I am emailing to voice my objection to the routing of the Aquind interconnector through Portsmouth. The route will cause nothing but chaos and damage to the already densely populated, congested and polluted city of Portsmouth.

The fact that all of the city's politicians of one accord are against the AQUIND project speaks volumes. Everyone knows that it will be a disaster for the city,

damaging our very few green spaces, affecting the wildlife. Portsea is an island and when there is any sort of disruption in or out of the city, roads are gridlocked for miles around. If you knew our city well you would understand what effect this project would have.
