Written submissions on Examination Procedure, including any submissions about the draft Examination Timetable and the use of virtual methods

Initial Assessment of Principal Issues

The County Council would note that in respect of 'Biodiversity' – "The construction and operational effects on protected species and their habitats including ability for fauna to maintain their ability to roam", Notable species must also be considered in respect of construction and operation effects.

The County Council would note that in respect of 'Heritage', there should be consideration of the broad setting of heritage assets and the cumulative impacts of multiple solar applications within the area.

The County Council would note that in respect of 'Landscape and Visual Impact', matters regarding the effects on users of the Public Rights of Way (PRoW) Network should also be considered.

Draft Examination Timetable - Construction Traffic

The County Council, as Local Highway Authority, wishes to support the Examination of this application through attendance and participation where necessary at Issue Specific Hearing 2 (ISH2) regarding Construction Traffic. However, the relevant Senior Development Planner - Highways and Transport (Tony Jenson) is not able to attend the meeting as programmed for Thursday 21 November 2024 10am.

The Senior Development Planner - Highways and Transport (Tony Jenson) would also be able to attend if a Construction Traffic Hearing took place w/c 24 February 2025, the programmed reserved dates for hearings within the Rule 6 letter.

The County Council Principal Strategic Planning and Infrastructure Officer (Francesca Potter) and the County Council Transport & Development Manager – East Kent (Sally Benge) are able to attend if necessary on Thursday 21 November 2024 10am. However, all matters and queries regarding highways and transportation will need to be taken away and responded to in writing following the hearing following liaison with the Senior Development Planner - Highways and Transport (Tony Jenson)
