- Depending on the number of requests, each party may be given a limited amount of time (as a guide each speaker should complete their submission within 10 minutes).
- Other parties who have not registered in advance to speak will be given the opportunity to address the Examining Authority.
- Following each submission, the Examining Authority may wish to ask the speaker questions.

- The Applicant will be invited to respond briefly to the matters raised, and to address questions arising from the Examining Authority. This response will be either orally after all IPs and Non-IPs have spoken, or in writing by Deadline 1.
