

I do not know what has been resolved during this process. My opposition remains the same though.

Cumulative impact of 4 Solar NSIPs in West Lindsey and another across the river and only a few miles between each scheme, would be a change of land use at a level never seen before.

The towering solar panels would be impossible to disguise and the distance from the solar proposal to the substation is excessive. These two aspects of the scheme are bordering on insanity.

Our distinctive landscape and views from the cliff road over tranquil agricultural Lincolnshire would be dominated by the Cottam proposal and most of the other 3 schemes. Combine this with dangerous panel glare from the sun, this already quite hazardous road could become a death trap!

Communities would quickly lose their spirit and pride in their surroundings, if the area were to become an inhospitable mass of solar panels. Mental wellbeing cannot have been assessed accurately with such a large area being transformed, this has never happened before.

These plans would totally overwhelm the countryside, our agricultural heritage and peoples lives.

I honestly do not believe the benefit outweighs the harm.
