I have tried repeatedly this afternoon to lodge my objections to the East Yorkshire Solar Farm but I keep getting a "request blocked" message when I try to submit the objection. I believe this has happened to other interested parties and that they have emailed this email address with their comments.

My comments are as below:-

I am very concerned about these plans and the negative impact it will have on me, my family, my neighbours and those in the surrounding villages.

I previously set out my objections at length at the outset of this matter. I am concerned about multiple issues and how it is possible to consider such a proposal at a time when food security has to be a serious priority.

I am not against renewable energy per se, but solar farms should be appropriately located on already industrialised land, on roof tops, new build estates or adjacent to motorways etc, not on productive agricultural land (the current grading system being flawed).

My objections, in no order of priority, are to:

The extreme size and location of the development.

The loss of productive arable land

Extensive traffic and transport impact

The serious noise and vibration impact

Negative impacts on landscape character

The significant negative visual impact for residents living adjacent to the site boundary

The development is not temporary and our local fields will unlikely ever be returned to "traditional" farming.

Slavery concerns - Where are the solar panels coming from and at what personal (not to mention environmental) cost? Human rights concerns are a very serious issue and one that other countries appear to be paying very close attention to. This alleged clean energy is far from clean.

Negative visual impact for users of the footpath and bridleway across the proposed solar farm

Loss of local wildlife habitats

There is no benefit to the local community

Human Health Risks

The Reflections from the Panels

The increased risk of flooding & Water Maintenance & Drainage

There are other options for solar and, simply put, this is not it.

In closing and to reiterate, I OBJECT to the proposals for the East Yorkshire Solar Farm.
