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AI could help terrorists develop bioweapons, report warns

Rishi Sunak will say today that the government must be "honest" about the risks posed by artificial intelligence as an official report warns that it could pose an "existential threat".

The prime minister believes that while there are significant opportunities from AI, it also "brings new dangers

and fears". A government paper on AI, written with the support of 50 experts, says that by 2025 it could be used to commit fraud and mount cyberattacks. It suggests that by then it will have the potential to "enhance terrorist capabilities" in developing weapons, planning attacks and producing propaganda.

The range of more severe risks that could emerge by 2030 includes "mass

disinformation", an "unemployment crisis" as AI takes low-skilled jobs, and the use of the technology to help terrorists develop biological weapons.

In a speech to be given in London, Sunak says that he is addressing "those fears head on" to give the public the "peace of mind that we will keep you safe". He says AI will bring "new knowledge, new opportunities for economic

growth, new advances in human capability, and the chance to solve problems we once thought beyond us... but it also brings new dangers and new fears".

The paper from the Government Office for Science published to accompany Sunak's speech says there is insufficient evidence to rule out a threat to humanity from AI. Based on sources including UK intelligence, it says that

many experts believe this is a "risk with very low likelihood and few plausible routes", and would need the technology to "outpace mitigations, gain control over critical systems and be able to avoid being switched off". However, it adds: "Given... significant uncertainty in predicting AI developments, there is insufficient evidence to rule out that

Netanyahu defies Biden with push for invasion

The Israeli prime minister insisted last night that he was pressing ahead with an invasion of Gaza despite reports that he had been told by President Biden to delay it.

The US has publicly said that the timing of any ground attack against Hamas is solely a matter for Benjamin Netanyahu's war cabinet. However, in private Biden's administration has been pressing hard for a postponement while it moves more air-defence systems to the Middle East in case the war spreads.

In a television address, Netanyahu said that a special war cabinet was responsible for deciding the timing of the "ground incursion", adding: "I won't specify when, how, how many." The timing "was determined unanimously by the war cabinet and the chief of staff", he said, adding: "We will extract the full price from these murderers."

There are increasing fears that the rhetoric of Hezbollah and Iran in recent days means an escalation of the conflict is inevitable. The US is concerned about the safety of its troops stationed in Kuwait, Jordan, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates; bases in Iraq and Syria have already come under fire.

Washington also fears that Hamas will have an advantage in the miles of tunnels they have spent years constructing in Gaza and its street-to-street fighting across terrain it knows well.

The US has not called for a ceasefire but instead stressed that Israel must abide by the laws of armed conflict. Biden said yesterday: "When this crisis is over, there has to be a vision of what comes next, and, in our view, it has to be a two-state solution."

Labour rift deepens over calls for Gaza ceasefire

Rush to stop shadow ministers resigning after Starmer meeting 'makes matters worse'

Sir Keir Starmer is said to have failed to heal the rift within his party over the Israel and Gaza conflict with a meeting that "made matters worse" after earlier comments that left Muslim voters feeling "goaded" and "betrayed".

The Labour leader and his deputy, Angela Rayner, spoke to about 12 Muslim MPs and peers yesterday in an attempt to ease tensions heightened by

an interview in which Starmer appeared to say that Israel had the right to cut off power and water to Gaza.

He has since clarified that he was referring to Israel's right to defend itself, but the widely shared clip — described as "toxic" by one MP — has prompted thousands of emails from Muslim voters, councillor resignations, and open letters from those still representing the party.

Up to four shadow ministers were on resignation watch last night, including Sarah Owen, the shadow faith minister,

and Rachel Hopkins, the shadow Cabinet Office minister, with an operation under way to keep them on side.

"There's a real concern that if we lost a shadow minister, for example, all of the others come under real pressure," one frontbencher said.

The party leader's spokesman had earlier declined to say whether Yasmin Qureshi, a shadow equalities minister, would be disciplined for failing to toe the party line after calling for a ceasefire during prime minister's questions. Starmer attempted to quell concerns

by backing the suggestion of "humanitarian pauses", which are expected to be proposed by the US. However, he fell short of backing a full ceasefire, which an increasing number of his MPs are calling for. Some 150 Muslim Labour councillors wrote to Starmer and Rayner yesterday urging them to back an "immediate ceasefire" in Gaza.

A source told The Times it was "unacceptable" that the party would not back a ceasefire. They said people were "still feeling goad" by Starmer's

MAJOR DEVELOPMENT COULD DOUBLE THE SIZE OF EGGBOROUGH

Outline plans for a major new housing development that would see the village of Eggborough more than double in size have been submitted to North Yorkshire Council for consideration.

