1 STATEMENT OF COMMONALITY

1.1 **Overview**

1.1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1.1 Statements of Common Ground (SoCGs) have been prepared between Mona Offshore Wind Limited (hereafter referred to as 'the Applicant') and other parties. These have been prepared to set out the areas of agreement and disagreement with these parties in relation to the Development Consent Order (DCO) application for the Mona Offshore Wind Project.
- 1.1.1.2 In the Rule 6 Letter dated 07 June 2024, the Examining Authority (ExA) requested that the Applicant prepare a Statement of Commonality. This document provides an overview of the approach taken to capture commonality with the parties specified in the Rule 6 Letter (Table 1.1), the status of each SoCG at Deadline 1 (Table 1.2) and the agreement status with the parties for each topic (Table 1.4) in a tabular, colourcoded format as requested by the ExA.
- 1.1.1.3 This Statement of Commonality is intended to act only as a summary of the progress of the SoCGs. For full details of the items under discussion with each stakeholder, please refer to the relevant SoCG. For details of principal and other notable issues please refer to the Pre-Examination Progress Tracker (PDA-020).
- 1.1.1.4 The Statement of Commonality, SoCGs and Pre-Examination/Examination Progress Tracker will be updated at the relevant Deadlines during the Examination according to the Examination Timetable published in the Rule 8 Letter dated 23 July 2024.

1.1.2 Overview of the Mona Offshore Wind Project

- 1.1.2.1 The Mona Offshore Wind Project is a proposed offshore wind farm located in the east Irish Sea. The Mona Offshore Wind Project will include both offshore and onshore infrastructure and consist of:
 - Mona Array Area: This is where the wind turbines, Offshore Substation Platforms • (OSPs), foundations (for both wind turbines and OSPs), inter-array cables, interconnector cables and offshore export cables will be located
 - Mona Offshore Cable Corridor and Access Areas: The corridor located between • the Mona Array Area and the landfall up to Mean High Water Springs (MHWS), in which the offshore export cables will be located and in which the intertidal access areas are located
 - Intertidal access areas: The area from MHWS to Mean Low Water Springs (MLWS) which will be used for access to the beach and construction related activities
 - Landfall: This is where the offshore export cables make contact with land and the transitional area where the offshore cabling connects to the onshore cabling
 - Mona Onshore Development Area: The area in which the landfall, Mona Onshore Cable Corridor, Mona Onshore Substation, mitigation areas, temporary construction infrastructure (such as access roads and construction compounds), operational access to the Mona Onshore Substation and the 400 kV connection to National Grid infrastructure will be located



- Mona Onshore Substation: This is where the new substation will be located, • containing the components for transforming the power supplied from the offshore wind farm up to 400 kV
- Mona 400 kV Grid Connection Cable Corridor: The corridor from the Mona Onshore Substation to the National Grid substation.

-	National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc	National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc and the Applicant are in agreement that a Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) between the two parties is not necessary as updates on progress between the parties will be provided in the Land Rights Tracker (S_PD_5 Mona Land Rights Tracker) (and subsequent updates to this through the Examination). As such, National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc and the Applicant will not prepare an SoCG to be submitted during the Examination but will continue to engage on Protective Provisions and provide updates in the Land Rights Tracker.
-	Network Rail Limited	The Applicant has included draft bespoke protective provisions for the protection of Network Rail within Schedule 10 of the draft DCO and the parties are actively engaged in discussions in relation to these. Network Rail has provided the Applicant with a draft of the required Framework Agreement to manage the direct interface that the DCO has with the operational railway and to regulate certain aspects of the relationship between Network Rail and the Applicant in relation to the delivery of the Proposed DCO Development. The Framework Agreement will set out various obligations on the parties should the DCO be made. The Framework Agreement must append the following documents: Network Rail's Protective Provisions, the Asset Protection Agreement (once completed) and the Property Agreement (once completed). Network Rail is also negotiating with the Applicant the Property Agreement, which will take the form of a Lease. The parties are currently agreeing rental figures and plans are being prepared, good progress is being made to agree the final form of the Property Agreement. It is Network Rail's position that it will not withdraw its objection until the Framework Agreement has been completed. Updates on the position of negotiations with Statutory Undertakers is set out in the Land Rights Tracker (S_PD_5 Mona Land Rights Tracker). The Applicant therefore considers that a Statement of Common Ground between itself and Network Rail is not necessary at this stage as there is no further information to provide the Examining Authority. The Applicant will keep this position under review as the Examination progresses. See also the Commercial Side Agreements tracker (S_D1_24).
-	Dwr Cymru Welsh Water	The Applicant has addressed all of Dŵr Cymru Cyfyngedig's comments on the draft protective provisions and is awaiting final confirmation that the protective provisions are agreed. Therefore, the Applicant expects that an agreed set of protective provisions will be included in the draft development consent order at Deadline 2. The Applicant therefore considers that that a Statement of Common Ground between itself and Dŵr Cymru Cyfyngedig is not necessary at this stage as there is no further information to provide the Examining Authority.
