

# **Preliminary Meeting Note**

#### 1. Welcome and Introduction

Ken Taylor (KT) welcomed those present and introduced himself as the single Examining Authority (ExA) to examine the Helios Renewable Energy application.

KT explained the appointment was made by delegation from the Secretary of State (SoS) for the Department of Housing, Communities and Local Government on 31 July 2024.

KT explained that the ExA would be examining the application made by Enso Green Holdings D Limited ('the Applicant') before making a recommendation to the Secretary of State who will decide whether an Order granting Development Consent for the proposed project, which is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP), should be made.

KT explained the purpose of the Preliminary Meeting (PM) and noted that the Examination will commence after the PM closes.

The ExA confirmed that all documents and submissions received and accepted during the Examination will be published on the project-specific page of the National Infrastructure Planning website.

# 4. Initial Assessment of Principal Issues

The ExA explained the purpose of the Initial Assessment of Principal Issues (section 88 of the PA2008), which can be found in <u>Annex C</u> of the <u>Rule 6</u> letter of 1 November 2024 and asked for any observations on them.

Burn Gliding Club agreed the Initial Assessment of Principle Issues are appropriate however raised concerns that the current structure and topics would not be the best way to address the issues which the Applicant creates for the Burn Gliding Club. Safety, Glint and Glare and Socio-Economic issues are interrelated in terms of the potential effects on the Burn Gliding Club operations. The issue of Cumulative impacts is of particular significance to Burn Gliding Club and requested that Burn Airfields and Burn Gliding Club are dealt with as a designated issue and a designated hearing is arranged for this purpose.

# 5. Examination Timetable

The ExA noted requests, already received in writing, to amend the draft Examination Timetable contained in Annex D of Rule 6 letter and also welcomed further suggestions from the parties in attendance.

The Applicant advised the ExA it would not be intending to submit updated documents at every deadline unless there had been a material change, however it will submit a list of changes at every deadline.

All comments received were duly noted by the ExA and considerations will be reflected in the Rule 8 Letter.
