Subject: RSPB Update on Action Point 11

Re: Issue Specific Hearing 17 November 2015, Action Point 11: RSPB to respond to the proposal by the applicant regarding the gate at East Halton Skitter seawall as mitigation for impacts on SPA and RAMSAR birds.

The RSPB has been in discussion with the Applicant and Natural England regarding the revised mitigation proposals (including, potentially, the installation of gates to control unauthorised vehicular access, and the introduction of other measures in Fields 6 to 8). We understand that the Applicant is now consulting with landowners and local authorities over the options discussed and so the aim, which the RSPB supports, is to agree a position by Deadline 5 on 22nd December.
