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# Appendix B-1: Section 47 notice publicising the Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)

#### Notice of Consultation Tillbridge Solar Section 47 Planning Act 2008 Notice Publicising a Statement of Community Consultation

Tillbridge Solar Limited ("we") intends to provide a new solar energy and storage scheme (the "Scheme") within the administrative boundary of West Lindsey District Council and Lincolnshire County Council, with the grid connection infrastructure also located within the administrative boundary of Bassetlaw District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council.

As the proposed generating capacity exceeds 50 megawatts (MW), the Scheme, known as Tillbridge Solar, is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the Planning Act 2008 (the "Act").

The Scheme will consist of:

- the construction, operation (including maintenance) and decommissioning of ground mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) panel arrays to generate electricity located on a "Principal Site" approximately five kilometres (km) to the east of Gainsborough and approximately 13 km to the north of Lincoln.
- A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) located on the Principal Site, allowing for the generation, storage, import and export of electricity to the national electricity transmission network.
- Supporting electrical infrastructure on the Principal Site, including up to two substations (with a 400 kilovolt (KV) underground cable circuit interconnecting the two).
- A Cable Route Corridor, comprising underground 400 kV cables connecting the Principal Site in West Lindsey, Lincolnshire, to National Grid's Cottam substation in Bassetlaw, Nottinghamshire.
- Associated infrastructure, mitigation and enhancement measures/green infrastructure, and other ancillary works, for example, fencing, security, local grid connections, temporary access roads, permanent means of access, highway works, temporary works compounds and work sites.

#### Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)

We will apply to the Secretary of State, via the Planning Inspectorate, for a Development Consent Order (DCO), which would authorise the construction of the scheme under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (the Act).

In accordance with Section 47 of the Act, before making our application, we have produced a SoCC, setting out how we will consult with the local community about our proposals. The statement is available to the public at the local information points (listed below) between Tuesday 30 May and Tuesday 11 July 2023. Following our provision of the SoCC, we will carry out the consultation in accordance with the SoCC.

This notice contains information on where and when the SoCC can be inspected and provides a summary of the consultation details. Full details of the consultation can be found in the SoCC. The SoCC can be viewed online, alongside our consultation materials, at www.tillbridgesolar.com/documents-library or at the following local information points during our consultation period (from Tuesday 30 May until Tuesday 11 July 2023). 





- We have previously been engaging on our early-stage proposals for Tillbridge Solar and will be consulting on our more developed proposals in 2023.

- This SoCC will set out how we are proposing to consult with people living in the vicinity of the scheme (the local community) and wider stakeholders, including statutory and technical consultees.

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


# Tillbridge Solar SoCC – key principles



- We will be consulting with local communities through sending information directly to a dedicated primary consultation zone. This is currently approximately 5,000 properties and will be refined as we continue to define our red line boundary for statutory consultation.
- This boundary is defined by a minimum of 2km from the red line boundary and considers factors such as zone of theoretical view.
- People will receive a consultation leaflet, which will also be sent electronically to key stakeholders, including parish councils, elected representatives and local interest groups.

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# Section 1: Introduction

# 1.1 Purpose of the document

- 1.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited ("we" or "the Applicant") is preparing a Development Consent Order (DCO) application under the Planning Act 2008 for a new solar energy and storage scheme located on land to south, east and south east of Gainsborough and to the north west of Lincoln ("the Application").
- 1.1.2 This document is a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) which sets out how we intend to consult people ahead of our application for development consent for the Tillbridge Solar scheme (hereinafter referred to as the "Scheme").
- 1.1.3 The Scheme is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of the Planning Act 2008 (the Act) and requires consent from the Secretary of State (SoS) for Business, Energy, and Industrial Strategy (BEIS), via a DCO. Accordingly, this SoCC has been prepared pursuant to section 47(1) of the Act which requires applicants to 'prepare a statement setting out how the applicant proposes to consult about the proposed application with people living in the vicinity of the land' and Regulation 12 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the Regulations) which outlines the requirements for such statements in respect of environmental information.
- 1.1.4 This SoCC has been prepared with reference to guidance on pre-application consultation published by the Government and the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) and sets out the approach to consultation with the community in the vicinity of the Scheme.
- 1.1.5 In accordance with section 47 paragraphs (2) to (5) of the Act, in developing this SoCC, we are consulting with and will have regard to comments from the following section 43(1) local planning authorities:
  - West Lindsey District Council;
  - Bassetlaw District Council;
  - Lincolnshire County Council; and
  - Nottinghamshire County Council.

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- 1.1.6 In accordance with section 47, paragraph (6) of the Act, the Applicant will be publishing this document in a newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the land. It will also be shared with neighbouring local planning authorities upon publication.
- 1.1.7 The document outlines how people can learn more about the Scheme and engage with the process, prior to an application for development consent being submitted, provides a brief overview of what we are proposing to develop and what we will be consulting on, and the statutory pre-application consultation process.
- 1.1.8 This document also describes consultation on the Scheme in relation to other solar DCO consultations in the area.
- 1.1.9 Additionally, it sets out how we will have regard to consultation responses in finalising the proposals for the Scheme, which will be submitted as an application for development consent to the SoS.

# Section 2: Nationally Significant infrastructure Projects

- 2.1.1 As the Scheme is an onshore generating station located in England with a proposed generation capacity of more than 50 megawatts (MW), the Scheme will be classified as an NSIP in accordance with sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of the Act. The consenting regime for NSIPs comes under the Act and requires the Applicant to apply for a DCO to develop the Scheme.
- 2.1.2 The Applicant intends to submit an application for a DCO under section 37 of the Act to PINS.
- 2.1.3 The Application would be examined by an examining authority appointed through PINS – the independent body responsible for examining NSIPs – who would make a recommendation on the application to the SoS. The SoS makes the final decision on a DCO application. This process is explained further in Figure 2.1.
- 2.1.4 Before submitting an application, the Act requires us to carry out consultation with people living in the vicinity of the land and prescribed stakeholders.
- 2.1.5 Early involvement of communities, local authorities and other stakeholders helps to ensure we identify valuable information about the potential effects of the Scheme and provides an opportunity for early feedback from stakeholders to help shape the Scheme's development.

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


- 2.1.6 Early involvement also ensures that potential mitigation measures can be considered and, where appropriate, built into our designs before an application for development consent is submitted.

- 2.1.8 PINS has also published a range of advice notes, which intend to inform applicants, consultees, the public and others about a range of process matters in relation to the Planning Act 2008 process. 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# Section 3: About Tillbridge Solar

## 3.1 The Developer

## Tillbridge Solar Limited

- 3.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited is a joint venture between Tribus Clean Energy Ltd and Canadian Solar, who are both experienced developers of renewable energy projects. We are being supported by a team of technical specialists.
- 3.1.2 Founded in 2018, Tribus Clean Energy Ltd specialises in the development of renewable energy projects and has a UK solar PV development pipeline of over 1.5 gigawatts (GW) and a pipeline of over three gigawatt hours (GWh) of Battery and Energy Storage Systems (BESS).
- 3.1.3 Founded in 2001, Canadian Solar is a leading manufacturer of solar PV modules and provider of solar energy solutions and has a UK solar development pipeline of over 2GW, with over 4GWh of BESS.

# Section 4: The Scheme

# 4.1 The proposed development

- 4.1.1 The Scheme is located approximately five kilometres (km) to the east of Gainsborough and approximately 13 km to the north of Lincoln.
- 4.1.2 The Scheme comprises two distinct sections, which are:
  - 'the Principal Site', which is the location where ground mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, electrical substations and energy storage facilities will be installed; and
  - 'the Cable Route Corridor', which will comprise the underground electrical infrastructure required to connect the Principal Site to the national transmission system.
- 4.1.3 The Principal Site covers an area of approximately 1,400 hectares (ha) and is located entirely within the administrative area of West Lindsey District Council. The Principal Site comprises:
  - Developable areas where all solar PV panels and associated infrastructure

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would be located. This area sits on approximately 900 ha of predominantly agricultural land; and


- Non-developable areas areas that are being considered for mitigation and enhancement, such as tree planting and habitat creation. This area amounts to approximately 500 hectares.
- 4.1.4 The electricity generated from the Scheme would then connect to National Grid's Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire. The Applicant has secured a Bilateral Connection Agreement (BCA) with National Grid to allow 500MW of renewable energy to be transferred in to and out of their substation. We are now working to refine our proposals to ensure the Scheme can generate as much energy as possible in line with this agreement.
- 4.1.5 The underground Cable Route Corridor would be approximately 16 km in length, and crosses the administrative areas of West Lindsey District Council and Bassetlaw District Council.
- 4.1.6 The parameters of the Scheme within the Principal Site are at an early stage in the design process and will be refined as the Scheme progresses, taking into account environmental and technical factors, and consultation responses. An indicative parameter plan has been derived providing a snapshot in time showing the potential locations of the key components of the Scheme. This includes the location of the solar PV modules, the battery energy storage system, transformer stations, switchgear, two sub-stations, control room and storage facilities and the access into and through the site for construction and maintenance.
- 4.1.7 The Scheme would consist of the following principal infrastructure:
  - Solar PV modules;
  - PV module mounting structures fixing the PV panels together in groups known as strings;
  - String combiner boxes;
  - Solar Direct Current (DC)/Alternating Current (AC) Invertors required to convert the DC electricity collected by the solar PV modules into AC, allowing electricity generated to be exported to the National Grid;
  - Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) providing peak generation and grid balancing services;

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- Battery DC/DC convertors which manages the charge and discharge of the battery;
- Low voltage (LV)/Medium Voltage (MV) transformer stations including switchgear – which control the voltage of electricity generated across the site before it reaches the substation;
- MV/HV transformer stations and switch gear;
- On-site cabling required to connect the solar PV modules and BESS to inverters, and the inverters to the transformers on-site;
- Weather monitoring stations;
- Fencing and security measures;
- Building with control room and operation/maintenance facilities, including storage;
- Grid connection and HV cable route;
- Main access into the site for construction purposes off the main highway; and
- Access tracks for construction and maintenance.

