We have a accumulative problem as Gate Burton West Burton Cottam and Tillbridge all have proposed cables going through our land that will destroy our site and make it impossible to develop

Our business Hill Agriculture have gained permitted development rights for a 1500 square metre agricultural building on top of the existing granted planning permissions Hill Agriculture have started excavating work on site.

Hill Agriculture have certainly not come to a agreement with Gate Burton Cottam West Burton or Tillbridge and will certainly not be withdrawing our objections.

Questions.

If these are temporary schemes of sixty years why are these companies insisting on easements as a lease for the term of the schemes is adequate for the cable routes.

If these are temporary schemes that have a maximum designed generated output why are these companies insisting on controlling the amount of power passing through these cables when they only need a capacity for the maximum designed generated output from there scheme.

Hill Agriculture has not received a precise and definite drawing showing the exact cable positions for all the schemes Gate Burton Cottam west Burton Tillbridge solar schemes on our site and as you can appreciate this is a massive accumulative problem and needs addressing .
