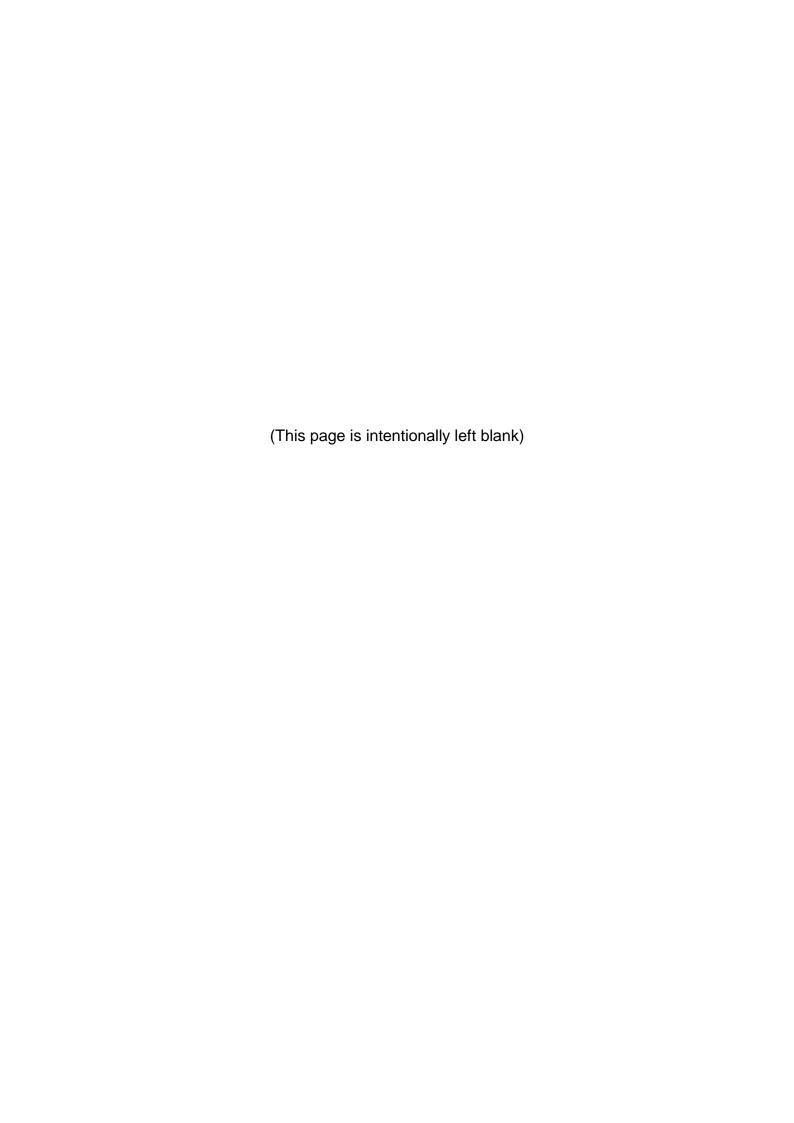

1 Copies of Newspaper Notices

1.1 Southampton to London Pipeline Project

1.1.1 The Southampton to London Pipeline Project will replace 90km (56 miles) of Esso's existing aviation fuel pipeline that runs from Borley Green in Hampshire to Esso's West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow via Esso's Alton Pumping Station. The work is important as it will maintain fuel supplies to major airports in the South East. Pipelines are a safe, secure and low-impact method of transporting fuel.

1.2 Purpose of this Document

- 1.2.1 This document has been prepared to support Esso Petroleum Company, Limited's (Esso) application for development consent. It addresses question 8 b) on the application form. Paragraph 21 of the DCLG publication "Planning Act 2008: Application form guidance" indicates that "Regulation 4 of the Applications Regulations requires an applicant to publish newspaper notices in order to publicise a proposed application. Copies of all the notices must be submitted within the application including the date and issue that the notices were published." We set out how we do this below. For completeness we have also included non-statutory notices in this document and notices that relate to S47 of Planning Act 2008 (the 2008 Act).
- 1.2.2 s47(1) of the 2008 Act requires Esso to prepare a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) which sets out how people living in the vicinity of the land will be consulted on the proposed application. Consultation must be carried out in accordance with the SoCC in compliance with s47(7).
- 1.2.3 Once the SoCC has been prepared, Esso has a duty under s47(6) to publish in a newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the land, a notice stating where and when the statement can be inspected. These notices were part of the combined advert which was published to comply with s47 and s48 in the method prescribed by Regulation 4(2) of the APFP Regulations 2009.
- 1.2.4 The document presents the newspaper notices published in accordance with s47 and s48 of the 2008 Act and Regulation 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the EIA Regs).
- 1.2.5 In fulfilling our statutory duty under s48 of the 2008 Act, Regulation 4(2) of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (as amended) (APFP regulations 2009) requires that notices are published:
 - (a) for at least two successive weeks in one or more local newspapers circulating in the vicinity in which the proposed development would be situated:
 - (b) once in a national newspaper;
 - (c) once in the London Gazette and, if land in Scotland is affected, the Edinburgh Gazette; and



