Dear Iwan,

Many thanks for the s51 advice issued to National Grid post acceptance. I have attempted to provide a response or summarise progress on each issue below. As some of the plans mentioned comprise large files, these will be sent out to you on CD tomorrow.

S42 Consultation

Nine consultees were identified to National Grid that PINS considered were not listed as being consulted under s42 of the Act during statutory consultation. As per the advice in the s51 letter, National Grid has subsequently written to these nine parties with a copy of the s56 Notice advising of the opportunity to comment on the application now that it has been submitted and accepted.

Engagement with Local Authorities

All A, B, C, and D authorities have been contacted regarding the s56 consultation process and Statements of Common Ground are being progressed with appropriate authorities.

Land Plans

The red line boundary is now clearly identified on sheet 2 and will be provided to you on CD to be issued tomorrow.

Work Plans

Three updated plans, clearly identifying the Order Limits in red have been produced. These are sheets 2, 15 and 20. Sheets 24 and 25 of the Work Plans have also been amended to clearly identify the extent to which work 14D boundary limit extends. These updated plans will be provided on CD, to be issued tomorrow.

Crown Land

Crown Land Plans 1, 2 and 3 as well as a Key Plan have been updated. These now clearly identify all plots of land in accordance with the submitted Book of Reference. Again, this information will be included on CD and issued tomorrow.

Habitat Regulations Assessment

Our team are working on the information provided to support assessments in relation to the Habitat Regulations and will have full regard to the Filey pSPA in any update. Additionally, we held a meeting with Natural England on the 22nd July to review their observations on the NSER as submitted with the application. We have subsequently engaged in email correspondence on the 28th July (which you were copied into), 30th July and 6th August and are working towards an appropriate way forward. We will endeavour to keep PINS updated with progress.

Statements of Common Ground

We have recently held meetings with Natural England, Environment Agency, English Heritage, MMO and all affected planning authorities to progress statements of common ground and hope to have these in place prior to the preliminary meeting.
