14 00:01:01.015 --> 00:01:03.795 and would remove around 13,000 acres 15 00:01:03.895 --> 00:01:08.835 of Croppable farmland in the uk. 16 00:01:08.935 --> 00:01:12.835 The average yield from solar generation is around 10% 17 00:01:12.835 --> 00:01:14.075 of its rated capacity. 18 00:01:15.755 --> 00:01:19.255 And according to the Digestive UK energy statistics, 19 00:01:19.435 --> 00:01:23.535 the average output from a 500 megawatt solar farm is 20 00:01:23.535 --> 00:01:26.415 therefore only 50 megawatts 21 00:01:27.615 --> 00:01:31.595 and will generate annually less than half a terawatt hour. 22 00:01:34.125 --> 00:01:36.385 The current UK annual electricity band 23 00:01:37.165 --> 00:01:40.105 is more than 300 terawatt hours. 24 00:01:42.175 --> 00:01:45.715 Simple mathematics show that this would only offer a poultry 25 00:01:46.425 --> 00:01:51.115 0.14% contribution to our national needs 26 00:01:53.195 --> 00:01:56.015 and is arguably delivered at the wrong time of day. 27 00:01:56.315 --> 00:01:59.855

to us to that effect. 568 00:33:22.905 --> 00:33:26.075 Another example with the trenching that James mentioned, 569 00:33:26.075 --> 00:33:29.315 they do the archeological digs on 300 acres. 570 00:33:29.315 --> 00:33:30.995 They dig a trench on every acre, 571 00:33:30.995 --> 00:33:32.555 so they dig the farm off from one end to the other. 572 00:33:33.785 --> 00:33:37.525 And the agreed timetable was not stuck to, for the payment, 573 00:33:37.585 --> 00:33:39.965 for compensation for crop and, and soil damage. 574 00:33:40.785 --> 00:33:41.845 And it took many emails 575 00:33:42.385 --> 00:33:44.365 and phone calls from our agent to get the payment 576 00:33:44.365 --> 00:33:46.265 through four months late. 577 00:33:46.805 --> 00:33:48.945 So that does raise questions in my mind as 578 00:33:48.945 --> 00:33:50.905 to their financial competence. 579 00:33:50.905 --> 00:33:53.785 And does that form part of their planning application? 580 00:33:53.785 --> 00:33:57.935 Because we found them wanting, they're also planning

581 00:33:57.955 --> 00:34:01.935 to remove almost 300 meters of hedge next to a field near 582 00:34:01.935 --> 00:34:03.695 where we live for no apparent reason at all. 583 00:34:04.195 --> 00:34:06.055 And again, our queries have been ignored. 584 00:34:06.225 --> 00:34:09.495 We've been blanked. How many more hedges are they wanting 585 00:34:09.495 --> 00:34:12.335 to rip, rip out for what reason they're keeping 586 00:34:12.405 --> 00:34:14.015 that very close to the chest 587 00:34:14.015 --> 00:34:15.815 because I suspect they don't want people to know 588 00:34:15.875 --> 00:34:17.815 how many hedges they're wanting to destroy. 589 00:34:20.625 --> 00:34:24.445 Uh, our farm is on a very narrow lane to the A 6 3 1 590 00:34:24.505 --> 00:34:28.385 and to Springfield Village now it's very narrow lane 591 00:34:28.525 --> 00:34:29.625 not suitable to heavy traffic. 592 00:34:30.275 --> 00:34:32.185 We've asked them how they're gonna manage the, 593 00:34:32.245 --> 00:34:34.585 the construction traffic, either gonna have a one way system 594 00:34:34.645 --> 00:34:36.665

or have a scheme whereby lorries don't meet 595 00:34:36.885 --> 00:34:37.985 and churn up the verge. 596 00:34:38.605 --> 00:34:40.385 But again, we're being blanked and ignored. 597 00:34:42.195 --> 00:34:46.615 Um, finally, I think yesterday in item seven, was it, 598 00:34:46.615 --> 00:34:48.775 you mentioned, uh, visits to the site. 599 00:34:49.475 --> 00:34:50.615 We could invite you 600 00:34:51.075 --> 00:34:53.375 or people from your department, if that's the right word, 601 00:34:53.875 --> 00:34:56.775 to visit the farm and see on, on the ground. 602 00:34:57.055 --> 00:34:58.055 I think it's always better 603 00:34:58.055 --> 00:34:59.375 to see on the ground than on a map. 604 00:35:00.855 --> 00:35:02.635 Um, if you want details for that, 605 00:35:02.695 --> 00:35:04.435 we can, uh, forward them up. 606 00:35:05.395 --> 00:35:09.535 Um, yes, I think that's it. Thank you. Thank you. Thank 607 00:35:09.535 --> 00:35:10.535 You Mr. Mr. sma.

