Thank you for this helpful clarification.

I have suggested that we revise our own internal guidance for Natural England staff to make this clear – we have an opportunity at present as it is currently being re-visited, so this correspondence is timely.

I think it would be helpful for us if your timetable letters do make it more explicit that consultees will not necessarily be contacted for comment on documents such as the RIES and that we need to keep track of the timetable and respond accordingly and in line with the deadlines if we need to.
