Thank you for your consultation of 30th August 2019 regarding this NSIP. We have previously responded on 16th March 2017 regarding the EIA scoping report. We have also been consulted by your heritage consultant, David Bonner of Network Archaeology regarding the draft methodology for the historic environment within the PEIR report.
