Accompanied Site Inspection itinerary – 17 October 2024

The itinerary for the accompanied site inspection can be found below. It has been informed by [PDA-003], [PDA-004], [REP1-031] and based on the draft itinerary submitted by the Applicant [REP1-003]. In drafting the present itinerary, the ExA has taken into consideration sites already visited in previous unaccompanied site inspections (USIs) (please see Examining Authority's note of USI1 [EV-001]), the possibility of being able to view suggested sites and locations from publicly accessible land which can, therefore be visited in a future USI if the ExA deems necessary, as well as the need to ensure the safety and security of all potential participants.

Please note that the Examining Authority's (ExA) inspection of sites is **not** an opportunity to provide any oral representations on the project or discuss evidence. It is an opportunity for the ExA to look at the physical features that can be seen on, or from the sites. Participants may be invited by the ExA to point out specific features or sites of interest.