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# 4.2 Vision and objectives

4.2.1 Our vision for the Scheme is to deliver cleaner, greener, and lower cost energy, while also enhancing the local environment and ensuring we are a responsible developer.

4.2.2 Our objectives are to:

- Build a solar farm that will contribute to the UK's zero-carbon future and support Lincolnshire's transition to Net Zero.
- Provide equivalent energy needs for around 200,000 households with low-cost energy, generated in the UK at a time of great uncertainty within the energy market.
- Increase biodiversity and enhance existing ecology, to achieve Biodiversity Net Gain and maximise opportunities to create new habitats for wildlife.
- Develop a Scheme in a responsible and considerate way, including collaboration with other local developers.
- Provide opportunities for community involvement from an early stage.
- Ensure the retention of existing woodland and hedgerows where possible and the inclusion of new woodland, hedgerows and planting to enhance the landscape.
- Provide opportunities for local communities and the local economy.

# 4.3 Environmental Impact Assessment

- 4.3.1 The Scheme is an 'environmental impact assessment (EIA) development' under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.
- 4.3.2 The application for development consent will therefore require an Environmental Impact Assessment ('EIA') to be carried out to ensure the likely significant effects of the Scheme are properly understood and that where available, appropriate mitigation measures are identified to control or reduce environmental effects.
- 4.3.3 An EIA Scoping Opinion was issued by PINS on 4 November 2022. This identifies the environmental issues and topics relevant to the Scheme, and which should be assessed as part of the EIA. - 4.3.4 A Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) will be produced and publicised and consulted upon as part of the statutory consultation. A Non-Technical Summary (NTS) will also be available, which will summarise the contents of the PEIR in a non-technical manner.
- 4.3.5 The PEIR will build upon the findings from the Scoping Report (submitted in September 2022) and the feedback received through early engagement with stakeholders. It will provide preliminary environmental information on the potential environmental effects of the Scheme and any proposed mitigation to help the local community and consultation bodies to understand the likely significant environmental effects of the Scheme on the environment and inform responses regarding the proposals.
- 4.3.6 We will be inviting feedback and comments on the information presented in the PEIR as part of the statutory consultation. Feedback received will be considered before the DCO application and EIA are finalised for submission.
- 4.3.7 All final environmental findings will be set out in an Environmental Statement (ES), which will form part of the DCO application. The ES will set out the assessment and conclusions of the EIA process. It will build on the content of the PEIR and incorporate the responses from the statutory consultation, stakeholder engagement and the results of surveys undertaken. It will also describe any changes to the project and any mitigation measures that need to be implemented. Consultation and engagement approach

# 4.4 Aims, objectives and values

- 4.4.1 The Applicant is committed to engaging and consulting with communities and stakeholders at an early stage of the Scheme, giving people the opportunity to provide feedback and insight at a formative stage ahead of more detailed design work being carried out.
- 4.4.2 The Applicant is committed to being a good, long-term neighbour and wants to ensure that we can build a solar Scheme that benefits the local area.
- 4.4.3 We are undertaking an iterative consultation process for the Scheme. The comments we receive will help inform the final design of the Scheme. Our consultation consists of two broad phases:

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- Ongoing engagement, held from summer 2022 to early-mid 2023; and
- Statutory consultation period lasting for 6 weeks, to be held in 2023
- 4.4.4 This SoCC relates to the carrying out of the statutory consultation, however a summary of the ongoing engagement and statutory consultation is provided below.

# 4.5 Ongoing engagement

- 4.5.1 The initial stage of engagement began in summer 2022 and is ongoing until the start of the statutory consultation in 2023, and beyond.
- 4.5.2 The primary aim of our initial engagement was to introduce our early-stage proposals for the Scheme, including the early environmental assessments and site selection work carried out to date.
- 4.5.3 During this initial stage of engagement, we engaged collaboratively with stakeholders to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area.
- 4.5.4 This ongoing period of non-statutory consultation provided the opportunity to engage with key stakeholders on a regular basis, including providing a series of Scheme updates prior to the statutory consultation in 2023.
- 4.5.5 A summary of activities carried out during this stage of engagement is provided in Table 4.1, with a more detail on specific consultation activities, including the collaboration workshops, also provided below.

# 4.6 Collaboration workshops – July 2022

- 4.6.1 As part of the early-stage engagement for the Scheme, we held a series of collaboration workshops to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area. This initial engagement has contributed towards the ongoing refinement of our plans for the Scheme and the information presented during our statutory consultation.
- 4.6.2 The workshops provided the opportunity to introduce the early-stage plans and explain more about the proposals and to create a platform for active participation in the design process.

4.6.3 Three collaboration workshops were held as follows:

- Wednesday 20 July 2022, from 1pm to 5pm, at Glentworth Village Hall, Stoney Lane, Glentworth, Lincolnshire, DN21 5DF
- Thursday 21 July 2022, from 2pm to 6pm, at Willingham Village Hall, High St,

 Friday 22 July 2022, from 10am to 2pm, at Sturton by Stow Village Hall, High St, Sturton by Stow, Lincoln, LN1 2AE

4.6.4 We invited key stakeholders to attend the collaboration workshops, who were selected as being representatives of persons with an interest in the Scheme, from a political, community and technical/environmental perspective. These stakeholders included:

- Relevant county, district, and ward councillors across the districts of West Lindsey and Bassetlaw and Counties of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire
- Wider council Members, Portfolio Holders, and technical/planning officers
- Representatives of the local community, including parish councils and local interest/ community groups
- Statutory consultees and wider environmental/ technical stakeholders

4.6.5 The approach to engagement during this phase of the Scheme, including specific groups and stakeholders to be invited to the workshops, was discussed with the relevant local planning authorities before the workshops were held.

4.6.6 A range of information was presented during the workshops in order to provide a more detailed understanding of the Scheme and the work carried out to date. This included:

- An introduction to Tillbridge Solar and the needs case for the Scheme, including the location and key elements of the proposals
- The story so far, including site suitability and environmental constraints and opportunities
- A discussion of specific environmental topics in relation to how the Scheme is defined going forwards
- 4.6.7 Attendees at the workshops were invited to provide feedback and comments throughout the session and discuss the proposals in more detail to help inform this. A full summary of the collaboration workshops can be found in the Tillbridge Solar post-collaboration workshop report (September 2022), which can be found on the Scheme website. This report was uploaded to the website and issued to all stakeholders invited to the workshops.

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# Section 5: Statutory consultation

# 5.1 Introduction

- 5.1.1 The statutory consultation will run for six weeks and will be held in 2023. All responses to the consultation must be received by **11:59pm** on the closing date.
- 5.1.2 Held in accordance with section 42 of the Act, this consultation will provide an opportunity for us update you on our proposals for the Scheme. More details on what we will be consulting on and how we propose to consult are listed below.

# 5.2 What will we consult on?

- 5.2.1 The aim of our pre-application consultation is to ensure that the community, landowners and tenants, stakeholders and technical consultees have the opportunity to understand and influence our proposals. The statutory consultation presents an opportunity to present the more detailed proposals and key refinements made in response to ongoing design work and feedback during the previous stage of engagement.
- 5.2.2 We will be seeking feedback on all aspects of our plans for the Scheme. This includes inviting comments on issues related (but not limited to):
  - The Principal Site, including initial parameters associated with the Scheme and a cable route corridor
  - Clear Scheme description, including issues relating to primary and second access to the Principal Site, Drainage Strategy and construction compounds
  - Proposed traffic access route(s) and movements
  - Preliminary information on environmental impacts as part of the published PEIR. A NTS will accompany the PEIR to summarise the contents of the PEIR in a non-technical manner
  - Other plans, maps and documents to accompany the PEIR
  - Anything else that you reasonably think we need to consider
- 5.2.3 The full PEIR, together with the NTS, will be made available electronically on the Scheme website. We will publicise as part of our statutory notices a service for requesting individual hard copies of technical documents, such as the Preliminary

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Environmental Information Report (PEIR), and the process and charge for supplying these.

