Annex A

Procedure at Issue Specific Hearings

The Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 dictate that the Examining Authority presides at a hearing, that it has powers of control over the conduct of the hearing, and that it is responsible for determining the procedure.

Participants may be legally represented if they wish, but the Examining Authority will conduct the Hearing in such a way that legal representation will not be required. The Examining Authority will lead the questioning of parties making oral representations and probe, test and assess the evidence. There is usually no cross-examination of witnesses by other parties, though the Examining Authority does have the power to allow this under certain circumstances.

The Hearing will finish when the Examining Authority considers that all matters have been covered and all participants have had an opportunity to make their representations. If there are additional matters to be dealt with, it may be necessary to defer some matters to written questions.

A summary of the evidence presented orally at Issue Specific Hearing 1 should be included in post-hearing submissions to be submitted by Deadline 1 in the draft Examination Timetable (25 September 2023).

The Examining Authority would recommend any parties who are new to the process and wish to learn more about the background and procedures in hearings to read the Planning Inspectorate's Advice Note 8.5, *The Examination: hearings and site inspections*.

Annex B

The purpose of this Issue Specific Hearing

This early Hearing on the scope and details of the Proposed Development, including construction activities, and the principles of the Applicant's draft Development Consent Order (dDCO) is being held to address matters and questions identified by the Examining Authority through its site inspections and reading of submissions to date, including the Relevant Representations.

The Examining Authority considers that it would be expedient to examine these matters in a Hearing at the outset of the Examination to facilitate an understanding of the nature and scope of the Proposed Development. The agenda items may be followed by questions from the Examining Authority and representations from other parties.

3.0	THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT
3.1	Summary of the Scope The Applicant will be asked to explain the reasons for the scope of the Proposed Development, the flexibility in design and layout that is sought, and to indicate where representative visualisations of elements of the Proposed Development can be seen. The Applicant will also be asked to summarise the proposed new infrastructure, identify the existing infrastructure to be removed, highlight modifications to existing infrastructure, types of temporary infrastructure, and the Applicant's proposed community engagement approach.
3.2	TCPA 1990 (22/01147/FUL) grid supply point (GSP) substation Reference ES Figure [PDA-002, Figure 4.1, Sheet 23] and Design and Layout Plans Grid Supply Point Substation Layout [APP-019]. The Applicant will be asked to explain the scope of the TCPA consent, its intentions in terms of implementation, and the effect on the Proposed Development scope of works. If the TCPA 1990 consent is to be implemented, the explanation should include how the development meets good design principles and the Horlock Rules, and the implications for the draft Order. The local planning authority will be invited to contribute to the discussion.
3.3	Limit of Deviation The Applicant will be asked to summarise the works, the reasons for the limit of deviation and explain its relevance at the following locations: Near Assington Work Plans - Sheet 17 [APP-010]. Design and Layout Plans Pylon Working Area [APP-029].
	 Stour Valley Cable Sealing End Compound (Stour Valley East) Works shown on Work Plans, Sheet 19 [APP-010] and Design and Layout Plans Stour Valley East Cable Sealing End Compound [APP-025]. Trenchless Crossings - ES Figures, Figure 4.1, Sheet 20 [PDA-002] and Design and Layout Plans Horizontal Directional Drill [APP-033]. 4.0 CONSTRUCTION MATTERS

The Applicant will be asked to give an overview of the temporary measures that are sought for the construction of the works and the construction techniques that would be employed.

Phasing of the Works

- 4.1 The Applicant will be asked to summarise the phasing of the works for the following elements:
 - Underground works: Cable Working Area Cross Section Design & Layout Plans Cable Working Cross Section [APP-027].
 - Bramford Substation: ES Figures, Figure 4.1, Sheet 1 [PDA-002].
 - Stour Valley East Cable Sealing End Compound [APP-025] and ES Figures, Figure 4.1, Sheet 19 [PDA-002].

4.2 Main Site Compound at Leavenheath

The Applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:

- Site selection for the main site compound.
- Phasing of the works for the compound, its layout and operation.

