Here are my objections:

- 1. The SoS asked for a cooperation agreement between Portsmouth City Council and Aquind. PCC does not want to work with Aquind but has to. This is undemocratic. Our elected council must not be coerced.
- 2. You need to pay attention to the precarious nature of our island city. Look at the floods in Portsmouth during the last few days. If Aquind starts digging in these conditions, which seem likely to become more regular, even more chaos will ensue.
