Firstly, I would like you to consider how utterly biased in favour of the applicant this process of comment is, and how difficult it is for an objector to be heard. Many are simply unable to navigate through and just give up, seemingly the intention to discourage objectors.

Currently, there is no access via A631 to West Burton as it is closed for weeks due to flooding from the river Idle - a regular occurrence - and main route from A1 and M62.