608 00:35:10.535 --> 00:35:11.295 Uh, uh, 609 00:35:11.395 --> 00:35:13.255 we very greatly appreciate the 610 00:35:13.255 --> 00:35:14.335 information you're passing with us. 611 00:35:14.435 --> 00:35:16.895 Um, we have noted the issue with the driveway. 612 00:35:16.895 --> 00:35:20.095 You, you're not the only resident who's had their driveway 613 00:35:20.295 --> 00:35:22.695 adjusted or right in the most recent change request. 614 00:35:22.805 --> 00:35:25.335 It's been quite common and other people's Yeah. 615 00:35:25.575 --> 00:35:27.655 Verges and gardens. So we have noted that. Thank you. We, 616 00:35:27.715 --> 00:35:30.335 We just find that these faceless people just don't seem 617 00:35:30.455 --> 00:35:31.735 to have any idea of, of 618 00:35:31.805 --> 00:35:33.895 what we're getting on the ground. Yes. 619 00:35:34.615 --> 00:35:36.775 I appreciate that. And as you know, 620 00:35:36.775 --> 00:35:38.125 we've been down your road 621 00:35:38.345 --> 00:35:40.805

and we are acutely aware of the traffic management issues 622 00:35:40.805 --> 00:35:42.725 of meeting tractors with brakes. 623 00:35:42.835 --> 00:35:45.285 Yeah, yeah. Um, so yes, we are aware of that. 624 00:35:45.285 --> 00:35:46.485 Thank you very much. Right. Thank you. 625 00:35:50.675 --> 00:35:54.765 Okay. Can I please, please hear from a mystic catter? 626 00:35:57.295 --> 00:35:58.705 Hopefully I pronounce that 627 00:35:59.875 --> 00:36:04.425 cater minefield. Okay, thank you. 628 00:36:04.965 --> 00:36:06.385 So my name is Derek Ka. 629 00:36:06.725 --> 00:36:08.265 I'm a resident of Harpswell 630 00:36:08.405 --> 00:36:10.465 and I'm speaking as a resident of Harpswell. 631 00:36:10.805 --> 00:36:13.305 Um, but what I'll say will be slightly technical perhaps. 632 00:36:13.405 --> 00:36:15.385 So I should say I'm an archeologist 633 00:36:15.685 --> 00:36:18.065 of maybe 30 plus years standing. 634 00:36:19.145 --> 00:36:23.945 I wrote co-wrote quite a lot of the EIA documentation

635 00:36:23.965 --> 00:36:26.105 for HS two, phase two A and two B, 636 00:36:26.725 --> 00:36:29.225 and I was national grid's archeological advisor 637 00:36:29.325 --> 00:36:30.545 for more than 10 years. 638 00:36:30.965 --> 00:36:34.065 So I, so I'm speaking as a Harpswell resident 639 00:36:34.065 --> 00:36:36.185 and I'm particularly speaking about harpswell. 640 00:36:36.965 --> 00:36:39.585 Um, and I want to talk about the historic landscape. 641 00:36:39.805 --> 00:36:40.905 So we've heard a lot 642 00:36:40.965 --> 00:36:43.025 of people talking about the beautiful views, 643 00:36:43.205 --> 00:36:45.225 and I could sit here and talk about the same, 644 00:36:45.765 --> 00:36:48.425 but I also wanted to point out, when we think of heritage, 645 00:36:49.325 --> 00:36:52.825 um, we typically think of buildings, uh, 646 00:36:52.825 --> 00:36:57.785 like Lincoln Cathedral, our, our sites like Sutton who, 647 00:36:57.965 --> 00:37:00.905 or maybe documents like Magna Carta. 648 00:37:01.245 --> 00:37:04.465

But we tend to forget that the historic landscape, the, 649 00:37:04.495 --> 00:37:09.105 that the landscape is, is, is the, is created 650 00:37:09.325 --> 00:37:11.745 by the actions of communities over 651 00:37:12.815 --> 00:37:14.665 centuries or millennia. 652 00:37:15.205 --> 00:37:17.225 And, and this is written in the landscape, 653 00:37:17.405 --> 00:37:20.025 and you can move around the landscape 654 00:37:20.085 --> 00:37:22.745 or get to a vantage point and look down 655 00:37:22.845 --> 00:37:25.545 and you can understand this and experience this. 656 00:37:26.445 --> 00:37:28.425 So in Harpswell, if I was to go 657 00:37:28.425 --> 00:37:30.825 and stand at the top of the scar slope, 658 00:37:31.005 --> 00:37:33.025 so I've got Middle Street behind me 659 00:37:33.045 --> 00:37:35.545 and I'll look down into Harpswell. 660 00:37:36.245 --> 00:37:37.905 Um, I would see 661 00:37:37.905 --> 00:37:40.905 that the village is at the bottom of the slope.

