There are a number of reasons for my objection, which will be listed in no particular order of importance.

- 1\ The disruption to the local traffic routes during the construction would be immeasurable to, and have a very negative effect on, the local community. There are only 3 roads onto Portsmouth, and the disruption to the Eastern Road would cause severe issues to commuters, business traffic, visitors and potentially, emergency services.
- 2\ For many years, migrating Brent Geese have used the Eastern Road and surrounding area as a Winter living area, and the construction of the connector would have severe, long-lasting effects on these wonderful birds, and could drive them away permanently.
