# PM'S AWARD FOR LOCAL CHILDREN'S AUTHOR CHRISTINA

Selby children's author Christina Gabbittas has received Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's daily 'Points of Light' award for organising eight free-to-attend children's literature festivals.

Growing up in a deprived area, Christina enjoyed spending time with her family in their local library and would have welcomed the chance to attend a literature festival, but it would have been costly for her whole family to attend. Christina wanted to make literature festivals and books accessible for children from less privileged backgrounds and was inspired to set up the 'Children's Literature Festivals' charity.

Festivals have since taken place in Selby, Blackburn with Darwen, Keighley and Oldham, with Christina organising one virtual festival during the pandemic.

This year's festival at Blackburn with Darwen will be the first to include sign language, giving the opportunity for children and families to participate in a BSL session.

In June, the charity held its first 'Children's Literature Festivals Book Awards', where children were invited to vote, comment on their favourite books, and to shine a light on librarians for all their hard work, their favourite storytelling librarian.

Through the charity, Christina has engaged with thousands of families and has

gifted more than 24,000 books to children. Her award coincides with National Libraries Week, an annual showcase and celebration of the best that libraries have to offer.

Christina said: "On behalf of all the children and families who have benefited from the festivals, it's a huge honour to receive this award. My best wish is for more areas to benefit from free to attend, inclusive literature festivals and books."

Christina is the 2,155th recipient of the Points of Light award, which was launched in April 2014 to recognise outstanding individuals making a positive change within their community and inspiring others. Each weekday, someone, somewhere in the country is selected to receive the award to celebrate their remarkable achievements.

Congratulating Christina on her award, Selby MP Keir Mather, said: "Christina's work delivering literature festivals for children from less privileged communities demonstrates the power of authors and the written word to transform young people's opportunities in life. We are remarkably lucky to have people like Christina in our community, and we can't wait to support her in whatever she decides to achieve next."

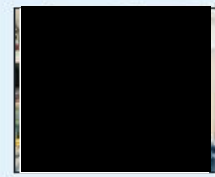

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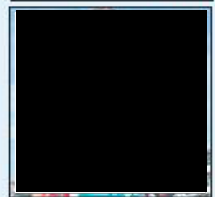

# Supermarket vouchers to help struggling residents

Householders who have been contacted to say they are eligible for support to tackle the cost of living crisis are being encouraged to claim a supermarket voucher to alleviate pressures on their finances.

The Household Support Fund is designed to help people who have been identified as struggling with the increased cost of living.

Last month, the fourth phase of the scheme was rolled out to just under 22,500 people across the county who are eligible. It will provide a one-off payment in supermarket e-vouchers to ease the pressure of global inflation.

People who will receive the Household Support Fund payments are:

- Residents who received housing benefit on, or between, January 26, 2023, and February 25, 2023, but did not qualify for the cost of living payment made in April and May 2023 for people on low income benefits or tax credits. They will receive a single e-voucher for £450.

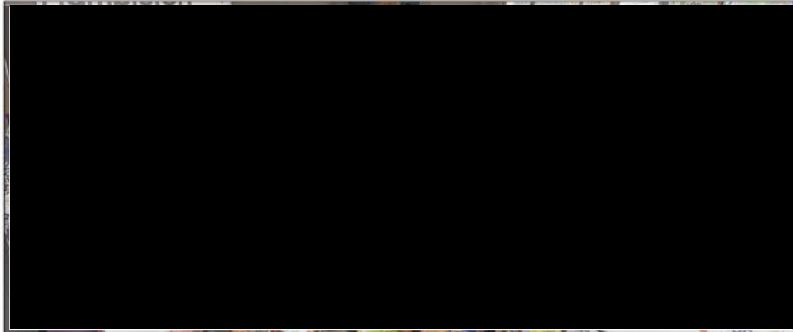
- Residents who were getting the maximum discount to pay their council tax bill through the means-tested Council Tax Reduction Scheme, as of August 14, 2023. They will receive a single e-voucher for £110.

The scheme was initially set up by the Department for Work and Pensions to help people meet the cost of energy bills, food and other essentials as the country recovered from the Covid-19 pandemic. Tens of thousands of households in North Yorkshire have already benefited from the first three rounds of the fund, which has provided vouchers to those most in need as well as access to other support.