Described as a 'landmark sustainable community', the proposed residential development would be built on 70 hectares of farmland to the west of the existing village and would include 1,500 new low carbon homes, a new primary school and nursery, assisted living units for older people or those with learning disabilities, areas of accessible public open space and the creation of a variety of wildlife habitats. The proposed development site falls within the parish of Kellington and its south-east corner is close to Whitley Bridge Railway Station.

Applicants Banks Property Ltd, S.G. Poskitt, M. H. Poskitt Ltd and D. A. Gray, describe the proposed development as an 'integrated extension to the village of Eggborough' that would support around 295 full-time jobs during the construction period, as well as a further 370 jobs indirectly in the regional supply chain.

Although the proposed site falls outside the development limits defined in the Selby District Local Plan, as adopted in 2005, applicant Banks Property said that its proposals have been 'developed in line with the emerging Selby Local Plan', and that its proximity to the Core 62 and Konec 62 employment hubs mean it would provide new housing options for people and businesses looking to move to the area. The company also said that it is looking to improve rail and bus connectivity in the area 'to complement existing local road infrastructure'.



Described as a family firm, Banks Property is part of the County Durham-headquartered Banks Group. This week, the company revealed that it had launched its Eggborough project at the beginning of the year and has already carried out a range of consultation activities with the local community before submitting its outline planning application. It said that local feedback has been factored into its proposals and further community consultation activities are planned for the coming months.

Jamilah Hassan, Community Relations Manager at the Banks Group, said: "This site is included in the draft Selby Local Plan as a housing-led location

and offers the opportunity to create a landmark development that will help Eggborough continue to thrive for decades to come.

"We've worked hard to share as much information as possible about our ideas across local communities over the last few months and we're grateful to all those who've taken the time to speak to our team about them.

"Increasing the local and regional supply of quality housing will help to attract people to live and work here, which will, in turn, support the development of the local economy, while ensuring there is affordable quality housing will also mean

TICKET OFFICE IS SAVED AS U-TURN ANNOUNCED

A decision to reverse plans to scrap Selby rail ticket office, along with 973 others in the country has been announced by Transport Secretary, Mark Harper.

Passenger watchdogs Transport Focus and London TravelWatch both confirmed on Tuesday, October 31 that they had objected to all the proposals from the Rail Delivery Group to close ticket offices in England.

Plans to 'modernise' customer service across the rail network were drawn up in July of this year and involved moving staff out of ticket offices, forcing passengers to rely on ticket vending machines for their commute.

Upon hearing the news, local people took to a public consultation to voice their concerns, with the newly-appointed Selby MP Keir Mather even writing to the transport minister, Huw Merriman urging him to halt the closure of the "indispensable" office.

This country-wide consultation received over 680,000 responses and is something the secretary of Selby and District Rail Users Group, Terry French cites as the reason for the government U-turn.

Terry explained: "It's the strength of the people who came together during that consultation that made all the difference.

"We encouraged locals to put forward their representations regarding our well-used ticket office."

Terry said that the group were "delighted" to hear that the plans had been scrapped, adding: "They should never have been put forward in the first place, they were ill-thought-out and our ticket office was not thoroughly researched.

"Many local and vulnerable people would have been left stranded had the proposals gone ahead.

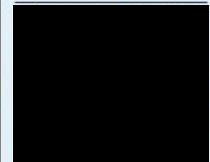

WOMAN'S GRAND ACHIEVEMENT IN MEMORY OF SON

An inspirational Howden woman has raised £1,170 for three charities in memory of her son who sadly died at just eight-years-old after a battle with leukaemia.

Philippa Lightowler took on the Yorkshire Marathon in memory of her son Lewis who died in 2008, to raise money for three children's cancer charities including Candlelighters, Martin House Children's Hospice and A Shining Light.

Already a keen runner, Philippa regularly runs and has taken part in a number of half marathons over the years, but this time Philippa decided to push herself even further by taking on a full 26.2 mile marathon to raise vital funds for the causes which are all close to her heart.

The dedicated fundraiser has raised thousands of pounds over the years in Lewis's memory and has been a long term supporter of children's cancer charity Candlelighters as well as Martin House Children's Hospice, the hospice which cared for Lewis and supported the family through their heartbreaking loss.

Speaking about the two charities Philippa said: "I don't know how we would have coped without Martin House. They gave us exactly what we needed at that time.

"When we knew Lewis wasn't going to recover we were given the option of staying in hospital, going home or moving to a hospice. We knew we didn't want to be at home so chose to go to the hospice and we were there a couple days before Lewis passed away.

"The staff were amazing, they allowed us to stay for a week, and moved Lewis to a room where we could see him and spend time as a family.

"Even now they still keep in touch with us, sending Christmas and Birthday cards, so I always try to give something back to them, as well as supporting Leeds based children's cancer charity, Candlelighters when I can too."
