1. The consultation in numbers


Statutory consultation took place between 27 February and 29 April 2019. During this time:

2. Feedback from the consultation

67%

of responses to the consultation supported or were neutral regarding the proposed design parameters and approach to landscape mitigation for the Converter Station.

52%

of responses to the consultation supported or were neutral regarding the proposed approach to the underground cable route.

Top 5 concerns



Increased traffic and disruption to the local highway network during the installation of the underground cable



AQUIND's awareness of existing traffic hotspots (e.g. rush hour, summer holiday season, football matches...)



Noise during the construction phase and operation of the new Converter Station at Lovedean




Visual impact of the new Converter Station at Lovedean