5.0 CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATIONAL ACCESS AND TRAFFIC

The Applicant will be asked to summarise the traffic that would be generated by the Proposed Development, the temporary and permanent measures that are sought for access to the works and to the Proposed Development, and the construction traffic impacts on walkers, cyclists and horse riders (WCH). This may be followed by questions from the Examining Authority and representations from other parties.

Transport Assessment [APP-061] Transport Strategy

- 5.1 The applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:
 - Traffic that would be generated by the project.
 - Draft status of the construction route strategy (Table 4.1 'Feedback Received on the Draft CTMP' of [APP-180]).

Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders Schedule 12 of draft DCO [APP-034]

- 5.2 The applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:
 - Risk based approach to proposing traffic orders that would restrict vehicle speeds, prohibit vehicle access, introduce one-way restrictions, prohibit overtaking and restrict vehicle waiting.
 - The agencies responsible for civil parking enforcement and enforcing moving traffic offences.
 - Any proposals to make the 30mph speed restrictions self-enforcing.
 - Impacts of road closures on emergency services.

Temporary and permanent measures to access the works Access Rights of Way and Public Rights of Navigation Plans [APP-012]

The applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:

- The temporary and permanent measures to access the proposed works.
- The design standards to be applied.

Traffic impacts on walkers, cyclists, and horse riders (WCH)

The applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:

Construction traffic impacts on WCH.

- Public rights of way (PRoW) usage surveys (Table 4.2 of Transport Assessment [APP-061]).
- Significance and effects assessment for WCH journey length and severance (Appendix 12.1 Traffic and Transport Significance of Effects Tables [APP-134]).

6.0 RESIDUAL IMPACTS, MAPPING AND SECURING MITIGATION MEASURES, AND THE MANAGEMENT PLANS AND OTHER CONTROL DOCUMENTS

The Applicant will be asked to summarise the outcome of the environmental impact assessment in terms of significant residual impacts, to describe how the mitigation measures that are found to be required to avoid further adverse effects are secured, including any monitoring of these. The REAC should be explored and compared with the more detailed approach taken by the Applicant in the Yorkshire GREEN proposals, where an 'Embedded Measures Schedule' was submitted. The applicant will be asked to explain the use of ambiguous language in four certified documents. This may be followed by questions from the Examining Authority and representations from other parties.

Adequacy of the submitted Register of Environmental Actions and Commitments (REAC) for detailed mapping and securing of necessary mitigation measures. [APP-179 CEMP Appendix B Register of Environmental Actions and Commitments]

The Applicant will be asked to explain the following elements:

- The outcome of the environmental impact assessment in terms of significant residual impacts,
- Describe how the mitigation measures to avoid further adverse effects are to be secured and monitored.

The applicant will be asked to the explain use of ambiguous language in the following certified documents:

- APP-177 Construction Environmental Management Plan

7.0 THE FORM AND CONTENT OF THE DRAFT DCO

There will be an initial examination of the Applicant's draft Development Consent Order (DCO). The Applicant will be asked to summarise the proposed Articles and Schedules, how the draft DCO is intended to work, what would be consented, the extent of the powers and the Requirements that are proposed. In doing this, the Applicant will be asked to explain any departure from established practice in drafting DCOs, any need for changes to other legislative provisions, the need for protective provisions and their scope. This will be followed by questions from the Examining Authority, including those matters identified in the Agenda above, and representations from other parties on the issues identified on the Agenda.

The discussion about the draft DCO at the Hearing will be held without prejudice to the Examining Authority's final recommendation about whether or not the DCO should be made. The Examining Authority expects there to be ongoing discussions about the draft DCO throughout the Examination.

This Issue Specific Hearing will not examine the detailed content of provisions relating to the Compulsory Acquisition of land or rights or Temporary Possession of land. The draft Examination Timetable proposes at least one Compulsory Acquisition Hearing to examine these topics.