The national criteria has been updated for the fourth phase of the scheme to help those who missed out on other cost of living support from the Government, as well as other low-income households.

So far, 82 per cent of people have claimed their voucher and the remainder of residents are being encouraged to redeem their entitlement before the deadline of Tuesday, October 24.

Cllr David Chance, North Yorkshire Council's executive



member for corporate services, said: "We would encourage everyone who is eligible to receive a Household Support Fund voucher payment to claim it.

"This is national funding and is specifically designed to help people with the rising costs of essential items, especially with the winter months around the corner. If you have received a letter to say you are eligible for a voucher, we would like to reassure you that many other people are in the same situation."

Eligible households received a letter from North Yorkshire Council last month (September) containing an individual code. This code enabled them to download a supermarket e-voucher quickly and easily through the online portal, with the option of a printed version.

North Yorkshire Council is also working with community and voluntary sector partners to support those residents who don't have family and friends nearby to call on and are unable to leave their home.

Volunteers at community groups such as Hambleton

Community Action can not only assist in downloading supermarket vouchers and print them if needed, but they also provide a "shop and drop" service for those struggling to visit a supermarket to pick up groceries due to limited mobility or ill health.

Kathryn Watts, an administrator for the Hambleton Community Action charity, said: "It's a very easy and straightforward process. Once we have their shopping list, our volunteers will do the shopping in store at a local supermarket then drop it back to their home for them.

"Alternatively, for those who wish to do their own shopping but have no transport and require a bit of support, our volunteers can drive them from their home address, accompany them shopping, help read the labels, reach for items and help at the till. They will then take them home again with their shopping."

Notice is hereby given that Enso Green Holdings D Limited, (the "Applicant") of Ropemaker Place, 28 Ropemaker Street, London, EC2Y 9HD, intends to apply to the Secretary of State under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of a renewable energy generating project known as the Helios Renewable Energy Project (the "Proposed Development"). Enso Green Holdings D Limited is a joint venture between Enso Energy and Cero Energy.

The Proposed Development includes the installation of ground mounted solar arrays, battery energy storage system and associated development comprising grid connection infrastructure and other infrastructure integral to the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the development for the delivery of over 50 megawatts (MW) of electricity. The Proposed Development will occupy land located to the west of the village of Camblesforth and to the north of the village of Hest Courtney in North Yorkshire, within the administrative area of North Yorkshire Council.

The Proposed Development is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which an EIA is required and the application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement (ES).

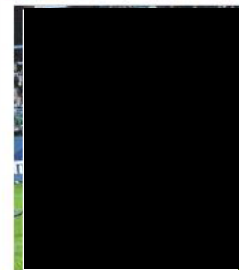
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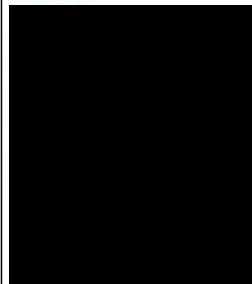

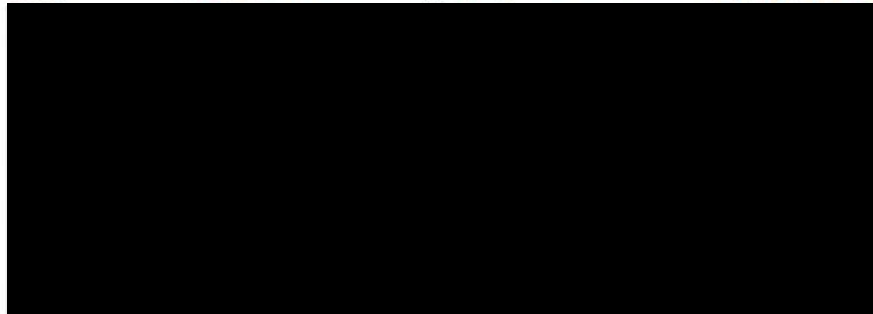

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## Leader condemns Israeli flag removal

