Formal Consultation under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended)

I am writing to formally consult you under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) (the "2008 Act") on Enso Green Holdings D Limited's proposals for Helios Renewable Energy Project.

Proposed Development

Enso Green Holdings D Limited (the "Applicant") is proposing a renewable energy generating project on land located to the west of the village of Camblesforth and to the north of the village of Hirst Courtney in North Yorkshire. The Proposed Development comprises the installation of ground mounted solar arrays, energy storage and associated development, including grid connection infrastructure and other infrastructure integral to the construction, operation, and maintenance of the development for the delivery of over 50 megawatts (MW) of electricity.

The Proposed Development is defined as a Nationally Significant infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the 2008 Act and given that it has a generating capacity of over 50MW, the Proposed Development requires the approval of a Development Consent Order (DCO). As such, the Applicant intends to make an application for a DCO to authorise the Proposed Development.

The proposed DCO will authorise, amongst other things:

- · Solar PV modules and mounting structures;
- Field stations including invertors, transformers and switchgears;
- On-Site substation;
- Battery energy storage system;
- Underground cables connecting the areas of solar PV modules to the onsite substation and from there to the national grid at Drax Power Station;
- · Compounds, fencing, security and ancillary infrastructure;
- Access works:
- Environmental mitigation and enhancement measures, such as archaeological mitigation, and landscape and ecological mitigation and enhancements;
- Temporary construction areas together with works to secure construction access for the Proposed Development;



- The temporary and permanent compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights which are required for the Proposed Development and/or are required to facilitate or are incidental to the Proposed Development;
- Overriding easements and other rights over or affecting the land for the Proposed Development:
- The application and or disapplication of legislation relevant to the Proposed Development including legislation relating to compulsory acquisition; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, permits and consents as are necessary and convenient.

Construction of the Proposed Development is anticipated to commence in 2026 and span a period of approximately 12 months, making it operational by 2027. Further information relating to the Proposed Development, including the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) and how to access a copy, is set out below.

Section 42 Duty to Consult

As part of the DCO process, the Applicant is required to carry out pre-application consultation in accordance with Section 42 of the 2008 Act. This requires consultation with specified local authorities, prescribed consultees and those with specified interests in the affected land. You are being consulted as you/your organisation has been identified as a prescribed consultee.

At present the Applicant does not intend to carry out any further rounds of pre-application consultation, and if so, this consultation will be the last opportunity to comment on proposals for the Helios Renewable Energy Project prior to the application for a DCO being made.

However, should the DCO application be accepted, there will be an opportunity to register with the Planning Inspectorate (the organisation which administers DCO applications) and provide a written summary of their views on the application. This will enable that person or organisation to become an Interested Party and participate in the subsequent statutory examination through which the DCO application will be assessed prior to determination by the Secretary of State.

Please be aware that a DCO removes the need for planning permission, can authorise compulsory acquisition of land and deal with many other regulatory consents which a project would otherwise need. This highlights the importance of this pre-application consultation and its role in shaping the Proposed Development.

Other consultation documents include plans and maps detailing the proposals, a Non-Technical Summary (NTS) of the PEIR, Consultation Summary Document, and feedback form.

Formal consultation under Sections 42(1)(d) and 44 of the Planning Act 2008

Dear Sir or Madam,

Following my recent letter in relation to our proposals for the Helios Renewable Energy Project in North Yorkshire, I can now confirm that we, Enso Green Holdings D Limited, have launched a statutory consultation on our proposals, which will take place from 26 October 2023 to 7 December 2023. This letter explains how to take part in the public consultation and invites you to share your views on our proposals.

This letter is being sent to you as part of our statutory consultation exercise under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008. We are consulting you on the Helios Renewable Energy Project because, having carried out diligent inquiry, we consider that you may be:

- an owner, lessee, tenant or occupier of land which is within our proposed application boundary;
- a person who holds an interest in land or has the power to sell or convey land or release land which is within our proposed application boundary; or
- a person who might be entitled to make a relevant claim if the Development Consent Order ('DCO') for our Project were to be made and implemented.

As the proposed Project has an expected generating capacity in excess of 50MW, it constitutes a 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' ('NSIP') for the purposes of the Planning Act 2008, and we will be required to make an application for a DCO to authorise the Project. Following the submission of our DCO application, the Planning Inspectorate will examine the application and will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, who will decide whether to grant or to refuse development consent.

Following feedback received during the informal consultation in 2022, as well as further technical assessments, we have refined our proposals; they now comprise a solar farm covering approximately 476 hectares (1175 acres) of land situated west of Camblesforth and north of Hirst Courtney in North Yorkshire, connected by an underground cable to a grid connection point at Drax National Grid substation. The proposed development includes the installation of ground mounted solar arrays, battery energy storage system and associated development comprising grid connection infrastructure and other infrastructure integral to the construction, operation and maintenance of the development for the delivery of over 50 megawatts (MW) of electricity.

The proposed DCO for our Project will, amongst other things, authorise:



- Solar PV modules and mounting structures;
- Field stations including invertors, transformers and switchgears;
- On-Site substation;
- Battery energy storage system;
- Underground cables connecting the areas of solar PV modules to the onsite substation and from there to the national grid at Drax Power Station;
- Compounds, fencing, security and ancillary infrastructure;
- Access works:
- Environmental mitigation and enhancement measures, such as archaeological mitigation, and landscape and ecological mitigation and enhancements;
- Temporary construction areas together with works to secure construction access for the Proposed Development;