- (d) where the proposed application relates to offshore development—
 - (i) once in Lloyd's List; and
 - (ii) once in an appropriate fishing trade journal
- 1.2.6 As this application is not offshore development, and does not relate to land in Scotland, no notices were placed in Lloyd's List, in a fishing trade journal or in the Edinburgh Gazette.

1.3 Non-Statutory Consultation (Corridors Options Consultation)

1.3.1 A period of non-statutory consultation was held in March and April 2018. Advertisements of the consultation and associated consultation events were published in the following publications on the dates indicated. The notices are reproduced in section 1.7. In order to assist in identifying the edition and date of each newspaper the front cover of each paper is also supplied.

1.4 First Statutory Consultation (Preferred Route Consultation)

The first statutory pre-application consultation was held in September and October 2018. To comply with the requirements of s47 and s48 of the 2008 Act, a combined statutory notice was published in the following publications on the dates indicated, in the method prescribed by Regulation 4(2) of the APFP Regulations 2009. The statutory notice also met the requirements of Regulation 13 of the EIA Regs. In addition, each newspaper also contained an advertisement in a more accessible format that continued the approach from the non-statutory consultation. The notices are reproduced in section 1.7.

1.5 Second Statutory Consultation (Design Refinements Consultation)

- 1.5.1 The project team addressed feedback received during the September/October statutory consultation and refined the route in some places. Additional targeted consultation took place in January and February 2019. This consultation included details of Esso's proposed temporary logistics hubs, which will support the installation of the pipeline.
- 1.5.2 This consultation was in relation to targeted and location specific changes to the route, and it was not appropriate to conduct further s48 publication intended to reach the wider public outside the vicinity of the project. Instead, the consultation was advertised in the following publications circulating in the vicinity of the, refinements that were deemed could have a wider community impact. This approach was aligned with the approach set out within the SoCC. The notices are reproduced in section 1.7.

1.6 Additional Information

- 1.6.1 The Southern Daily Echo erroneously published the Section 48 notice on 2 consecutive days (6 & 7 of September 2018) rather than over 2 consecutive weeks (7 & 14 September 2018). As a result, the notices were also then included in the editions published on 14 and 21 September 2018.
- 1.6.2 Richmond and Twickenham Times It was intended that the Section 48 notice was to be included in the 7 and 14 September edition of the publication, however the notice was not included in the edition on 7 September 2018. As a result, the notice was included in the 14 and 21 September 2018 editions of the publication.
- 1.6.3 No-one was disadvantaged by the newspaper errors as the consultation did not close until 19 October 2018, which was more than 28 days after the date the last newspaper notice appeared.





In fact, one shop selling men's and ladies clothes has no lift to the men's section on the

Essex (435) beat Hampshire (172& 211) by an innings and 52 runs at Chelmsford

Peter Siddle took five for 48 with some typically accurate bowling as Essex's claimed their fourth Specasavers County Champlonship of the season. Hampshire's defeat by an innings and 52 runs was confirmed with 14 and a half overs left on the fourth day. It was Siddle's third five-wicket haul in six Championship appearances for Essex. He plays the last game of his stint against champions-elect Surrey, this weck at Chemsford, before returning to his day job back in Australia. He already has 54 red-ball wickets this wicket to his credit. He was well supported by Simon Harmer, who alternated between his traditional haunt at the Hayes Close End and the River End, and finished with four wickets for 64. He has 43 wickets this summer to follow up his 72 hat year. Hampshire, losing for the fourth time this season, moved deeper into troubled waters in the lower reaches of Division One.

Tom Alsop and Sam Northeast kept Essex in the field longer than they would have liked into the early evening. Northeast steadied the ship during Peter Siddle took five for 48 with so

"Obviously early intervention can hasten recovery and ultimately save a great deal of time and money. Thermal imaging cameras can quickly identify nerve damage, bone injury, undiagnosed lameness, musele damage, tendon stress and soft-tissue damage in horses.

