The Application

Notice is hereby given that Morgan Offshore Wind Limited of Chertsey Road, Sunbury on Thames, Middlesex, and Morecambe Offshore Windfarm Limited of 12 Alva St, Edinburgh (collectively the “Applicants”), are proposing to submit an application to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for development consent (the “Application”) for the Project.

Morgan Offshore Wind Limited is a joint venture between bp Alternative Energy Investments Ltd and Energie Baden-Württemberg AG.

Morecambe Offshore Windfarm Limited is joint venture between Cobra Instalaciones y Servicios, S.A. (Cobra) and Flotation Energy Limited.

The Morgan Offshore Wind Project and the Morecambe Offshore Windfarm are two proposed offshore wind farms being developed in the Irish Sea.

The Applicants are collaborating to connect the proposed offshore wind farms to the national grid via the Project. The two offshore wind farms are expected to form a key contribution to the UK’s target of generating 50 gigawatts (GW) of power from offshore wind by 2030. Combined they will generate approximately 2 GW of energy.

In October 2022, the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy issued a direction under Section 35 of the Act that the Project should be treated as a development for which development consent is required.

The Application will seek powers for the Applicants to construct, operate and maintain and decommission the Project. It will also cover:

- The temporary and permanent compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights which are required for the Project and/or are required to facilitate or are incidental to the Project;
- Overriding easements and other rights over or affecting the land for the Project;
- The application and or disapplication of legislation relevant to the Projects including legislation relating to compulsory acquisition; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, permits and consents as are necessary and convenient including deemed marine licences.

About the Project

The Project will comprise both permanent and temporary infrastructure for the transmission of electricity from the Morgan and Morecambe Offshore Wind Farms and connection into the existing National Grid substation at Penwortham, Lancashire including, but not limited to:

- Offshore infrastructure including offshore export cables, offshore substation platform(s), interconnector cables and a Morgan offshore booster station.
- Landfall works (where the offshore cables reach the shore in the vicinity of Blackpool Airport) between Mean Low Water Springs and the transition joint bays including the offshore and onshore cables, intertidal working area and landfall construction compound(s), and temporary and permanent access.
- Onshore infrastructure from the transition joint bays to the electricity transmission network connection. This includes onshore export cables to two new substations, temporary construction compounds, temporary and permanent access, and onward connections to the existing National Grid substation at Penwortham, Lancashire.
- Areas for biodiversity net gain, enhancement and/or mitigation, including permanent access for operation and maintenance of those areas.

Environmental Impact Assessment

The Applicants have notified the Secretary of State in writing under Regulation 8(1)(b) of The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the “EIA Regulations”) that they intend to provide an Environmental Statement (ES) in respect of the Project. The Project is an “EIA development” for the purposes of the EIA Regulations and an ES will form part of the Application.

The Project is consulting on its Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development. Information compiled about the Project so far is contained in a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) and is accompanied by a Non-Technical Summary (NTS) of the PEIR.

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'OUR PRAYERS ANSWERED'

The mother of a woman who was brutally bludgeoned to death by her estranged husband has said she's 'so relieved' that the UK government has blocked her killer's release.

Joanna Simpson, 46, who grew up in the Isle of Man, was brutally killed by her spouse, Robert Brown, while their two young children were in a nearby room.

Brown stashed her body in the boot of his car before ripping out the CCTV and telephone cables at the family home.

He then told the children to get into the car, dropped them off at his pregnant girlfriend's home before dumping Joanna's body in a grave he had spent months digging in Windsor Great Park.

In a trial that took place in 2011, former British Airways pilot Robert Brown was acquitted of murder on the

grounds of diminished responsibility.

The jury accepted the defence's case that Brown had suffered from 'adjustment disorder', a temporary mental illness that he blamed for the attack.

He was found guilty of manslaughter and was given a 26 year sentence.

Following a fierce campaign headed up by family and friends of Joanna Simpson, UK Justice Secretary, Alex Chalk MP, informed them this week that he would block Brown's automatic release which was set to be November this year.

