1. Introduction

1.1. Overview

- 1.1.1. This Statement of Common Ground ('SoCG') has been prepared by Enso Green Holdings D Limited (the 'Applicant') in conjunction with National Highways in respect of the Helios Renewable Energy Project Development Consent Order (the 'Proposed Development').
- 1.1.2. The SoCG sets out the matters of agreement between the Applicant and National Highways and also explains those matters which, at the time of writing, remain in progress, or where agreement has not been achieved.
- 1.1.3. This SoCG is based on National Highways' Relevant Representation received on 10 October 2024 [RR-267] and additional correspondence with National Highways.
- 1.1.4. The SoCG will be amended as the examination progresses in order to enable a final version to be submitted to the Examining Authority.
- 1.1.5. [This SoCG covers all the matters which are relevant to National Highways.]

2. Record of Engagement

2.1. Summary of consultation and engagement

- 2.1.1. There have been various meetings and correspondence between the Applicant and National Highways relating to the Proposed Development, which is set out in full at ES Chapter 10: Transport and Access [APP-030].
- 2.1.2. Since receiving National Highways' Relevant Representation, the Applicant has corresponded with NH to discuss and resolve the matters that have been raised. This correspondence is summarised in Table 2.1 below.
