Shoplifting offences are going unpunished

More than 7,000 offences occurred over the past year but only 1,500 prosecutions

THOUSANDS of shoplifting offences in County Durham and Darlington have gone unpunished as traders continue to count the cost of stolen items.

New figures show more than 7,000 offences occurred across the region over the past year, yet only around 1,500 cases resulted in a prosecution.

Durham Constabulary has logged an alarming 23,771 shoplift-

ing offences since April 2021.

Offences reached a high in between April 2023-24 as 7,142 incidents were recorded. However, just 1,657 offences resulted in a charge or summons, according to data obtained by Personal Injury Claims UK.

In some cases, offenders were cautioned and penalty notices

were handed out. Others were resolved by community resolution.

"Shoplifting in Darlington is horrendous and jeopardises people's jobs and shops shut down because of it," said staff at MaxiDeals.

Durham Constabulary said the consequences of the crime mean everyday shoppers are paying more for food and drink.

SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

Byers Gill Solar consists of a solar farm capable of generating over 50MW Alternating Current (AC) of electricity with co-located battery energy storage system ("BESS"), located between Darlington and Stockton-on-Tees in north-east England (the "Proposed Development"). The Proposed Development is approximately 490ha and comprises six Panel Areas (groups of solar photovoltaic (PV) panels) (Panel Areas A-F). The solar PV panels would be mounted on a metal frame in groups, fixed in position with panels facing south. An on-site substation would be located within Panel Area C. The Proposed Development includes up to 32.5km of 33kilovolt (kV) underground cabiling between the Panel Areas and the on-site substation, as well as approximately 10km of 132kV underground cable to connect the Proposed Development to the grid connection at the existing Norton substation (located to the north-west of Stockton-on-Tees). This cabling could be placed either within roads or through of-froad options.

A range of supporting infrastructure is required for the Proposed Development, comprising: BESS

A range of supporting infrastructure is required for the Proposed Development, comprising: BESS; transformers and inverters; storage containers to hold this equipment; and security measures such as fencing, CCTV and lighting.

As the Proposed Development would be able to generate over 50 megawatts (MW) of electricity, it is considered to be a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) which requires consent through the Development Consent Order (DCO) process. This is an application made to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) and decided by the Secretary of State (SoS) in accordance with the Planning Act 2008.

The DCO, if granted, would enable the acquisition new rights over land and contain powers for the possession and use of land on a temporary basis (to facilitate the construction of the Proposed Development). The DCO would also authorise the construction of temporary and permanent accesses to the Proposed Development, the temporary stopping up or diversion of public rights of way, street works and highway works, and the application and disapplication of certain legislation.
