Application by National Grid Carbon Limited for an Order Granting Development Consent for the Yorkshire and Humber CCS Cross Country Pipeline

Notice of procedural decision; acceptance of non-material changes to the application

I write to inform you of procedural decisions made regarding non-material amendments to the above application.

National Grid Carbon Limited, as the applicant, sought to make changes to its application and these were received at Deadline 1.

In summary these amendments comprised:

- A reduction in the flexible drainage areas required and a reduction in the amount of land required for construction around the proposed Barmston pumping station resulting in a reduction in the application order limits.
- The removal of the wind turbines at each of the above ground installations (AGI's).
- An amendment to the format the coordinates for the Deemed Marine Licence (DML) are displayed.

I consider that in the context of the whole application, the materiality of the changes applied for are not of such a degree that they constitute a new project. I therefore consider that the proposal, with the applied for changes, can be regarded as being part of the project which is the subject of the existing examination.
