 2023).**
