Triton Knoll Electrical System – RWE ENO20019

Bicker Parish Council wish to object to the proposed initial P.I. enquiry at Skegness on 3/9/15, as there is insufficient information.

The P.I, quite correctly, will examine cumulative effect of Triton Knoll, The Viking Link (National Grid) and the Heckington Turbines electrical system, (Ecotricity) on Bicker Fen and other parts of Lincolnshire. There has been no local consultation whatsoever on either the Viking Link or Ecotricity schemes.

The overall cumulative effect on Bicker Parish will be huge, and lead to unacceptable industrialisation of this agricultural area. There will be a waste of large areas of Grade 1 and 2 agricultural land, major environmental damage and heavy industrial traffic on small rural roads/tracks unsuitable for such use.

Please bear in mind the increased susceptibility of Bicker Fen to flooding following the decommissioning of extraction pumps by the Environment Agency. In addition we already have two sub-stations.(N.G. and Western Power Distribution) thirteen wind turbines , and a large number of towers / poles carrying 400kv, 132kv and 11kv electricity supplies.

No more industrial development should take place in Bicker Fen, especially when suitable connections and spare capacity are available near Grimsby on the coast for both Triton Knoll and Viking Link.

Residents regularly request the support of the Parish Council to object to these proposed developments
