

I am writing to strongly object to the application by East Yorkshire Solar Farm Limited (Boom). Solar farming is a grossly inefficient use of precious agricultural land. The vast areas that this application proposes to decimate in the development of the solar farm will have a devastating cumulative impact on the surrounding communities, livelihoods, health and well-being, natural environment and an all ready overstretched and traffic laden road network.
