Dear Katherine.

Re site inspection on Tuesday 1st December 2015.

We, as you are aware, extremely concerned about the impact of the development on our property. We are not Nimby's by any step of the imagination but we really need the inspector to view the development from our rear window to appreciate the visual impact it will have on our property.

Our land agent considers our property to be severely disadvantaged.

We would appreciate if you could let the Inspector know of our very real concerns. Whilst not fully conversant with the Holford rules, we do not believe that these rules have been correctly implemented by WPD.

WPD also promised that the existing 11Kva overhead would be buried which eased some of our concerns. Since we were told this we have heard no further about this issue, which is causing us additional concern. I have already pointed out in our earlier correspondence to you yesterday that WPD have also changed the apparatus on our land without our knowledge or consent which has made the situation much worse.

Our land agent, on seeing the revised plans, thinks we may be the worst affected property on the whole scheme.

We trust that Mr Broderick will be able take time to spend 5 minutes out of his busy schedule, to visit our property and consider the visual impact that the overhead connection, in particular "H" pole number 153, which will have 4 metal wire rope supporting stays, will have on our property.