662 00:37:41.325 --> 00:37:42.785 And if I move north 663 00:37:42.805 --> 00:37:44.545 and south along Middle Street, 664 00:37:44.575 --> 00:37:45.305 I'll see all the village 665 00:37:45.305 --> 00:37:46.585 villages are at the bottom of the slope. 666 00:37:47.085 --> 00:37:49.145 And they're call spring line villages. 667 00:37:49.215 --> 00:37:53.105 What percolates through the limestone cla it hits an 668 00:37:53.185 --> 00:37:55.465 imperial impermeable clay layer. 669 00:37:55.485 --> 00:37:59.185 And it's under issues out streams, uh, springs 670 00:37:59.285 --> 00:38:02.105 and harpswell is the, well, uh, the, the spring 671 00:38:02.105 --> 00:38:04.945 where water wells outta the harp player, um, 672 00:38:05.745 --> 00:38:06.755 prem, medieval name. 673 00:38:07.375 --> 00:38:11.275 And, and so I will see the villages all on the spring line. 674 00:38:11.535 --> 00:38:14.635 And I'm back on Middle Street looking down into the village 675 00:38:15.055 --> 00:38:19.155

and I will see the almost ruler straight parish boundary 676 00:38:19.155 --> 00:38:20.795 between Harpswell and Hemsworth. 677 00:38:21.175 --> 00:38:23.755 And I'll see it marches up and down the landscape 678 00:38:24.255 --> 00:38:25.355 and it clearly, 679 00:38:25.695 --> 00:38:28.835 and they all do all of the parish boundaries along the line, 680 00:38:29.415 --> 00:38:30.875 uh, uh, along Middle Street. 681 00:38:31.175 --> 00:38:34.435 And it's clear that they were all set out so 682 00:38:34.435 --> 00:38:37.365 that individual communities all got a slice 683 00:38:37.385 --> 00:38:41.045 of the landscape, the, the high ground on the, on the chalk, 684 00:38:41.465 --> 00:38:43.685 the, the mid slopes and the lowland. 685 00:38:44.005 --> 00:38:45.205 Everyone got them. And, 686 00:38:45.205 --> 00:38:46.325 and there's a regular plan 687 00:38:46.325 --> 00:38:47.805 marching up and down middle Street. 688 00:38:48.345 --> 00:38:50.645 And we don't know when the villages

689 00:38:50.785 --> 00:38:53.365 and these boundaries were set out, but we, 690 00:38:53.745 --> 00:38:56.645 but it's probably in the ninth century, eighth, eighth 691 00:38:56.665 --> 00:38:57.845 or ninth, ninth century. 692 00:38:58.265 --> 00:39:00.765 That's when villages are forming in, in this area. 693 00:39:01.675 --> 00:39:03.255 And we've got no idea 694 00:39:03.255 --> 00:39:06.695 what authority could have existed in the ninth century to, 695 00:39:06.795 --> 00:39:10.015 to do this, just divide up a large tract 696 00:39:10.015 --> 00:39:11.335 of a landscape like this. 697 00:39:11.515 --> 00:39:13.255 But we know it must have, they must have existed. 698 00:39:13.535 --> 00:39:15.055 'cause we, we can read it in the landscape. 699 00:39:15.475 --> 00:39:17.455 And then, so I'm back on the ridge looking down. 700 00:39:17.775 --> 00:39:19.215 I can, I see the church 701 00:39:19.755 --> 00:39:22.975 and I see it's, I I see it's got a 10 eighties 702 00:39:23.895 --> 00:39:25.735

a tower made in the 10 eighties, shortly 703 00:39:25.735 --> 00:39:27.495 after the Norman Conquest. 704 00:39:27.755 --> 00:39:29.455 And I can, we can be sure 705 00:39:29.455 --> 00:39:31.095 that the village existed in the 706 00:39:31.095 --> 00:39:32.455 10 eighties 'cause it had a church. 707 00:39:32.875 --> 00:39:34.655 But I, but I might amble down to the church 708 00:39:34.675 --> 00:39:38.055 and realize that it's dedicated to St. 709 00:39:38.165 --> 00:39:40.855 Chad. St. Chad was operating in the six sixties, 710 00:39:40.855 --> 00:39:42.255 second half of the seventh century. 711 00:39:42.995 --> 00:39:45.655 And he sat at the bishop brick of mercy in the six sixties 712 00:39:46.245 --> 00:39:47.655 East Anglia at the, sorry, 713 00:39:47.655 --> 00:39:50.735 east Lingura at the time was under the mercian. 714 00:39:51.275 --> 00:39:52.695 And, and we can note 715 00:39:52.695 --> 00:39:55.295 that the spring comes up in the Churchyard.