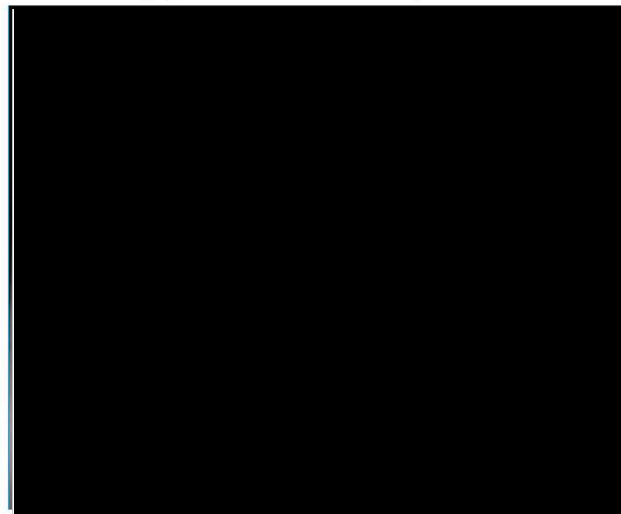
Protesters scale Town Hall in demonstration over violence

POLITICAL leaders in South Yorkshire have strongly condemned protesters who scaled the Town Hall to replace an Israeli flag with a Palestinian one during a protest about the escalating violence. Yesterday, people in the scaled-off Gaza strip saw almost continuous air strikes in retaliation to the killing of what the Israeli military says was more than 1,200 people, including 155 soldiers, by Hamas. In Gaza, authorities say 1,055 people have been killed and 1,500 Hamas militants who the Israeli Defence Force said have been killed. In Sheffield, the Labour mayor of the city said the protesters "put themselves and others in serious danger". The Star of David state flag flying over the building drew criticism from Green councillors and pro-Palestinian campaigners, and it was taken down by people who climbed the building during a march through the city centre. Marchers chanted, "Take it down, Tom", referring to council leader Cousin Tom Hunt. Cousin Hunt said "Everyone has the right to safe and peaceful protest, but we cannot support the events that took place during the protest outside Sheffield's Town Hall. "We are a City of Sanctuary and this is not what we stand for. "There are strong feelings about the situation in Israel and Palestine but we ask everyone to show

respect and tolerance at this time. Our thoughts are with all those affected, including here in the UK. The Mayor of South Yorkshire, Oliver Coppard, also criticised the protest, saying it "does not reflect the values of the region I know". However, the local Green Party opposed the raising of the Israeli flag, saying it would have been more appropriate for the council to raise a peace flag to "show our opposition to all acts of terror by whoever commits it". It comes as Buckingham Palace said the King was "appalled" by and condemns the "barbaric acts" of terrorism in Israel. He was said to be "extremely concerned" about the situation and has asked to be actively updated. Meanwhile, Foreign Secretary James Cleverly flew out to the Middle Eastern country, to express the UK's solidarity as it was reported that 17 UK nationals are either dead or missing, including children. Veteran broadcaster Nick Robinson defended the corporation, saying "No-one watching the reporting of my BBC colleagues in Israel can have any doubt of the horror of what has happened. "I understand entirely why some want the word 'terrorism' used. The report states Little Ouseburn Parish Council applied to manage grass cutting outside some cottages, but the parish "did not evidence legal competence". Stokesley Town Council's bid to manage off-street parking was rejected as North Yorkshire Council stood to lose income. **Continued on Page 2.**

## Selfies can make women feel they look slimmer

SOCIAL media selfies could have a "more powerful influence" on a woman's body satisfaction, a study has suggested. Researchers in York found women were perceived as slimmer in selfies than in photographs taken from other angles. How a person judges someone's body shape online could also be related to how they perceive images on social media and how they feel about their own body, researchers said. The study by Ruth Knight, of York St John University and Catherine Preston, of the University of York, used photos of 10 female volunteers which were judged by 272 people. These included a traditional portrait, selfie taken from arms' length, one using a selfie stick, and one from the volunteer's own perspective, with the camera looking down from the chin. Those in the study judged the models to be slimmer in selfies than in the traditional portrait photos, while pictures taken from the chin down were deemed the least slim and least attractive.
