Environment and landscape.

Let's look at what we have in this idyllic rural setting. Quiet and comfortable settings for families to grow and be educated about a civilised way of life. Opportunities for children to learn, touch and feel the surrounds within their rural community. Travel the district and absorb the wealth of opportunities we have. Grow and develop into adults with an understanding and appreciation of a rural lifestyle. Grow their own families with that very same environment and understanding about what is of value, for generations to come.

Should this precious area be overwhelmed by a solar farm we will see a devastation in the natural and social environment. Disruption and damage caused to land, roads / infrastructure across the whole area. Very large areas of land will be fenced off from everyone in an attempt to protect the asset. Steel security fences metres high will give a distinct impression of high security reminiscent of a prison. Natural field boundaries removed to accommodate an increased number of panels. Movement of wild life will be restricted. Landowners loosing right of access to their own property.