716 00:39:56.035 --> 00:39:58.135 Um, it's still, it's in the Churchyard. 717 00:39:58.555 --> 00:40:01.215 Um, and it's the spring of the heart player. 718 00:40:01.355 --> 00:40:02.935 So we, we can only speculate 719 00:40:03.445 --> 00:40:06.375 what Chad's missionaries found in the churchyard, what kind 720 00:40:06.375 --> 00:40:07.655 of watery cult was going on 721 00:40:07.655 --> 00:40:09.295 that they felt they needed to Christianize. 722 00:40:09.555 --> 00:40:11.015 Um, you know, this is obviously talked about 723 00:40:11.015 - > 00:40:12.095in the academic literature. 724 00:40:12.355 --> 00:40:13.575 Um, anyway, moving on. 725 00:40:13.875 --> 00:40:18.735 The village was, um, in a now tuske field belonging 726 00:40:18.735 --> 00:40:20.695 to whole farm, but straight over the road. 727 00:40:21.115 --> 00:40:23.415 So back on the ridge, looking down, I can see this, 728 00:40:23.685 --> 00:40:25.175 that the village was there. 729 00:40:25.795 --> 00:40:29.375

Um, it withered after the black death of 1348. 730 00:40:30.035 --> 00:40:33.055 Um, the chip primarily changed the economic circumstances. 731 00:40:33.195 --> 00:40:34.575 It shrank, the village shrank, 732 00:40:34.795 --> 00:40:36.655 and you can see the lumps and bumps in the field. 733 00:40:37.085 --> 00:40:38.935 It's a deserted medieval settlement now. 734 00:40:39.395 --> 00:40:40.615 And, and the, 735 00:40:40.635 --> 00:40:43.935 the tots in the early 17th century finished the ru 736 00:40:43.935 --> 00:40:46.015 of the village off and they built a nice 737 00:40:46.105 --> 00:40:47.255 small country house. 738 00:40:47.675 --> 00:40:50.735 Um, the site of the village they made in a little landscape 739 00:40:50.735 --> 00:40:53.015 park and it's got a nice little serpentine lake. 740 00:40:53.715 --> 00:40:56.495 And the family moved away in the early 19th century 741 00:40:56.595 --> 00:40:57.815 and the house was pulled down. 742 00:40:57.815 --> 00:40:59.535 But you can read all this in the landscape, you know,

743 00:40:59.535 --> 00:41:00.935 you can read it from the top of the slope. 744 00:41:01.355 --> 00:41:02.815 You can see where the house was. 745 00:41:03.075 --> 00:41:04.655 You can see the serpentine lake, 746 00:41:04.995 --> 00:41:06.855 you can see their ornamental gardens, 747 00:41:06.855 --> 00:41:08.255 which are now scheduled monuments. 748 00:41:08.595 --> 00:41:10.095 And behind it, there's a moat. 749 00:41:10.595 --> 00:41:11.815 We dunno, the date of the moat. 750 00:41:11.845 --> 00:41:14.935 Moat building happened primarily between 1150 and 1350. 751 00:41:15.195 --> 00:41:17.015 But this could be an ornamental post, 752 00:41:17.015 --> 00:41:18.415 medieval thing date into the house. 753 00:41:18.415 --> 00:41:19.935 But it's there. And, 754 00:41:20.945 --> 00:41:23.605 and then at about that time, so in the Middle Ages, 755 00:41:23.665 --> 00:41:26.525 the landscape would've been vast open fields without hedges 756 00:41:26.525 --> 00:41:30.085

