1.1 Introduction


Overview

- 1.1.1 This Appendix of the Environmental Statement (ES) has been prepared by RPS on behalf of Photovolt Development Partners GmbH. (PVDP) for the Applicant, SolarFive Ltd. (SolarFive). This Appendix supports Volume 1, Chapter 12: Traffic and transport of the ES.
- 1.1.2 **Section 12.6** of Volume 1, Chapter 12: Traffic and transport of the ES provides an analysis of road safety for the area comprising the highway links in the traffic and transport study area, shown at Volume 3, Appendix 12.1: Description of network links and sensitivity of the ES. The Personal Injury Accidents (PIAs) have been obtained from www.crashmap.co.uk which is a database using official data published by the Department for Transport (DfT) based on records submitted to them by police forces. Data has been obtained over the five-year period 2018 to 2022 inclusive, which is the latest period over which data is available.
- 1.1.3 The Crashmap database has been interrogated to identify clusters of PIAs which are determined as areas with four or more injury accidents in one location (or within 25 m of each other).
- 1.1.4 Two clusters of PIAs have been identified within the traffic and transport study area during the five-year period. The locations of these are shown graphically on **Figure 1.1**, with further details provided in **Section 12.6** of Volume 1, Chapter 12: Traffic and transport of the ES.
