University of Lincoln's Brayford campus was struck by storm Babet on Friday, causing the Brayford River to overflow and flood multiple buildings and roads.

The Environment Agency said more than a month's rain fell in the county in 24 hours.

A student from the university said: "I was parked in the NCP on the Brayford and the flooding made it so I couldn't get to my car. I had parked it there about three hours ago and it was fine. When I did manage to get to it the flooding was so bad my car started making noises!"

Areas that have been badly damaged by the floods have been sectioned off. This includes areas around Cygnet Wharf accommodation buildings.

Situated on the river's edge, the flooding has affected the surrounding walkways but the buildings themselves have miraculously avoided being breached.

The damage sustained around other parts of the river has been far more extensive.








Many of the static homes were left "knee-high" in water, according to residents

Chief fire officer and chair of the county's resilience forum Mark Baxter said the levels were as high as ever recorded at Torskey Lock and it was the area they were "monitoring most closely".

"Though the levels are broadly stabilising at the moment at the moment, so we've got teams through the Environment Agency and Fire and Rescue teams down there to keep continually assessing the situation," he said.



UPDATE: Impact of Storm Henk

eople living in a Nottinghamshire village close to a key road bridge are still facing high waters and long diversions days after the River Trent burst its banks. Dunham Bridge, which carries the A57 across the Nottinghamshire-Lincolnshire border, has been closed since Friday due to floodwater from Storm Henk.

Residents of nearby Dunham-on-Trent and passing motorists have been cut off from the opposite bank, and face a 37 mile detour until the route re-opens. Police have urged people not to attempt to cross the bridge, although one vehicle has been abandoned in the water.

Pictures show a vast expanse of water has flooded the Lincolnshire side, and shows no sign of receding. A resident says the village on the Nottinghamshire side has "gone from being Dunham-on-Trent to Dunham-by-the-Sea".