and small wavy region furrow, um, plots of land. 757 00:41:30.705 --> 00:41:33.525 And, and in the 18th century it was all enclosed, 758 00:41:33.625 --> 00:41:35.125 closed parliamentary enclosure. 759 00:41:35.185 --> 00:41:36.605 And we can see it in the landscape. 760 00:41:37.225 --> 00:41:38.485 All of the farmhouses, 761 00:41:38.485 --> 00:41:41.165 the 18th century farmhouses are there, the fields scape 762 00:41:41.165 --> 00:41:44.005 and the hedges, all 18th century we can see it. 763 00:41:44.065 --> 00:41:46.325 And you can see the former roads 764 00:41:46.395 --> 00:41:48.565 that served the medical village that's now gone. 765 00:41:48.745 --> 00:41:52.685 The whole road scape was changed then enclosed it as a park. 766 00:41:52.685 --> 00:41:54.125 They built a road around the outside. 767 00:41:54.125 --> 00:41:57.045 And all our houses in Harpswell are all along the road on 768 00:41:57.045 --> 00:41:59.205 the outside of the park, laid down the 17th century, 769 00:41:59.465 --> 00:42:01.485 and you can read it all in the landscape.

770 00:42:02.065 --> 00:42:05.735 And, and now they're going 771 00:42:05.755 --> 00:42:09.255 to put a large industrial installation into a 772 00:42:09.935 --> 00:42:13.055 quintessentially rural landscape with a rural history 773 00:42:13.365 --> 00:42:15.255 that can be read going back thousands of years. 774 00:42:15.375 --> 00:42:18.855 I mean, middle Street long predates the Roman Road, the a 15 775 00:42:18.955 --> 00:42:20.695 by, I mean, centuries are millennia. 776 00:42:21.275 --> 00:42:23.175 And there was a, there was a little road at the bottom 777 00:42:23.175 --> 00:42:25.935 of the slope called Low Road, which we were in the process 778 00:42:25.955 --> 00:42:28.295 of getting the footpath ated that linked all 779 00:42:28.295 --> 00:42:29.895 of these villages and probably has been 780 00:42:29.895 --> 00:42:30.975 there since the 10th century. 781 00:42:31.555 --> 00:42:33.255 And you can read all this in the landscape. 782 00:42:33.255 --> 00:42:35.855 And now they're gonna ppl a big industrial 783 00:42:36.455 --> 00:42:39.775

installation into a quintessentially rural landscape. 784 00:42:40.435 --> 00:42:43.175 And what are their proposals for hiding this 785 00:42:43.195 --> 00:42:47.855 or blending it in two, one is they're going 786 00:42:47.875 --> 00:42:50.015 to well mess with, that's a bit emotive. 787 00:42:50.165 --> 00:42:51.855 They, they, they're going to bulk up 788 00:42:51.915 --> 00:42:54.935 and change the planting of the field, 789 00:42:55.035 --> 00:42:57.495 the existing field scape so that when you're moving 790 00:42:57.495 --> 00:42:59.335 through this landscape, it's, it's, it's, 791 00:42:59.485 --> 00:43:00.895 it's not so dominant. 792 00:43:01.595 --> 00:43:03.495 Um, but that, 793 00:43:03.595 --> 00:43:06.055 but that hedge scape tells the story 794 00:43:06.115 --> 00:43:08.655 of the 18th century enclosures. 795 00:43:08.955 --> 00:43:11.375 And now that's just gonna become largely illegible. 796 00:43:11.435 --> 00:43:13.215 You can move through this, through this landscape.

797 00:43:13.315 --> 00:43:16.175 You, you know, you you, it'll be largely illegible. 798 00:43:16.715 --> 00:43:20.775 And the second thing they propose to do is plant hedges 799 00:43:21.545 --> 00:43:25.095 along the edge of Middle Street to block the view. 800 00:43:25.675 --> 00:43:27.535 So the, the, the whole story, 801 00:43:27.535 --> 00:43:30.935 and this is just our parish, I could sort of do lesser jobs 802 00:43:30.955 --> 00:43:32.375 of all the parishes along them. 803 00:43:32.755 --> 00:43:35.255 Um, they've all got this kind of story and, 804  $00:43:35.435 \longrightarrow 00:43:38.135$ and it's all readable from Middle Street 805 00:43:38.555 --> 00:43:41.295 and now the view is going to be blocked. 806 00:43:42.075 --> 00:43:44.295 And where they can't block it, 807 00:43:44.295 --> 00:43:46.375 they're just gonna put some tall hedges, 808 00:43:46.625 --> 00:43:50.695 which is just completely gonna erase one's ability 809 00:43:50.955 --> 00:43:52.255 to experience it. 810 00:43:52.255 --> 00:43:54.095