# 5.3 Who are we consulting?

- 5.3.1 Our consultation process is open to anyone who may be interested in, or in any way feels impacted by our proposals for the Scheme. We welcome all views and will take them into account before we submit our DCO application.
- 5.3.2 In accordance with section 42 of the Act, the Applicant will be consulting with a range of statutory and non-statutory consultees, such as Natural England, the Environment Agency and relevant local planning authorities.
- 5.3.3 Under section 47 of the Act, the Applicant has a duty to consult people living in the vicinity of the land. We are seeking to consult with people who live in the vicinity of the Scheme, including people in areas where the Scheme may have a direct or indirect impact, either permanently or temporarily, as a result of construction, operation and maintenance or decommissioning of the Scheme.
- 5.3.4 Having considered these impacts, we have identified an appropriate primary consultation zone (PCZ) by initially extending a minimum distance of two kilometres from the boundary of the Principal Site Boundary within which the solar PV panels, energy storage system, on-site substation and supporting infrastructure would be located. The PCZ also extends one kilometre from the edge of the cable route corridor for the grid connection.
- 5.3.5 The PCZ has also been extended in certain areas as considered proportionate. We have considered:
  - Zone of theoretical visibility for the Scheme, which assesses areas in vicinity of the Scheme boundary which could experience a degree of visual impact;
  - Existing natural and human geographic boundaries, such as main roads;
  - Capturing entire communities, rather than excluding small numbers of properties;
  - Coverage of the host district council wards and parishes; and
  - Where we propose to undertake additional works to enable construction transport, equipment areas or road modifications.




Figure 5.1: Primary Consultation Zone for Tillbridge Solar (to be refined for final document)

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- 5.3.6 The zone has been extended further where proportionate and reasonable based on existing boundaries in order to avoid inappropriate 'severance' of communities. The PCZ is shown in Figure 5.1.
- 5.3.7 All homes and businesses within the PCZ will directly receive consultation leaflets in the post at the start of the consultation period. Consultation events will be held within the PCZ, where possible, and relevant groups and organisations such as parish councils and local interest groups will be notified of consultation opportunities.
- 5.3.8 We also recognise that people who live and work beyond the PCZ may also have an interest in our proposals and may wish to participate in the statutory consultation. We are committed to making sure that individuals and organisations are given the opportunity to participate and will attempt to raise awareness of the consultation using a number of methods such as advertising and direct communication with organisations located in the wider consultation zone. More details on these methods are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.

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# 5.4 Consultation with under-represented or seldom heard groups

- 5.4.1 Our consultation has been developed to be accessible to all groups in the community, including 'under-represented' or 'seldom heard' groups and individuals who may be less likely to participate in or respond to traditional consultation techniques.
- 5.4.2 These groups and individuals that may find it harder to get involved in consultation and/or need additional support to access materials include, but are not limited to:
  - The elderly
  - People with visual impairments
  - People within limited mobility.
  - Geographically isolated individuals or communities
  - Young people
- 5.4.3 The specific methods to be used to engage with seldom heard groups are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.

## 5.5 How we will consult

- 5.5.1 During this statutory consultation, we will use a range a methods to ensure an inclusive, meaningful and open consultation. We will use a range of digital and non-digital methods of communication to ensure that our consultation can be accessed by all members of the community.
- 5.5.2 Our statutory consultation is planned to take place for six weeks in 2023 and will exceed the statutory minimum period of 28 days as required by the Act).
- 5.5.3 A proposed schedule for all engagement methods, including activities and materials, is set out in Table 5.1 Table 5.1 below.

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- 5.5.4 All consultation documents can be downloaded free of charge from the Scheme website., with hard copy documents also available at the consultation events.
- 5.5.5 We will publicise as part of our statutory notices a service for requesting individual hard copies of technical documents, such as the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR), and the process and charge for supplying these. A USB containing all Scheme documentation can be requested free of charge from the community relations team.
- 5.5.6 In the event of changing Government guidelines due to COVID-19, or other unforeseen circumstances meaning the consultation events must be cancelled, or the display of materials prevented, the Applicant will inform people as early as possible of the cancellation or expected change via the project website and electronic communication with key stakeholders.
- 5.5.7 In the event of face-to-face consultation events being cancelled, replacement online events will be organised, which will provide the same information as presented at the in-person events.

# 5.6 Promoting the consultation

5.6.1 We will use a variety of methods to make people aware of the Scheme and advertise the statutory consultation. These methods are outlined in Table 5.2 below.

### 5.8 Engagement with seldom heard groups

- 5.8.1 We are committed to ensuring that our consultation is accessible and inclusive for all stakeholders, includes groups and individuals that may find it harder to get involved in consultation and/or need additional support to access materials.
- 5.8.2 Consultation methods used to engage with these groups are set out below. We will continue to liaise with local groups representing seldom heard organisations to ensure accessibility to the consultation and that materials can be made available in the appropriate format.
  - Providing details about how information on the Scheme can be accessed, including online and hard copy.
  - Providing materials in alternative formats, including dementia friendly, Braille and large print (upon request).
  - Assisting with providing feedback where possible, including via the communications lines and at face-to-face consultation events.

### Section 7: Further consultation

7.1.1 If, following the statutory consultation, we consider it is necessary to undertake further targeted or supplementary consultation, this would be undertaken, so far as relevant and proportionate, in accordance with the principles and methods set out in this SoCC.

# Section 8: Other solar DCO consultations in the area

- 8.1.1 We are aware there are a number of other proposed solar developments in the area and understand the need to ensure that communities in the area are aware of the other proposals, notably Low Carbon's plans for Gate Burton Energy Park and Island Green Power's plans for Cottam Solar and West Burton Solar. A map showing the location of the Scheme in relation to other solar developments will be available in the final version of this document, to be published before our statutory consultation.
- 8.1.2 We have been and will continue to work constructively with these other developers to ensure:
  - People are easily able to engage with our consultation processes and have opportunities to get involved, including ensuring that consultation periods are distinct and do not clash.
  - All environmental effects are fully assessed, including any cumulative impacts.
  - A common-sense approach to construction is taken in order to minimise disruption, including sharing infrastructure and construction timelines, where feasible.
  - Shared infrastructure is used where possible, such as a cable route corridor.
- 8.1.3 We have been in conversation with Low Carbon and Island Green Power in regard to their Cottam and West Burton Solar Projects and Gate Burton Energy Park, respectively. These conversations, which have been held on a regular basis since,

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have taken place with the purpose of understanding the progress of each respective project, how they interact with each other and how information and proposals can be shared. This incudes work to support the refinement of the Scheme's cable route corridor, with view to sharing a common route, where possible.

8.1.4 Our statutory consultation materials will indicate to local communities how our proposals for the Scheme relate to proposals from Low Carbon and Island Green Power, with information up to date and correct at the time of finalisation and publication of the Scheme's PEIR (2023).

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### Section 1: Introduction

### 1.1 Purpose of the document

- 1.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited ("we" or "the Applicant") is preparing a Development Consent Order (DCO) application under the Planning Act 2008 for a new solar energy and storage scheme located on land to south, east and south east of Gainsborough and to the north west of Lincoln ("the Application").
- 1.1.2 This document is a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) which sets out how we intend to consult people ahead of our application for development consent for the Tillbridge Solar scheme (hereinafter referred to as the "Scheme").
- 1.1.3 The Scheme is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of the Planning Act 2008 (the Act) and requires consent from the Secretary of State (SoS) for Business, Energy, and Industrial Strategy (BEIS), via a DCO. Accordingly, this SoCC has been prepared pursuant to section 47(1) of the Act which requires applicants to 'prepare a statement setting out how the applicant proposes to consult about the proposed application with people living in the vicinity of the land' and Regulation 12 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the Regulations) which outlines the requirements for such statements in respect of environmental information.
- 1.1.4 This SoCC has been prepared with reference to guidance on pre-application consultation published by the Government and the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) and sets out the approach to consultation with the community in the vicinity of the Scheme.
- 1.1.5 In accordance with section 47 paragraphs (2) to (5) of the Act, in developing this SoCC, we are consulting with and will have regard to comments from the following section 43(1) local planning authorities:
  - West Lindsey District Council;
  - Bassetlaw District Council;
  - Lincolnshire County Council; and
  - Nottinghamshire County Council.
- 1.1.6 In accordance with section 47, paragraph (6) of the Act, the Applicant will be publishing this document in a newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the land and will provide details of where the statement can be inspected.
- 1.1.7 It will also be shared with neighbouring local planning authorities upon publication. The publication schedule, will be provided as part of the final SoCC, with notices to be placed in the Lincolnshire Echo, Retford Times and Gainsborough Standard.
- 1.1.8 The document outlines how people can learn more about the Scheme and engage with the process, prior

to an application for development consent being submitted, provides a brief overview of what we are proposing to develop and what we will be consulting on, and the statutory pre-application consultation process.

- 1.1.9 This document also describes consultation on the Scheme in relation to other solar DCO consultations in the area.
- 1.1.10 Additionally, it sets out how we will have regard to consultation responses in finalising the proposals for the Scheme, which will be submitted as an application for development consent to the SoS.


