I am writing to you to register my formal objection to the Aquind Interconnector proposal which has already been refused once by the previous Secretary of State.

This project, if approved, would have an immeasurable and devastating effect on the City of Portsmouth and it's surrounds. Having read through the environmental statements and reports there is still not a strong enough argument that demonstrates that the benefits of this project outweigh the costs. The environmental damage and disrepair this project would cause is disgusting, especially at a time where we have recognised, as a nation, that we are one of the most depleted in biodiversity. We are not in a position to cause more environmental disruption and destruction and yet further delay our biodiversity recovery journey to 2030.