There'll be security fences. 811 00:43:54.515 --> 00:43:57.135 So whereas now you can move through this landscape 812 00:43:57.135 --> 00:43:59.735 and understand it, you won't be able to, you won't be able 813 00:43:59.735 --> 00:44:01.215 to go to the top of the ridge and look down 814 00:44:01.335 --> 00:44:02.735 and understand it from a distance. 815 00:44:02.865 --> 00:44:03.895 It'll be erased. 816 00:44:04.595 --> 00:44:06.495 And I'm, I've just turned 60, 817 00:44:06.595 --> 00:44:08.135 so I'm not particularly an old man, 818 00:44:08.155 --> 00:44:12.415 but I'll be long dead when if, if it's ever again possible 819 00:44:12.835 --> 00:44:14.855 to experience this historic landscape, 820 00:44:14.935 --> 00:44:16.615 I I'll long dead when that's possible. 821 00:44:17.475 --> 00:44:20.545 And yeah, I think it's, you know, and, 822 00:44:20.565 --> 00:44:23.665 and the, I mean the, the solar panels, if, 823 00:44:23.685 --> 00:44:27.945 if they are glinting, I mean talk about a dynamic impact,

824 00:44:28.165 --> 00:44:30.265 you know, like you're gonna be on the ridge trying to look 825 00:44:30.265 --> 00:44:31.805 through the hedge to see what's going on 826 00:44:32.065 --> 00:44:35.205 and you're just have constant glinting of things you 827 00:44:35.225 --> 00:44:38.765 that's gonna draw the eye and yeah, I think it's a tragedy. 828 00:44:40.685 --> 00:44:42.905 So I think that's basically all I have to say. 829 00:44:42.905 --> 00:44:44.665 Thank you, thank you, 830 00:44:44.795 --> 00:44:45.795 Thank you very much. 831 00:44:46.285 --> 00:44:48.905 Um, very detailed representation. 832 00:44:49.085 --> 00:44:51.825 So if you could potentially provide them in writing it 833 00:44:51.825 --> 00:44:52.905 would greatly assist us. 834 00:44:56.515 --> 00:44:58.585 Thank you very much. 959 00:51:57.495 --> 00:52:01.555 Um, a lot of it is technical, a lot of it is opinionated, 960 00:52:02.675 --> 00:52:07.085 but what I'd like to point out is that there are many, 961 00:52:07.085 --> 00:52:09.885 many references to statistics, 962 00:52:12.035 --> 00:52:16.815 values, figures that have been generated in this document, 963 00:52:18.335 --> 00:52:23.315 but there is no substantiation for any of those values. 964 00:52:25.315 --> 00:52:28.725 They have not specified how many panels 965 00:52:29.825 --> 00:52:31.235 they have not specified 966 00:52:32.465 --> 00:52:35.525 how many transformers they have not specified 967 00:52:36.225 --> 00:52:40.335 who the manufacturer is, where the panels 968 00:52:40.395 --> 00:52:43.535 and the transformers and the equipment is derived from. 969 00:52:45.105 --> 00:52:48.165 And I understand that they cannot do that in detail 970 00:52:48.175 --> 00:52:49.685 until they've done their detailed design. 971 00:52:50.265 --> 00:52:51.855 But what I'm asking for is 972 00:52:52.715 --> 00:52:55.455

can they please send us their assumptions 973 00:52:56.125 --> 00:53:00.335 that they have used in generating all the statistics 974 00:53:00.335 --> 00:53:03.495 that they've put into their thousands of pages of documents. 975 00:53:05.375 --> 00:53:09.315 Now without that substantiation, all I can say is 976 00:53:09.345 --> 00:53:12.795 that their submission is fiction and opinion 977 00:53:14.205 --> 00:53:15.545 and I do not agree with it. 978 00:53:15.805 --> 00:53:18.545 So I would like you as the examiner 979 00:53:19.665 --> 00:53:24.645 to question the basis of the data that they are using 980 00:53:25.265 --> 00:53:28.965 to substantiate why they need to build this solar farm. 981 00:53:30.665 --> 00:53:32.015 Thank you. That's all I need to say. 982 00:53:33.485 --> 00:53:35.485 Excellent. When new points have been made 1027 00:56:06.195 --> 00:56:07.595 that are not already covered in the relevant 1028 00:56:07.875 --> 00:56:10.475 representations, we'll ensure we respond in detail in 1029 00:56:10.475 --> 00:56:12.275 writing at deadline one, or 1030 00:56:12.275 --> 00:56:14.755 to the extent further detail is put in from other parties in 1031 00:56:14.755 --> 00:56:16.395 writing at deadline one, we'll obviously respond 1032 00:56:16.395 --> 00:56:17.595 at the next deadline. 1033 00:56:17.595 --> 00:56:18.195 Following that, 1034 00:56:23.135 --> 00:56:25.935 I will touch briefly on some of the key themes raised. 1035 00:56:26.155 --> 00:56:29.215 Um, I've tried to pick up as many as I could, um, 1036 00:56:29.265 --> 00:56:30.295 while people have been speaking, 1037 00:56:30.355 --> 00:56:32.615 but there are some that I think will be better dealt 1038 00:56:32.615 --> 00:56:34.255 with in writing or at the future hearing. 1039 00:56:34.875 --> 00:56:36.335 Um, but let's see how I go.