### Section 2: Nationally Significant infrastructure Projects

- 2.1.1 As the Scheme is an onshore generating station located in England with a proposed generation capacity of more than 50 megawatts (MW), the Scheme will be classified as an NSIP in accordance with sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of the Act. The consenting regime for NSIPs comes under the Act and requires the Applicant to apply for a DCO to develop the Scheme.
- 2.1.2 The Applicant intends to submit an application for a DCO under section 37 of the Act to PINS.
- 2.1.3 The Application would be examined by an examining authority appointed through PINS the independent body responsible for examining NSIPs who would make a recommendation on the application to the SoS. The SoS makes the final decision on a DCO application. This process is explained further in Figure 2.1.
- 2.1.4 Before submitting an application, the Act requires us to carry out consultation with people living in the vicinity of the land, prescribed consultation bodies, such as Natural England and relevant parish council's, relevant statutory undertakers, such as, the Environment Agency and Local Authorities and those with an interest in the land.
- 2.1.5 Early involvement of communities, local authorities and other stakeholders helps to ensure we identify valuable information about the potential effects of the Scheme and provides an opportunity for early feedback from stakeholders to help shape the Scheme's development.
- 2.1.6 Early involvement also ensures that potential mitigation measures can be considered and, where appropriate, built into our designs before an application for development consent is submitted.
- 2.1.7 The Planning Act 2008 process is shown in Figure 2.1 and in more detail on the Planning Inspectorate's website: <u>https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/application-process/the-process/</u>
- 2.1.8 PINS has also published a range of advice notes, which intend to inform applicants, consultees, the public and others about a range of process matters in relation to the Planning Act 2008 process. This includes advice note eight, which provides more detail on this process. 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### Section 3: About Tillbridge Solar

### 3.1 The Developer - Tillbridge Solar Limited

- 3.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited is a joint venture between Tribus Clean Energy Ltd and Canadian Solar, who are both experienced developers of renewable energy projects. We are being supported by a team of technical specialists.
- 3.1.2 Founded in 2018, Tribus Clean Energy Ltd specialises in the development of renewable energy projects and has a UK solar PV development pipeline of over 1.5 gigawatts (GW) and a pipeline of over three gigawatt hours (GWh) of Battery and Energy Storage Systems (BESS).
- 3.1.3 Founded in 2001, Canadian Solar is a leading manufacturer of solar PV modules and provider of solar energy solutions and has a UK solar development pipeline of over 2GW, with over 4GWh of BESS.

### Section 4: The Scheme

### 4.1 The proposed development

4.1.1 The Scheme is located approximately five kilometres (km) to the east of Gainsborough and approximately 13 km to the north of Lincoln.

4.1.2 The Scheme comprises two distinct sections, which are:

- 'the Principal Site', which is the location where ground mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, electrical substations and energy storage facilities will be installed; and
  - 'the Cable Route Corridor', which will comprise the underground electrical infrastructure required to connect the Principal Site to the national transmission system.

4.1.3 The Principal Site covers an area of approximately 1,400 hectares (ha) and is located entirely within the administrative area of West Lindsey District Council. The Principal Site comprises:

- Developable areas where all solar PV panels and associated infrastructure would be located. This area sits on approximately 900 ha of predominantly agricultural land; and
- Non-developable areas areas that are being considered for mitigation and enhancement, such as tree planting and habitat creation. This area amounts to approximately 500 hectares.
- 4.1.4 The electricity generated from the Scheme would then connect to National Grid's Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire. The Applicant has secured a Bilateral Connection Agreement (BCA) with National Grid to allow 500MW of renewable energy to be transferred in to and out of their substation. We are now working to refine our proposals to ensure the Scheme can generate as much energy as possible in line with this agreement.



- 4.1.5 The underground Cable Route Corridor would be approximately 16 km in length, and crosses the administrative areas of West Lindsey District Council and Bassetlaw District Council.
- 4.1.6 The parameters of the Scheme within the Principal Site are at an early stage in the design process and will be refined as the Scheme progresses, taking into account environmental and technical factors, and consultation responses. An indicative parameter plan has been derived providing a snapshot in time showing the potential locations of the key components of the Scheme. This includes the location of the solar PV modules, the battery energy storage system, transformer stations, switchgear, two substations, control room and storage facilities and the access into and through the site for construction and maintenance.
- 4.1.7 The Scheme would consist of the following principal infrastructure:
  - Solar PV panels (also known as solar modules);
  - Solar stations (invertor, transformer and switchgear);
  - Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) providing peak generation and grid balancing services;
  - Solar Direct Current (DC)/Alternating Current (AC) Invertors required to convert the DC electricity collected by the solar PV modules into AC, allowing electricity generated to be exported to the National Grid;
  - On-site cabling;
  - On-site sub-stations;
  - Solar farm control centre;
  - Equipment storage;
  - Lightning rods
  - Fencing, security and lighting;
  - Site access and access tracks;
  - Surface water drainage;
  - Electricity connection to National Grid via cable route corridor;. The Tillbridge circuit will be connected to an existing bay at Cottam sub-station.

### 4.2 Vision and objectives

4.2.1 Our vision for the Scheme is to deliver cleaner, greener, and lower cost energy, while also enhancing the local environment and ensuring we are a responsible developer.

4.2.2 Our objectives are to:

- Build a solar farm that will contribute to the UK's zero-carbon future and support Lincolnshire's transition to Net Zero.
- Provide equivalent energy needs for around 200,000 households with low-cost energy, generated in the UK at a time of great uncertainty within the energy market.

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- Increase biodiversity and enhance existing ecology, to achieve Biodiversity Net Gain and maximise opportunities to create new habitats for wildlife.
- Develop a Scheme in a responsible and considerate way, including collaboration with other local developers.
- Provide opportunities for community involvement from an early stage.
- Ensure the retention of existing woodland and hedgerows where possible and the inclusion of new woodland, hedgerows and planting to enhance the landscape.
- Provide opportunities for local communities (such as community benefits) and the local economy.

### 4.3 Environmental Impact Assessment

- 4.3.1 The Scheme is an 'environmental impact assessment (EIA) development' under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.
- 4.3.2 The application for development consent will therefore require an Environmental Impact Assessment ('EIA') to be carried out to ensure the likely significant effects of the Scheme are properly understood and that where available, appropriate mitigation measures are identified to control or reduce environmental effects.
- 4.3.3 An EIA Scoping Opinion was issued by PINS on 4 November 2022. This identifies the environmental issues and topics relevant to the Scheme, and which should be assessed as part of the EIA. The Scoping Opinion is available to view on the PINS website at: https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/projects/east-midlands/tillbridge-solarproject//ipcsection=docs
- 4.3.4 A Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) will be produced and publicised and consulted upon as part of the statutory pre-application consultation obligations under s42 of The Planning Act 2008. A Non-Technical Summary (NTS) will also be available, which will summarise the contents of the PEIR in a non-technical manner.
- 4.3.5 The PEIR will build upon the findings from the Scoping Report (submitted in September 2022) and the feedback received through early engagement with stakeholders. It will provide preliminary environmental information on the potential environmental effects of the Scheme and any proposed mitigation to help the local community and consultation bodies to understand the likely significant environmental effects of the Scheme on the environment and inform responses regarding the proposals.
- 4.3.6 We will be inviting feedback and comments on the information presented in the PEIR as part of the statutory consultation. Feedback received will be considered before the DCO application and EIA are finalised for submission.

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
4.3.7 All final environmental findings will be set out in an Environmental Statement (ES), which will form part of the DCO application. The ES will set out the assessment and conclusions of the EIA process. It will build on the content of the PEIR and incorporate the responses from the statutory consultation, stakeholder engagement and the results of surveys undertaken. It will also describe any changes to the project and any mitigation measures that need to be implemented. Consultation and engagement approach

### 4.4 Aims, objectives and values

- 4.4.1 The Applicant is committed to engaging and consulting with communities and stakeholders at an early stage of the Scheme, giving people the opportunity to provide feedback and insight at a formative stage ahead of more detailed design work being carried out.
- 4.4.2 The Applicant is committed to being a good, long-term neighbour and wants to ensure that we can build a solar Scheme that benefits the local area.
- 4.4.3 We are undertaking an iterative consultation process for the Scheme. The comments we receive will help inform the final design of the Scheme. Our consultation consists of two broad phases:
  - Ongoing engagement, held from summer 2022 to early-mid 2023; and
  - Statutory consultation period lasting for 6 weeks, from 9 May 2023 to 20 June 2023.
- 4.4.4 This SoCC sets out how we will undertake the statutory consultation, however a summary of the ongoing engagement and non-statutory consultation activities is provided below.
- 4.4.5 The timeline for the scheme is shown in Figure 4.2.

### 4.5 Ongoing engagement

- 4.5.1 The initial stage of engagement began in summer 2022 and is ongoing until the start of the statutory consultation in May 2023, and beyond.
- 4.5.2 The primary aim of our initial engagement was to introduce our early-stage proposals for the Scheme, including the early environmental assessments and site selection work carried out to date.
- 4.5.3 During this initial stage of engagement, we engaged collaboratively with stakeholders to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area.
- 4.5.4 This ongoing period of non-statutory consultation provided the opportunity to engage with key stakeholders on a regular basis, including providing a series of Scheme updates prior to the statutory consultation in May 2023.
- 4.5.5 A summary of activities carried out during this stage of engagement is provided in Table 4.1, with more detail on specific consultation activities, including the collaboration workshops, also provided below.

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### 4.6 Collaboration workshops – July 2022

4.6.1 As part of the early-stage engagement for the Scheme, we held a series of collaboration workshops to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area. This initial engagement has contributed towards the ongoing refinement of our plans for the Scheme and the information presented during our statutory consultation.

4.6.2 The workshops provided the opportunity to introduce the early-stage plans and explain more about the proposals and to create a platform for active participation in the design process.

