
Addendum to Drainage Report

**The Yorkshire and Humber (CCS Cross Country
Pipeline) Development Consent Order**

Addendum to Drainage Report

1. This addendum is to accompany Document Reference 7.7 (the "Drainage Report") submitted to the Planning Inspectorate on 18th June 2014 in respect of an application for Development Consent Order for the Yorkshire and Humber carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) Cross Country Pipeline, otherwise known as the Onshore Scheme.
2. The Drainage Report explains the effect of the Development on existing drainage in agricultural land, and how, to avoid having an adverse effect on the land, National Grid have commissioned a detailed drainage survey. The results of that survey were appended to the Drainage Report.
3. The Drainage Report has explained how the drainage survey also allowed a reduction of the Order Limits from initially identified in the consultation event of 2013. National Grid were therefore able to reduce the initially proposed Order Limits substantially.
4. Land plan plots 910, 911, 916, 917, 919, 920, 923, 924, 928, 929, 938, 939, 941, 942, 943, 944, 947, 948, 949, 953, 954, 955 were not accessed during the drainage survey as at the time National Grid had been unable to agree access arrangements with the landowner.
5. As access had not been agreed, National Grid were not able to reduce the Order Limits around these plots as originally intended at after s.42 Consultation in Autumn 2013.
6. In August 2014 agreement was reached with the landowner of these plots, the drainage survey proceeded and revised drainage plans were produced. These plans are provided as a revision to document reference 7.1.1.
7. Consequently National Grid have been able to reduce the extent of the land subject to the DCO application in these plots by 52%.