1040 00:56:36.835 --> 00:56:39.775 Um, so in terms of the nature of large scale, 1041 00:56:39.775 --> 00:56:43.705 naturally significant, um, energy projects means 1042 00:56:43.705 --> 00:56:46.545 that unfortunately some adverse effects are unavoidable 1043 00:56:46.975 --> 00:56:48.705 despite our best efforts to avoid them. 1044 00:56:49.405 --> 00:56:51.945 The job of the decision maker is to weigh the urgent need 1045 00:56:51.945 --> 00:56:54.425 for renewable generation, along with other benefits. 1046 00:56:54.425 --> 00:56:56.345 The scheme will deliver with its adverse effects. 1047 00:56:57.655 --> 00:56:59.835 In this respect, the scheme would make a substantial 1048 00:57:00.195 --> 00:57:02.395 contribution to the urgent need for renewable energy 1049 00:57:02.695 --> 00:57:04.755 and a positive contribution to energy security 1050 00:57:04.815 --> 00:57:07.715 and on climate due to it displacing the need for other forms 1051 00:57:07.715 --> 00:57:10.435 of conventional energy that would emit greenhouse gases. 1052 00:57:11.535 --> 00:57:12.555 The scheme is predicted 1053 00:57:12.555 --> 00:57:15.195

to have significant beneficial impacts from the cumulative 1054 00:57:15.195 --> 00:57:17.795 effect from construction employment as well 1055 00:57:17.795 --> 00:57:19.675 as from proposed habitat creation 1056 00:57:19.815 --> 00:57:22.635 and enhancement of habitat, which would achieve a minimum 1057 00:57:22.655 --> 00:57:24.475 of 10% biodiversity net gain. 1058 00:57:26.435 --> 00:57:29.105 There are also benefits on the recovery of soil resources 1059 00:57:29.105 --> 00:57:31.585 and in diversifying the activities of existing farms. 1060 00:57:32.845 --> 00:57:34.705 We have to recognize as well that there are, 1061 00:57:34.705 --> 00:57:36.225 are identified adverse effects, 1062 00:57:36.395 --> 00:57:37.625 which is why we have made sure 1063 00:57:37.645 --> 00:57:40.225 to assess these effects thoroughly in our environmental 1064 00:57:40.225 --> 00:57:43.105 statement so that they can be given proper consideration 1065 00:57:43.125 --> 00:57:44.305 as part of the planning balance. 1066 00:57:45.475 --> 00:57:48.015 In terms of significant adverse effects, these may arise

1067 00:57:48.015 --> 00:57:50.415 with the spec to landscape impacts on a small number 1068 00:57:50.415 --> 00:57:52.615 of viewpoints from construction traffic 1069 00:57:53.275 --> 00:57:55.495 and sense of disturbance on a few local lanes 1070 00:57:55.495 --> 00:57:57.575 during construction and the early years of operation, 1071 00:57:59.195 --> 00:58:01.815 the applicant has worked hard to avoid, minimize 1072 00:58:01.815 --> 00:58:04.175 and mitigate these adverse effects wherever possible. 1073 00:58:04.475 --> 00:58:05.855 And that has been a common thread 1074 00:58:05.855 --> 00:58:08.015 through the applicant's work on the scheme from site 1075 00:58:08.295 --> 00:58:11.055 selection through the design of the scheme to consideration 1076 00:58:11.055 --> 00:58:13.415 of additional mitigation and management measures. 1077 00:58:14.505 --> 00:58:17.485 The process by which the site was originally selected 1078 00:58:17.805 --> 00:58:18.885 included identification 1079 00:58:18.885 --> 00:58:21.045 and where possible avoidance from the outset 1080 00:58:21.065 --> 00:58:22.925