4.6.3 Three collaboration workshops were held as follows:

- Friday 22 July 2022, from 10am to 2pm, at Sturton by Stow Village Hall, High St, Sturton by Stow, Lincoln, LN1 2AE
- 4.6.4 We invited key stakeholders to attend the collaboration workshops, who were selected as being representatives of persons with an interest in the Scheme, from a political, community and technical/environmental perspective. These stakeholders included:
  - Relevant county, district, and ward councillors across the districts of West Lindsey and Bassetlaw and Counties of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire
  - Wider council Members, Portfolio Holders, and technical/planning officers
  - Representatives of the local community, including parish councils and local interest/ community groups
  - Statutory consultees and wider environmental/ technical stakeholders
- 4.6.5 The approach to engagement during this phase of the Scheme, including specific groups and stakeholders to be invited to the workshops, was discussed with the relevant local planning authorities before the workshops were held.
- 4.6.6 A range of information was presented during the workshops in order to provide a more detailed understanding of the Scheme and the work carried out to date. This included:
  - An introduction to Tillbridge Solar and the needs case for the Scheme, including the location and key elements of the proposals

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- The story so far, including site suitability and environmental constraints and opportunities
- A discussion of specific environmental topics in relation to how the Scheme is defined going forwards
- 4.6.7 Attendees at the workshops were invited to provide feedback and comments throughout the session and discuss the proposals in more detail to help inform this. A full summary of the collaboration workshops can be found in the Tillbridge Solar post-collaboration workshop report (September 2022), which can be found on the Scheme website (<u>tillbridgesolar.com</u>). This report was uploaded to the website and issued to all stakeholders invited to the workshops.

### Section 5: Statutory consultation (9 May 2023 to 20 June 2023)


### 5.1 Introduction

- 5.1.1 The statutory consultation will run for six weeks from 9 May 2023 until 20 June 2023. All responses to the consultation must be received by 11:59pm on 20th June 2023.
- 5.1.2 Held in accordance with section 42 of the Act, this consultation will provide an opportunity for us update you on our proposals for the Scheme and provide a consultation response. More details on what we will be consulting on and how we propose to consult are listed below.

### 5.2 What will we consult on?

- 5.2.1 The aim of our pre-application consultation is to ensure that the community, landowners and tenants, stakeholders and technical consultees have the opportunity to understand and influence our proposals. The statutory consultation presents an opportunity to present the more detailed proposals and key refinements made in response to ongoing design work and feedback during the previous stage of engagement.
- 5.2.2 We will be seeking feedback on all aspects of our plans for the Scheme. This includes inviting comments on issues related (but not limited to):
  - The Principal Site, including initial parameters associated with the Scheme and a cable route corridor.
  - Clear Scheme description, including issues relating to primary and second access to the Principal Site, Drainage Strategy and construction compounds.
  - Proposed traffic access route(s) and movements.
  - Preliminary information on environmental impacts as part of the published PEIR. A NTS will
    accompany the PEIR to summarise the contents of the PEIR in a non-technical manner.
  - Other plans, maps and documents to accompany the PEIR.

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- Anything else that you reasonably think we need to consider.
- 5.2.3 The full PEIR, together with the NTS, will be made available electronically on the Scheme website and for inspection electronically at the local information points. We will publicise as part of our statutory notices a service for requesting individual hard copies of technical documents, such as the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR), and the process and charge for supplying these.

#### 5.3 Who are we consulting?


- 5.3.1 Our consultation process is open to anyone who may be interested in, or in any way feels impacted by our proposals for the Scheme. We welcome all views and will take them into account before we submit our DCO application.
- 5.3.2 In accordance with section 42 of the Act, the Applicant will be consulting with a range of statutory and non-statutory consultees, such as Natural England, the Environment Agency and relevant local planning authorities.
- 5.3.3 Under section 47 of the Act, the Applicant has a duty to consult people living in the vicinity of the land. We are seeking to consult with people who live in the vicinity of the Scheme, including people in areas where the Scheme may have a direct or indirect impact, either permanently or temporarily, as a result of construction, operation and maintenance or decommissioning of the Scheme.
- 5.3.4 Having considered these impacts, we have identified an appropriate primary consultation zone (PCZ) by initially extending a minimum distance of two kilometres from the boundary of the Principal Site Boundary within which the solar PV panels, energy storage system, on-site substation and supporting infrastructure would be located. The PCZ also extends one kilometre from the edge of the cable route corridor for the grid connection.
- 5.3.5 The PCZ has also been extended in certain areas as considered proportionate. We have considered:
  - Zone of theoretical visibility for the Scheme, which assesses areas in vicinity of the Scheme boundary which could experience a degree of visual impact;
  - Existing natural and human geographic boundaries, such as main roads;
  - Capturing entire communities, rather than excluding small numbers of properties;
  - Coverage of the host district council wards and parishes; and
  - Where we propose to undertake additional works to enable construction transport, equipment areas or road modifications.
- 5.3.6 The zone has been extended further where proportionate and reasonable based on existing boundaries in order to avoid inappropriate 'severance' of communities. The PCZ is shown in Figure 5.1.

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- 5.3.7 All homes and businesses within the PCZ will directly receive consultation leaflets in the post at the start of the statutory consultation period. Consultation events will be held within the PCZ, where possible, and relevant groups and organisations such as parish councils and local interest groups will be notified of consultation opportunities.
- 5.3.8 We also recognise that people who live and work beyond the PCZ may also have an interest in our proposals and may wish to participate in the statutory consultation. We are committed to making sure that individuals and organisations are given the opportunity to participate and will attempt to raise awareness of the consultation using a number of methods such as advertising and direct communication with organisations located in the wider consultation zone. More details on these methods are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.





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#### 5.4 Consultation with under-represented or seldom heard groups

- 5.4.1 Our consultation has been developed to be accessible to all groups in the community, including 'underrepresented' or 'seldom heard' groups and individuals who may be less likely to participate in or respond to traditional consultation techniques. These methods are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.
- 5.4.2 These organisations will be contacted, by email and/or post, ahead of consultation to ensure that our approach best meets the needs of their members, including whether any consultation materials are required in a specific format. We will also contact these organisations and invite suggestions for any additional groups that should be contacted as part of the consultation.
- 5.4.3 We are hosting different formats of free-to use communications channels to ensure our consultation is as accessible as possible, including include email, phone and post. We will also be using a combination of in person and digital formats such as in person events and webinars. We will also continue to notify them of consultation opportunities.
- 5.4.4 These groups and individuals that may find it harder to get involved in consultation and/or need additional support to access materials include, but are not limited to:
  - The elderly
  - People with visual impairments
  - People with limited mobility
  - Geographically isolated individuals or communities<sup>1</sup>
  - Young people
- 5.4.5 The list of seldom heard groups and non-statutory groups we will be contacting as part of this consultation is provided in Appendix A Consultee lists.
- 5.4.6 Whilst the completion of an Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) is a duty placed on the public sector under section 149 of the Equality Act, we will produce an EqIA to demonstrate how the public sector equality duty has been considered and taken into account as part of the application to support the Examining Authority and Secretary of State in its decision-making.

#### 5.5 How we will consult

5.5.1 During this statutory consultation, we will use a range a methods to ensure an inclusive, meaningful and open consultation. We will use a range of digital and non-digital methods of communication to ensure

that our consultation can be accessed by all members of the community.

- 5.5.2 Our statutory consultation is planned to take place for six weeks from 9 May 2023 until 20 June 2023 and will exceed the statutory minimum period of 28 days as required by the Planning Act 2008.
- 5.5.3 A proposed schedule for all engagement methods, including activities and materials, is set out in Table 5.1.

- 5.5.6 In the event of changing Government guidelines due to COVID-19, or other unforeseen circumstances meaning the consultation events must be cancelled, or the display of materials prevented, the Applicant will inform people as early as possible of the cancellation or expected change via the project website and electronic communication with key stakeholders.
- 5.5.7 In the event of face-to-face consultation events being cancelled, replacement online events will be organised, which will provide the same information as presented at the in-person events.

#### 5.8 Engagement with seldom heard groups

- 5.8.1 We are committed to ensuring that our consultation is accessible and inclusive for all stakeholders, includes groups and individuals that may find it harder to get involved in consultation and/or need additional support to access materials.
- 5.8.2 Consultation methods used to engage with these groups are set out below. We will continue to liaise with local groups representing seldom heard organisations to ensure accessibility to the consultation and that materials can be made available in the appropriate format.
  - Providing details about how information on the Scheme can be accessed, including online and hard copy.
  - Providing materials in alternative formats, including dementia friendly, Braille and large print (upon request).
  - Assisting with providing feedback where possible, including via the communications lines and at face-to-face consultation events.





Thank you for your email dated 13<sup>th</sup> February 2023, which enclosed a copy of your draft Statement of Community Consultation ("draft SoCC"), in order to comply with your general duty to consult the local authority in accordance with s47(1) of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended).

We have now taken the opportunity to review the draft SoCC, and as a host authority wish to make the following comments, to be taken into consideration under s47(5).

Fig 4.1 – Whilst labelled, It would be helpful if this clearly distinguishes (different colour?) between the "Principal Site Boundary" and "Cable Route Corridor" in order not to give the impression that solar PV could be located within the corridor.

