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## 1 WLIA Baseline

### 1.1 WELSH LANGUAGE PROFILE OF THE TTWA

1.1.1 This section presents an overview of the Welsh language profile of the Travel To Work Area (TTWA). The TTWA is illustrated in Figure 26.1 of the WLIA (Document 5.26.1.1).
1.1.2 Information is then presented on the populations in the particular lower super output areas (LSOAs) affected by the Proposed Development.

## Welsh speakers

1.1.3 A high proportion of the population of the TTWA (aged 3 and over) spoke Welsh in 2011 ( $61.0 \%$ compared to an average of 19\% in Wales). However, the number of Welsh speakers in the TTWA has dropped from 79,805 (64.6\%) in 2001 to 79,470 (61.0\%) in 2011. This decrease of 335 individuals able to speak Welsh amounted to a $0.4 \%$ reduction in the number of Welsh speakers within the TTWA.
1.1.4 Table 26.1 shows the percentage of people able to speak Welsh, by ward, in 2001 and 2011. The percentage of people able to speak Welsh in each single ward across the TTWA varies considerably from $18.6 \%$ in Menai (Bangor) ward to $87.8 \%$ in Llanrug ward.

## Welsh language skills

1.1.5 In 2011, $71.7 \%$ of the population within the TTWA (aged 3 and over) had one or more skills ${ }^{4}$ in Welsh, which is a decline from the $73.8 \%$ seen in 2001. Despite the decline, in terms of numbers, there was an increase of 1,473 in the number of people having one or more skills in Welsh (equivalent to an increase of $1.6 \%$ in number) between 2001 and 2011 (from 91,214 having one or more skills in Welsh in 2001 to 92,687 in 2011).
1.1.6 Table 26.2 shows the percentage of the population with one or more skills in Welsh, by ward in 2001 and 2011.

### 1.2 WELSH LANGUAGE PROFILE OF LSOAS

1.2.1 The particular LSOAs affected by the proposed development include: Llanbadrig, Llannerch-y-medd, Mechell, Llanddyfnan, Llaneilian, Cwm Cadnant, Cefni, Cyngar, Tudur, Braint, Cadnant (Isle of Anglesey), Gwyngyll, Tysilio, Llanfihangel Ysceifiog, Llanidan, Dewi, Glyder, Pentir 1, Bethel and Cwm-y-Glo 1, Bethel and Cwm-y-Glo 2, Llanrug, Y Felinheli, Penisarwaun and Pentir 2.

## Welsh speakers

1.2.2 In 2011, $66.7 \%$ of the population (aged 3 and over) of the particular LSOAs affected by the proposed development were able to speak Welsh, which is higher than the average for the TTWA (61.0\%). Between 2001 and 2011, a reduction in both the number ( 346 people) and percentage ( -1.6 percentage point) of the population able to speak Welsh was experienced (from 26,447 ( $68.3 \%$ ) in 2001 to 26,101 ( $66.7 \%$ ) in 2011).
1.2.3 Table 26.3 shows the percentage of people able to speak Welsh, by LSOA, in 2001 and 2011. The percentage of people able to speak Welsh in each single LSOA across the particular LSOAs affected by the proposed development in 2011 varies considerably from 47.4\% in Cadnant (Isle of Anglesey) LSOA to $87.8 \%$ in Llanrug LSOA.

## Welsh language skills

1.2.4 In 2011, $76.5 \%$ of the population (aged 3 and over) in the particular LSOAs affected by the proposed development had one or more skills in Welsh, which is a small decline from the $77.0 \%$ seen in 2001. Despite the small decline, in terms of numbers, there was an increase of 114 in the number of people having one or more skills in Welsh (equivalent to an increase of $0.4 \%$ in number) between 2001 and 2011 (from 29,882 having one or more skills in Welsh in 2001 to 29,936 in 2011).
1.2.5 Table 26.4 shows the percentage of the population with one or more skills in Welsh, by LSOA in 2001 and 2011. The percentage of people with one or more skills in Welsh in each single LSOA across the particular LSOAs affected by the proposed development in 2011 varies considerably from $59.8 \%$ in Cadnant (Isle of Anglesey) LSOA to $91.9 \%$ in Llanrug LSOA.