of key environmental constraints such 1081 00:58:22.925 --> 00:58:25.245 as protected ecological areas and landscapes 1082 00:58:25.665 --> 00:58:28.525 and mapping of best and most versatile agricultural land. 1083 00:58:30.115 --> 00:58:31.935 The design of the scheme then drilled down further 1084 00:58:31.955 --> 00:58:35.215 to look at zones identified with the potential for solar 1085 00:58:35.275 --> 00:58:36.935 by reference to potential impacts such 1086 00:58:37.055 --> 00:58:39.015 as landscape, heritage and traffic. 1087 00:58:39.595 --> 00:58:42.855 And during this process, the original 2,600 hectare area 1088 00:58:43.575 --> 00:58:46.495 identified for the site was reduced to 1,500 hectares. 1089 00:58:47.315 --> 00:58:50.425 We've also made changes such as introducing offsets 1090 00:58:50.485 --> 00:58:53.225 and buffers for residential properties removed parcels due 1091 00:58:53.225 --> 00:58:55.585 to heritage impacts, made adjustments 1092 00:58:55.585 --> 00:58:57.945 to the order limits in response to landowner discussions 1093 00:58:58.365 --> 00:59:00.305 and included two new permissive paths

1094 00:59:00.305 --> 00:59:02.345 to facilitate connecting access by the public, 1095 00:59:02.875 --> 00:59:04.945 introduced archeological mitigation sites 1096 00:59:05.365 --> 00:59:08.745 and biodiversity zones to provide connectivity for wildlife. 1097 00:59:09.965 --> 00:59:11.825 The applicant has done its utmost to avoid 1098 00:59:11.825 --> 00:59:14.225 and minimize residual adverse effects in applying the 1099 00:59:14.225 --> 00:59:15.425 mitigation hierarchy. 1100 00:59:16.285 --> 00:59:18.265 The decision is therefore for the XA 1101 00:59:18.265 --> 00:59:20.545 and the sector of state to consider whether the urgent need 1102 00:59:20.545 --> 00:59:21.885 and critical national priority 1103 00:59:21.885 --> 00:59:23.485 for the scheme outweighs those effects. 1104 00:59:24.185 --> 00:59:25.485 We say that it does and 1105 00:59:25.485 --> 00:59:28.205 that the scheme whilst having some adverse effects does also 1106 00:59:28.205 --> 00:59:30.765 bring benefits of responding to the urgent need 1107 00:59:30.765 --> 00:59:33.805

1121 01:00:07.735 --> 01:00:09.675 and, um, whether that is a good idea 1122 01:00:09.775 --> 01:00:12.915 and I think a lot of those issues go to the heart of the NPS 1123 01:00:12.915 --> 01:00:14.995 and government policy and, um, to some extent 1124 01:00:14.995 --> 01:00:17.315 beyond the scope of this examination, as I think, 1125 01:00:17.615 --> 01:00:18.875 um, has been noted as well. 1126 01:00:20.165 --> 01:00:22.465 Um, we did also discuss the point about decommissioning 1127 01:00:22.465 --> 01:00:24.825 yesterday, and I know that some people, including Mr. 1128 01:00:25.145 --> 01:00:28.065 Moffitt have mentioned this and I would just re reiterate, 1129 01:00:28.485 --> 01:00:31.585 um, that there are legally binding requirements proposed in 1130 01:00:31.585 --> 01:00:35.385 the draft DCO to secure decommissioning, um, failure 1131 01:00:35.485 --> 01:00:37.385 to comply with, which is a criminal offense, 1132 01:00:37.525 --> 01:00:41.105 and the applicant will be setting aside funds should, um, 1133 01:00:41.175 --> 01:00:42.425 consent be granted to ensure 1134 01:00:42.425 --> 01:00:44.625

So would 1430 01:12:31.925 --> 01:12:34.205 You're saying, yeah, so I was saying other than PV 1431 01:12:34.205 --> 01:12:35.245

panels in terms of the flood, 1432 01:12:35.245 --> 01:12:36.725 Yeah, there are PV panels in the flood. 1433 01:12:36.985 --> 01:12:38.285 Yes. and determined that cumulative effects are x, 1702 01:25:39.795 --> 01:25:42.695 we are not bound by those conclusions 1703 01:25:42.845 --> 01:25:46.935 because our conclusions will be based on the evidence 1704 01:25:47.885 --> 01:25:50.135 submitted by the applicant and interested parties 1705 01:25:50.235 --> 01:25:53.945 and statutory parties, which may well be different. 1706 01:25:54.405 --> 01:25:55.825 You may, you may know differently, 1707 01:25:55.925 --> 01:25:59.375 but we, I'm not, um, 1708 01:26:00.325 --> 01:26:04.125 necessarily clear on exactly what evidence that the, 1709 01:26:04.185 --> 01:26:07.045 the other examining authorities made those conclusions on. 1710 01:26:07.345 --> 01:26:11.645 Our focus is gonna be the evidence submitted to us.