**4.4.3** – it is noted that an iterative process is in place, and that the consultation period will inform the final design of the scheme.

Table 4.1 – whilst noted, this does not set out which properties are deemed as "near neighbours" and have been directly consulted.

**5.1.1 –** It is noted that a six week consultation is proposed to run from 9<sup>th</sup> May 2023 until 20<sup>th</sup> June 2023. We do welcome a six week consultation period.

However, we do have significant concerns with the proposal for it to run in the period 9<sup>th</sup> May until 20<sup>th</sup> June. As you are aware from our discussions, local elections will be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023. At West Lindsey, all 36 seats will be contested.

With Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May declared as a public bank holiday, this means that Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May will be the first day of business for a new Council. The Councillors will only on that day be attending their initial "Welcome to the Council" induction. The Councillors will then enter an

intensive training period, with the first committees not scheduled until the week commencing 29th May.

Holding the statutory consultation between the dates proposed would place the Ward Councillors at a significant disadvantage in being able to actively participate and engage with the process, and be able to adequately represent their constituents.

This is a significant concern that we consider would affect the adequacy of the consultation. We would strongly recommend that the proposed consultation is pushed back by at least 3 weeks, and does not commence until the week commencing 29<sup>th</sup> May, at the earliest.

**5.3.4** – It is recognised that the primary consultation zone (PCZ) would extend at least 2km from the site boundary of the principal site (1km from the route corridor). We note in fig 5.1 that this would cover principal settlements in proximity to the proposed development (and has been extended to include Sturton by Stow). It is noted that all homes and businesses within the PCZ will be directly consulted.

**5.4** – We are encouraged to see that under-represented / seldom heard groups have been identified and that you will contact them in advance of the statutory consultation in order to understand how best to consult. We would advise that this should take place now, and the outcome of those discussions be recorded within the final published SoCC.

**Table 5.1** We are encouraged to note that six in-person consultations will be scheduled to take place, including in the nearby settlements of Glentworth, Hemswell, Corringham, Willingham by Stow and Sturton by Stow. It is noted that *"Events will be held on different days of the week with varied hours to accommodate different availability, including on weekdays and at weekends."* All of the events should include time periods outside of normal working hours (Monday to Friday 9-5) to cater for those working people who are unable to attend during such times.

We consider that at least two scheduled webinars should be held – that are clearly advertised in advance. We would suggest that one should be held early within the consultation period, and another towards the end of the consultation period. We are agreeable to WLDC offices being used as a Local Information Point. Hard copies

of documentation should be supplied in advance of the start of the consultation, in order it is available to the public on day one.

It is noted that the consultation will be advertised in local newspapers. We would encourage that this is expanded to include advertising on local radio and through social media.

It is noted that you intend to undertake stakeholder briefings, and issue emails and letters to *"local political representatives (Councillors and MPs)"*. As stated previously, you will not be in a position to do this at the start of the consultation period on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May, as local elections will have only just taken place. The elected members will only have just been confirmed one working day prior to the commencement of the proposed consultation – their contact details will still be in the process of being set up.

Social media – whilst it is noted you will ask stakeholders to advertise your consultation on their media – it is recommended that you consider advertising directly via social media.

7.1.1 – In the event of material changes to the proposed development, we would expect further consultation to take place, applying "Wheatcroft principles". This should be

discussed with the LPA and will be taken into consideration with our adequacy of consultation response required under s55(4).

8.1.1 – we are encouraged to note that the consultation will take account of the three other known NSIP Solar project proposals in proximity of the site, and that a map will be provided showing all of the proposed schemes in the same context.

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#### Section 1: Introduction

#### 1.1 Purpose of the document

- 1.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited ("we" or "the Applicant") is preparing a Development Consent Order (DCO) application under the Planning Act 2008 for a new solar energy and storage scheme located on land to south, east and south east of Gainsborough and to the north west of Lincoln ("the Application").
- 1.1.2 This document is a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) which sets out how we intend to consult people ahead of our application for development consent for the Tillbridge Solar scheme (hereinafter referred to as the "Scheme").

- 1.1.4 This SoCC has been prepared with reference to guidance on pre-application consultation published by the Government and the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) and sets out the approach to consultation with the community in the vicinity of the Scheme.
- 1.1.5 In accordance with section 47 paragraphs (2) to (5) of the Act, in developing this SoCC, we consulted with and have had regard to comments from the following section 43(1) local planning authorities:
  - West Lindsey District Council;
  - Bassetlaw District Council;
  - Lincolnshire County Council; and
  - Nottinghamshire County Council.
- 1.1.6 In accordance with section 47, paragraph (6) of the Act, the Applicant will be publishing a notice in a newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the land, providing details of where the statement can be inspected.
- 1.1.7 It will also be shared with neighbouring local planning authorities upon publication. The publication schedule, including the statutory notices published in accordance with section 47 and section 48 of the Act, is provided in Table 1.1.

- 1.1.8 The document outlines how people can learn more about the Scheme and engage with the process, prior to an application for development consent being submitted, provides a brief overview of what we are proposing to develop and what we will be consulting on, and the statutory pre-application consultation process.
- 1.1.9 This document also describes consultation on the Scheme in relation to other solar DCO consultations in the area.
- 1.1.10 Additionally, it sets out how we will have regard to consultation responses in finalising the proposals for the Scheme, which will be submitted as an application for development consent to the SoS.

#### Section 2: Nationally Significant infrastructure Projects

- 2.1.1 As the Scheme is an onshore generating station located in England with a proposed generation capacity of more than 50 megawatts (MW), the Scheme will be classified as an NSIP in accordance with sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of the Act. The consenting regime for NSIPs comes under the Act and requires the Applicant to apply for a DCO to develop the Scheme.
- 2.1.2 The Applicant intends to submit an application for a DCO under section 37 of the Act to PINS.




- 2.1.3 The Application would be examined by an examining authority appointed through PINS the independent body responsible for examining NSIPs who would make a recommendation on the application to the SoS. The SoS makes the final decision on a DCO application. This process is explained further in Figure 2.1.
- 2.1.4 Before submitting an application, the Act requires us to carry out consultation with people living in the vicinity of the land, prescribed consultation bodies, such as Natural England and relevant parish councils, relevant statutory undertakers, such as the Environment Agency and Local Authorities, and those with an interest in the land.
- 2.1.5 Early involvement of communities, local authorities and other stakeholders helps to ensure we identify valuable information about the potential effects of the Scheme and provides an opportunity for early feedback from stakeholders to help shape the Scheme's development.
- 2.1.6 Early involvement also ensures that potential mitigation measures can be considered and, where appropriate, built into our designs before an application for development consent is submitted.
- 2.1.7 The Planning Act 2008 process is shown in Figure 2.1 and in more detail on the Planning Inspectorate's website: <u>https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/application-process/the-process/</u>
- 2.1.8 PINS has also published a range of advice notes, which intend to inform applicants, consultees, the public and others about a range of process matters in relation to the Planning Act 2008 process. This includes advice note eight, which provides more detail on this process. 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### Section 3: About Tillbridge Solar

### 3.1 The Developer - Tillbridge Solar Limited

- 3.1.1 Tillbridge Solar Limited is a joint venture between Tribus Clean Energy Ltd and Canadian Solar, who are both experienced developers of renewable energy projects. We are being supported by a team of technical specialists.
- 3.1.2 Founded in 2018, Tribus Clean Energy Ltd specialises in the development of renewable energy projects and has a UK solar PV development pipeline of over 1.5 gigawatts (GW) and a pipeline of over three gigawatt hours (GWh) of Battery and Energy Storage Systems (BESS).
- 3.1.3 Founded in 2001, Canadian Solar is a leading manufacturer of solar PV modules and provider of solar energy solutions and has a UK solar development pipeline of over 2GW, with over 4GWh of BESS.

### Section 4: The Scheme

### 4.1 The proposed development


- 4.1.1 The Scheme is located approximately five kilometres (km) to the east of Gainsborough and approximately 13 km to the north of Lincoln.
- 4.1.2 The Scheme comprises two distinct sections, which are:
  - 'the Principal Site', which is the location where ground mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, electrical substations and energy storage facilities will be installed; and
  - 'the Cable Route Corridor', which will comprise the underground electrical infrastructure required to connect the Principal Site to the national transmission system.
- 4.1.3 The Principal Site covers an area of approximately 1,400 hectares (ha) and is located entirely within the administrative area of West Lindsey District Council. The Principal Site comprises:
  - Developable areas where all solar PV panels and associated infrastructure would be located. This area sits on approximately 900 ha of predominantly agricultural land; and
  - Non-developable areas areas that are being considered for mitigation and enhancement, such
    as tree planting and habitat creation. This area amounts to approximately 500 hectares.

4.1.4 The location of the Scheme is shown in Figure 4.1.

- 4.1.5 The electricity generated from the Scheme would then connect to National Grid's Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire. The Applicant has secured a Bilateral Connection Agreement (BCA) with National Grid to allow 500MW of renewable energy to be transferred in to and out of their substation. We are now working to refine our proposals to ensure the Scheme can generate as much energy as possible in line with this agreement.
- 4.1.6 The underground Cable Route Corridor would be approximately 16 km in length, and crosses the administrative areas of West Lindsey District Council and Bassetlaw District Council.
- 4.1.7 The parameters of the Scheme within the Principal Site are at an early stage in the design process and will be refined as the Scheme progresses, taking into account environmental and technical factors, and consultation responses. An indicative site layout plan has been derived providing a snapshot in time showing the potential locations of the key components of the Scheme. This includes the location of the solar PV modules, the battery energy storage system, transformer stations, switchgear, two substations, control room and storage facilities and the access into and through the site for construction and maintenance.

