Re Plot 112 and Rule 17 letter dated 26th February 2016, Question 8.

We can confirm that, following discussions with National Grid, we are content with the planned work to temporarily extend and widen passing places. We have signed the Heads of Term agreement and instructed our solicitor to deal with the matter.

We have also had discussions with National Grid concerning our other issue of contention

1. We would like to you to ensure that National Grid supply analyses of traffic along Chapelfield Road and consequent noise and congestion issues with details of what compensation would be given.

At the moment we believe that the figures (Table 3.1 of DOC 7.2.1), regarding maximum hourly movements at the Goxhill site have been calculated incorrectly. We have conveyed our concerns to National Grid who are checking with the people who provided the data. We are awaiting a response and, hopefully, some revised figures which will give a more credible picture of the likely traffic passing our house (and elsewhere). Regarding the rest of the points we are also discussing with National Grid possible means of mitigating the effects of noise, protecting our verge and fencing, and how to deal with compensation issues.

So, unfortunately, we cannot yet say that all our concerns have been dealt with but we hope for a speedy resolution.