Mr Chalk, who is also responsible for the Isle of Man as a Crown Dependency, said he had referred the case to the parole board under public protection powers.

Under the Police, Crime,

Sentencing and Courts Act brought in in 2022, the Justice Secretary has discretionary powers to detain prisoners.

They can also refer individuals serving a standard determinate sentence to the Parole Board to consider whether the prisoner is safe to be released.

Ms Simpson's mother, Diana Parkes, who lives in the island, told the Courier: 'We are relieved and delighted but until Brown goes before the Parole Board and they do not release him we cannot relax.'

'We are really emotionally exhausted

'We have worked so hard with the campaign and it has paid off.

'We were praying for this decision but when we received it we felt stunned because Alex Chalk, the Justice Secretary, has completely understood how dangerous Brown is.

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Regular contact with Tesco - Gov

The government says it has been in 'regular contact with Tesco' over the supermarket giant's Shoprite buyout.

A spokesperson said says it is also working with local businesses that supply Shoprite to make 'transitional arrangements' whilst post-sale details are finalised.

All nine of the island's Shoprite stores have now been purchased by Tesco - bringing an end to 51 years of trading for the chain which was founded in 1972 by the Nicholson family.

The news was announced on Monday and saw a 'number

of Shoprite staff' being put at risk of losing their jobs as a result of the sale.

All nine stores will continue trading under the Shoprite brand name in the short-term before transitioning gradually to Tesco shops over the next nine months, according to a joint statement from both firms.

However, there are fears on the impact the buyout could have on Manx food producers now the largest independent grocery retailer on the island is set to disappear.

DOCTORS PREPARED TO LEAVE

A third of doctors are ready to leave the Isle of Man if assisted dying legislation is passed.

That's according to the Isle of Man Medical Society who've 'overwhelmingly rejected' the proposals.

A private members bill to bring-in assisted dying laws in the island is currently making its way through Government.

The Assisted Dying Bill 2023 had its first reading in the House of Keys back in June, marking the first steps in the parliamentary process.

A second reading of the bill is due in the coming months.

The Isle of Man Medical Society says it surveyed mem-

bers, asking for their views on the assisted dying law back in August. A total of 64% of the society's members responded to the survey - of which, 34% said they would consider leaving the island to find work if new legislation on assisted dying was passed. Approximately 74% of those who responded to the survey said they were against euthanasia being legalised on the island while 54% feared the legislation, if passed, would have a negative impact on the recruitment of doctors.

Only 2.8% of doctors who

responded to the survey felt that the legalisation of euthanasia would have a positive impact on 'vulnerable' individuals - including people diagnosed with learning difficulties, physical disabilities and mental illness. Under the the Assisted Dying Bill 2023, individuals must be an island resident diagnosed with a terminal illness and with a life expectancy of six months or less to be eligible.

A spokesperson for the Isle of Man Medical Society said: 'On the basis of this survey, the Isle of Man Medical Society remains strongly opposed to the legalisation of assisted dying.'

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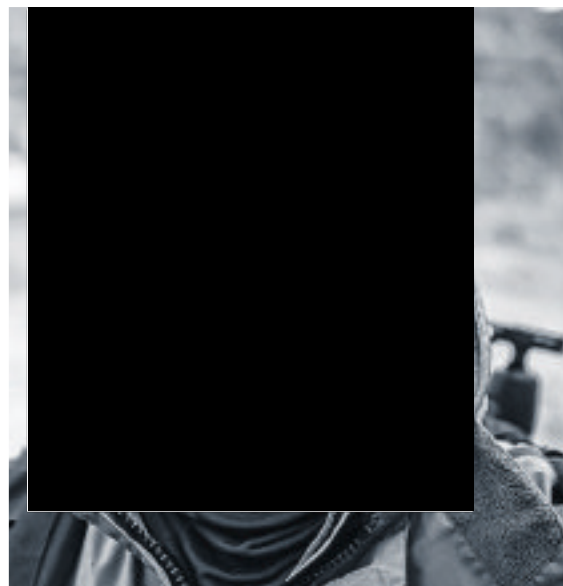