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4.1.8 The Scheme would consist of the following principal infrastructure:

- Solar PV panels (also known as solar modules);
- Solar stations (invertor, transformer and switchgear), including the necessary equipment to convert the DC electricity collected by the solar PV modules into AC, allowing electricity generated to be exported to the National Grid;
- Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) providing peak generation and grid balancing services;
- Battery Direct Current (DC)/DC convertors;
- On-site cabling required to connect the solar PV modules and BESS to inverters, and the inverters to the transformers on-site;
- On-site substations;
- Solar farm control centre;
- Equipment storage;
- Fencing, security and lighting;
- Site access and access tracks, including four points of access for the Principal Site off the main highway network and internal access tracks within the Principal Site;
- Surface water drainage; and Electricity connection to National Grid via cable route corridor. The Tillbridge circuit will be connected to an existing free bay at Cottam substation
- 4.1.9 An indicative example of the Scheme is shown in Figure 4.2. Table 4.1 provides a summary of the scheme elements referred to in Figure 4.2.

Illustrative example of the Scheme (not to scale)





The sun	Harnessing the sunlight as the earth's primary source of energy
1. Solar panels	Convert the sun's energy into DC electrical power.
2. BESS	Battery and Energy Storage will have a direct relationship with the solar panels and it will support the operation of this by storing electricity produced during times of peak capacity until it needs to be released.

### 4.2 Vision and objectives

4.2.1 Our vision for the Scheme is to deliver cleaner, greener, and lower cost energy, while also enhancing the local environment and ensuring we are a responsible developer.

4.2.2 Our objectives are to:

- The Scheme will seek to efficiently generate a large amount of renewable energy for supply to the National Electricity Transmission System. In doing so make a contribution to the decarbonisation of electricity generation and achieving net zero carbon emissions, in line with the government's commitments.
- Provide equivalent energy needs for around 300,000 households with low-cost energy, generated in the UK at a time of great uncertainty within the energy market.
- The Scheme will seek to enhance existing ecology to achieve Biodiversity Net Gain and maximise opportunities to create new habitats for wildlife.
- Develop a Scheme in a responsible and considerate way.
- Provide opportunities for local communities and the local economy.
- Ensure the local landscape is central to the Scheme's design.

### 4.3 Environmental Impact Assessment

- 4.3.1 The Scheme is an 'environmental impact assessment (EIA) development' under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.
- 4.3.2 The application for development consent will therefore require an EIA to be carried out to ensure the likely significant effects of the Scheme are properly understood and that where available, appropriate mitigation measures are identified to control or reduce environmental effects.
- 4.3.3 An EIA Scoping Opinion was issued by PINS on 4 November 2022. This identifies the environmental issues and topics relevant to the Scheme, and which should be assessed as part of the EIA. 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- 4.3.4 A Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) Report will be produced and publicised and consulted upon as part of the statutory pre-application consultation obligations under s42 of The Planning Act 2008. A Non-Technical Summary (NTS) will also be available, which will summarise the contents of the PEI Report in a non-technical manner.
- 4.3.5 The PEI Report will build upon the findings from the Scoping Report (submitted in September 2022) and the feedback received through early engagement with stakeholders. It will provide preliminary environmental information on the potential environmental effects of the Scheme and any proposed mitigation to help the local community and consultation bodies to understand the likely significant environmental effects of the Scheme on the environment and inform responses regarding the proposals.
- 4.3.6 We will be inviting feedback and comments on the information presented in the PEI Report as part of the statutory consultation. Feedback received will be considered before the DCO application and EIA are finalised for submission.
- 4.3.7 All final environmental findings will be set out in an Environmental Statement (ES), which will form part of the DCO application. The ES will set out the assessment and conclusions of the EIA process. It will build on the content of the PEI Report and incorporate the responses from the statutory consultation, stakeholder engagement and the results of surveys undertaken. It will also describe any changes to the project and any mitigation measures that need to be implemented. Consultation and engagement approach.

### 4.4 Aims, objectives and values

- 4.4.1 The Applicant is committed to engaging and consulting with communities and stakeholders giving people the opportunity to provide feedback and insight at a formative stage ahead of more detailed design work being carried out.
- 4.4.2 The Applicant is committed to being a good, long-term neighbour and wants to ensure that we can build a solar Scheme that benefits the local area.
- 4.4.3 We are undertaking an iterative consultation process for the Scheme. The comments we receive will help inform the final design of the Scheme. Our consultation consists of two broad phases:
  - Ongoing engagement, held from summer 2022 to early-mid 2023; and
  - Statutory consultation period lasting for 6 weeks, from 30 May 2023 to 11 July 2023.
- 4.4.4 This SoCC sets out how we will undertake the statutory consultation; however, a summary of the ongoing engagement and non-statutory consultation activities is provided below. The timeline for the scheme is shown in Figure 4.3.


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Figure 4.3: Indicative consultation timeline\*



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#### 4.5 Ongoing engagement

- 4.5.1 The initial stage of engagement began in summer 2022 and is ongoing until the start of the statutory consultation in May 2023, and beyond.
- 4.5.2 The primary aim of our initial engagement was to introduce our early-stage proposals for the Scheme, including the early environmental assessments and site selection work carried out to date.
- 4.5.3 During this initial stage of engagement, we engaged collaboratively with stakeholders to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area.
- 4.5.4 This ongoing period of non-statutory consultation provided the opportunity to engage with key stakeholders on a regular basis, including providing a series of Scheme updates prior to the statutory consultation in May 2023.
- 4.5.5 A summary of activities carried out during this stage of engagement is provided in Table 4.1, with more detail on specific consultation activities, including the collaboration workshops, also provided below.

#### 4.6 Collaboration workshops - July 2022

- 4.6.1 As part of the early-stage engagement for the Scheme, we held a series of collaboration workshops to help understand key issues and potential constraints in the local area. This initial engagement has contributed towards the ongoing refinement of our plans for the Scheme and the information presented during our statutory consultation.
- 4.6.2 The workshops provided the opportunity to introduce the early-stage plans and explain more about the proposals and to create a platform for active participation in the design process.
- 4.6.3 Three collaboration workshops were held as follows:
  - Wednesday 20 July 2022, from 1pm to 5pm, at Glentworth Village Hall, Stoney Lane, Glentworth, Lincolnshire, DN21 5DF
  - Thursday 21 July 2022, from 2pm to 6pm, at Willingham Village Hall, High St, Willingham by Stow, Gainsborough, DN21 5JZ
  - Friday 22 July 2022, from 10am to 2pm, at Sturton by Stow Village Hall, High St, Sturton by Stow, Lincoln, LN1 2AE
- 4.6.4 We invited key stakeholders to attend the collaboration workshops, who were selected as being representatives of persons with an interest in the Scheme, from a political, community and technical/environmental perspective. These stakeholders included:
  - Relevant county, district, and ward councillors across the districts of West Lindsey and Bassetlaw and Counties of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire
  - Wider council Members, Portfolio Holders, and technical/planning officers
  - Representatives of the local community, including parish councils and local interest/ community groups
  - Statutory consultees and wider environmental/ technical stakeholders

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- 4.6.5 The approach to engagement during this phase of the Scheme, including specific groups and stakeholders to be invited to the workshops, was discussed with the relevant local planning authorities before the workshops were held.
- 4.6.6 A range of information was presented during the workshops in order to provide a more detailed understanding of the Scheme and the work carried out to date. This included:
  - An introduction to Tillbridge Solar and the needs case for the Scheme, including the location and key elements of the proposals
  - The story so far, including site suitability and environmental constraints and opportunities
  - A discussion of specific environmental topics in relation to how the Scheme is defined going forwards
- 4.6.7 Attendees at the workshops were invited to provide feedback and comments throughout the session and discuss the proposals in more detail to help inform this. A full summary of the collaboration workshops can be found in the Tillbridge Solar post-collaboration workshop report (September 2022), which can be found on the Scheme website (<u>tillbridgesolar.com/documents-library</u>). This report was uploaded to the website and issued to all stakeholders invited to the workshops.

### Section 5: Statutory consultation (30 May 2023 to 11 July 2023)

### 5.1 Introduction

- 5.1.1 The statutory consultation will run for six weeks from 30 May 2023 until 11 July 2023. All responses to the consultation must be received by 23:59 on 11 July 2023.
- 5.1.2 Held in accordance with section 42 of the Act, this consultation will provide an opportunity for us update you on our proposals for the Scheme and provide a consultation response. More details on what we will be consulting on and how we propose to consult are listed below.

### 5.2 What will we consult on?

5.2.1 The aim of our pre-application consultation is to ensure that the community, landowners and tenants, stakeholders and technical consultees have the opportunity to understand and influence our proposals. The statutory consultation is an opportunity to present the more detailed proposals and key refinements made in response to ongoing design work and feedback during the previous stage of engagement.

