Afternoon Peter

I hope all is well.

Following our recent discussion with regards to the archaeological mitigation for the Helios site, I have done a draft of the potential mitigation areas based on our conversation. Please find attached figures showing the proposed archaeological mitigation areas, along with the figure showing the field numbers. Figs 1-2 are overviews with figs 3-7 showing the close up areas of mitigation.

Below is the rationale as to why these areas have been identified for mitigation.

Arch mitigation Area 1 - Fields 2&3 – P3 and P4 anomalies identified as potential archaeology straddling field boundary between fields 2&3 – displays similar morphology to other more definite discrete enclosures across the site.

Arch mitigation Area 2 - Field 8 – Anomalies A1, A2, A3 possible D-shaped enclosures. P5 is a weaker anomaly – this is not the primary reason to raise the panels but can be captured within the area

Arch mitigation Area 3 - Field 5 – Anomaly A4 enclosure. Anomaly P6 is more uncertain and is located within the buffer setback from the hedgerow boundary.

Arch mitigation Area 4 - Fields 26 & 32 - Anomalies A7, A8 and A9 cross over the boundary between fields 26 & 32. Trapezoid enclosure

Arch mitigation Area 5 – Field 36 – Anomalies P9 and P10 – possible enclosures with central ring ditch.

Arch mitigation Area 6 – Field 38 – Anomalies A6 and A5 – possible enclosure with circular feature within, possible ring ditch.