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- 5.2.2 We will be seeking feedback on all aspects of our plans for the Scheme. This includes inviting comments on issues related (but not limited to):
  - The need for the Scheme.
  - The Principal Site, including initial parameters associated with the Scheme and the Cable Route Corridor.
  - Issues associated with the construction, operation and decommissioning of the Scheme.
  - Preliminary information on environmental impacts as part of the published PEI Report. A NTS
    will accompany the PEI Report to summarise the contents of the PEI Report in a non-technical
    manner.
  - Other plans, maps and documents to accompany the PEI Report.
  - Anything else that you reasonably think we need to consider.
- 5.2.3 The full PEI Report, together with the NTS, will be made available electronically on the Scheme website. One copy will also be available for inspection only (and not to take away) at each of the local information points listed below. We will publicise as part of our statutory notices a service for requesting individual hard copies of technical documents, such as the PEI Report, and the process and charge for supplying these.

### 5.3 Who are we consulting?

- 5.3.1 Our consultation process is open to anyone who may be interested in, or in any way feels impacted by our proposals for the Scheme. We welcome all views and will take them into account before we submit our DCO application.
- 5.3.2 In accordance with section 42 of the Act, the Applicant will be consulting with a range of statutory and non-statutory consultees, such as Natural England, the Environment Agency and relevant local planning authorities.
- 5.3.3 We are seeking to consult with people who live in the vicinity of the Scheme, including people in areas where the Scheme may have a direct or indirect impact, either permanently or temporarily, as a result of construction, operation and maintenance or decommissioning of the Scheme.
- 5.3.4 Having considered these impacts, we have identified an appropriate primary consultation zone (PCZ) by initially extending a minimum distance of two kilometres from the boundary of the Principal Site Boundary within which the solar PV panels, energy storage system, on-site substation and supporting infrastructure would be located. The PCZ also extends one kilometre from the edge of the cable route corridor for the grid connection.

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
5.3.5 The PCZ has also been extended in certain areas as considered proportionate. We have considered:

- Zone of theoretical visibility for the Scheme, which assesses areas in vicinity of the Scheme boundary which could experience a degree of visual impact;
- Existing natural and human geographic boundaries, such as main roads;
- Capturing entire communities, rather than excluding small numbers of properties;
- Coverage of the host district council wards and parishes; and
- Where we propose to undertake additional works to enable construction transport, equipment areas or road modifications.
- 5.3.6 The zone has been extended further where proportionate and reasonable based on existing boundaries in order to avoid inappropriate 'severance' of communities. The PCZ is shown in Figure 5.1.
- 5.3.7 All homes and businesses within the PCZ will directly receive consultation leaflets in the post at the start of the statutory consultation period. Consultation events will be held within the PCZ, where possible, and relevant groups and organisations such as parish councils and local interest groups will be notified of consultation opportunities.
- 5.3.8 We also recognise that people who live and work beyond the PCZ may also have an interest in our proposals and may wish to participate in the statutory consultation. We are committed to making sure that individuals and organisations are given the opportunity to participate and will attempt to raise awareness of the consultation using a number of methods such as advertising and direct communication with organisations located in the wider consultation zone. More details on these methods are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.

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5.4 Consultation with under-represented or seldom heard groups

- 5.4.1 Our consultation has been developed to be accessible to all groups in the community, including 'underrepresented' or 'seldom heard' groups and individuals who may be less likely to participate in or respond to traditional consultation techniques. These methods are outlined in Section 5.5: How we will consult.
- 5.4.2 These organisations will be contacted, by email and/or post, ahead of consultation to ensure that our approach best meets the needs of their members, including whether any consultation materials are required in a specific format. We will also contact these organisations and invite suggestions for any additional groups that should be contacted as part of the consultation.

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- 5.4.3 We are hosting different formats of free-to-use communications channels to ensure our consultation is as accessible as possible, including include email, phone and post. We will also be using a combination of in-person and digital formats such as in-person events and webinars. We will also continue to notify them of consultation opportunities.
- 5.4.4 These groups and individuals that may find it harder to get involved in consultation and/or need additional support to access materials include, but are not limited to:
  - The elderly
  - People with visual impairments
  - People with limited mobility
  - Geographically isolated individuals or communities<sup>1</sup>
  - Young people
- 5.4.5 The list of seldom heard groups and non-statutory groups we will be contacting as part of this consultation is provided in <u>Appendix A Consultee lists</u>.
- 5.4.6 Whilst the completion of an Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) is a duty placed on the public sector under section 149 of the Equality Act, we will produce an EqIA to demonstrate how the public sector equality duty has been considered and taken into account as part of the application to support the Examining Authority and Secretary of State in its decision-making.

### 5.5 How we will consult

- 5.5.1 During this statutory consultation, we will use a range of methods to ensure an inclusive, meaningful and open consultation. We will use a range of digital and non-digital methods of communication to ensure that our consultation can be accessed by all members of the community.
- 5.5.2 Our statutory consultation is planned to take place for six weeks from **30 May 2023 until 11 July 2023** and will exceed the statutory minimum period of 28 days as required by the Planning Act 2008.
- 5.5.3 A proposed schedule for all engagement methods, including activities and materials, is set out in Table 5.1.

### Section 8: Other solar DCO consultations in the area

8.1.1 We are aware there are a number of other proposed solar developments in the area and understand the need to ensure that communities in the area are aware of the other proposals, notably Low Carbon's plans for Gate Burton Energy Park and Island Green Power's plans for Cottam Solar and West Burton Solar. A map showing the location of the Scheme in relation to other solar developments is provided in Appendix B – Solar DCO projects.

8.1.2 We have been and will continue to work constructively with these other developers to ensure:

- People are easily able to engage with our consultation processes and have opportunities to get involved, including ensuring that consultation periods are distinct and do not clash, where possible.
- All environmental effects are fully assessed, including any cumulative impacts.
- A common-sense approach to construction is taken in order to minimise disruption, including sharing infrastructure and construction timelines, where feasible.
- Shared infrastructure is used where possible, such as a cable route corridor.
- 8.1.3 We have been in conversation with Low Carbon and Island Green Power in regard to their Cottam and West Burton Solar Projects and Gate Burton Energy Park, respectively. These conversations, which have been held on a regular basis, have taken place with the purpose of understanding the progress of each respective project, how they interact with each other and how information and proposals can be shared. This includes work to support the refinement of the Scheme's cable route corridor, with view to sharing a common route, where possible.
- 8.1.4 At our statutory consultation events, we will indicate how the Scheme relates geographically to the other developments, with information up to date and correct at the time of finalisation and publication of the Scheme's PEI Report (May 2023).



I write on behalf of our client, Tillbridge Solar Limited ('the Applicant') in respect of a proposed solar farm in Lincolnshire. The Scheme comprises the installation of solar photovoltaic (PV) generating panels and on-site energy storage facilities within Lincolnshire and associated infrastructure for connection to the national grid at Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire. The Scheme would allow for the generation, storage, export and import of electricity with an anticipated capacity greater than 50 megawatts (MW).

The Scheme falls within the definition and thresholds for a 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' under Sections 14(1)(a) and 15(2) of 'The Planning Act 2008' (the 'PA 2008') as it represents the construction of an onshore generating station in England that will result in the generating station having a capacity of more than 50MW.).

The Applicant is proposing to make an application for an order to grant development consent for the Scheme. In accordance with Regulation 8(1)(b) of EIA Regulations, this letter confirms in writing to the Secretary of State that the Applicant proposes to provide an Environmental Statement in respect of the Scheme with the DCO application. The Applicant intends to carry out consultation in advance of the DCO application being in accordance with section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended). This notification is therefore submitted in advance of carrying out the section 42 consultation in accordance with Regulation 8(1) of the EIA Regulations.

The Scheme is a Schedule 2 development, listed under Schedule 2, Part 3(a) – 'industrial installations for the production of electricity, steam, and hot water'. Due to the size, nature and location of the proposed development, the Scheme is likely to have a significant effect on the environment and will therefore constitute EIA development, for which an Environmental Statement is required.

In addition, in accordance with Regulation 10(1) of the EIA Regulations, I write to request that the Secretary of State adopts a scoping opinion in relation to the proposed development 'as to the scope, and level of detail, of the information to be provided in the environmental statement.'

In accordance with Regulations 8 (3) (a) and (b) and 10 (3), this request for the Secretary of State to adopt a scoping opinion is accompanied by an EIA Scoping Report which includes:

- a) a plan sufficient to identify the land;
- b) a description of the proposed development, including its location and technical capacity;
- c) a description of the development, including a description of the physical characteristics of the whole development, and where relevant, demolition works; and

d) a description of the aspects of the environment likely to be significantly affected by the development.

In addition to the minimum requirements set out above, the submitted EIA Scoping Report also includes:

- a) a summary of the Scheme;
- b) a summary of the proposed scope of work and the methods to be applied in carrying out the EIA;
- c) provision of a justification and rationale for scoping out certain topics from further assessment (for example where no significant impacts are predicted); and
- d) the proposed structure and coverage of the Environmental Statement to be submitted with the DCO application.

The contents of the Scoping Report is also in accordance with those requirements set out in the Planning Inspectorate's Advice Note 7 (Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) – The Process).