"The techniques can work in theory for any warm-blooded animal. Our course includes training attendees about the cameras and how to set them up and operate them. And then we train how to prepare reports which require equine pattern recognition and knowledge of equine anatomy and physiology."

Hospital partnership could mean longer journeys for patients

THREE Surrey hospitals are in talks with St George's in London about forming a "partnership" for vascular services prompting fears that patients could end up having to

travel to the capital for surgery.
It is feared the move would mean vascular surgery is no longer carried out at Ashford Hospital and St Peter's Hospital, which are run by Ashford and St Peter's Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, and Frimley Park Hospital, which is run by Frimley Health NHS Foundation

Patients can currently have their operations in one of these hospitals. However, a source connected to one of the hospitals said there are con-cerns the plan is to make St George's, in Tooting, the main site for vascular surgery, meaning long

press.

stages and no formal agreement to provide these services together has been made." He added: "A recent directive

requires all vascular units to arrange themselves into networks where vascular teams are centred around a specialist vascular hub. With our steering group for the vascular transformation programme we are aiming to achieve this and continue to provide patients with the best possible service." A statement from Frimley Health said: "We can confirm that we are in

discussions with both Ashford and St Peter's Hospital's NHS Founda-tion Trust and St George's University Hospitals to explore the possi-



bility of working in partnership to provide specialist vascular service for the benefit of our patients. No formal agreement has been made."

A spokesman for St George's added that it was "in discussion" with the Surrey hospitals over the running of vascular services.

Some people did their own shoe mending, especially when stick-on soles became avoilable. She said her family referred to Mr Nottridge and his shop when more well-off people took their shoes to him as "going down there to the snotch".



The Southampton to London Pipeline Project

Esso is replacing 90km of its 105km underground aviation fuel pipeline that runs from Fawley Refinery near Southampton to its West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow.

The 1,300+ people who took part in the consultations to date, our ongoing meetings, and conversations with local organisations and landowners have helped us to refine the pipeline route.

This feedback, alongside technical information, has helped us to confirm our proposals for the project along the majority of the pipeline route. It also helped the project team to select the majority of the 20 sub-options.

In some areas, the feedback and additional knowledge has helped us to identify where we could further amend our design.

As a result, we have refined the route in some places. Some of these refinements are simple, such as moving the pipeline route from one side of a landowner's field to the other. Others are more complex, as they have different impacts on landowners, communities or the environment.

Now that we have a clearer idea of where the pipeline route might go, we are also now sharing the details of our proposed temporary logistics hubs, which will support

Logistics Hubs

Logistics hubs are areas used to store materials and equipment, and to provide staff facilities at a number of key locations. We anticipate that installation of the replacement pipeline will take two years to complete, so we will require these logistics hubs throughout that time. We will also need time to prepare the land before installation and reinstate it afterwards to its former state, where practical.

A31, Ropley Dean

The logistics hub would be located on existing farmland to the east of Bishop's Sutton, approximately ten minutes by road from Alton. The main use for this land would be to store lengths of steel pipe. This locat on has good transport links and is close to the pipeline route. Access for vehicles to the site would be from the east along the A31, which would reduce construction traffic passing through Bishop's Sutton and Alresford. This location is remote from most residential properties. Distant, temporary views of the site may be

A31/A32 Junction, Northfield Lane, Alton

This location has good access to the road network and is near to the pipeline route. The Southampton to London Pipeline Project

Esso is replacing 90km of its 105km underground aviation fuel pipeline that runs from Fawley Refinery near Southampton to its West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow.

The 1,300+ people who took part in the consultations to date, our ongoing meetings, and conversations with local organisations and landowners have helped us to refine the pipeline route.

This feedback, alongside technical information, has helped us to confirm our proposals for the project along the majority of the pipeline route. It also helped the project team to select the majority of the 20 sub-options.

In some areas, the feedback and additional knowledge has helped us to identify where we could further amend our design.

As a result, we have refined the route in some places. Some of these refinements are simple, such as moving the pipeline route from one side of a landowner's field to the other. Others are more complex, as they have different impacts on landowners, communities or the environment. We are seeking your views on these more complex design refinements, as well as the views of landowners, communities, statutory bodies, environmental organisations and local authorities, to make sure that we have selected the most appropriate route for the replacement pipeline.

Design Refinements Ashford Road

Following the preferred route consultation, we have deselected both sub-options at Queen Mary Reservoir. Feedback from the preferred route consultation led us to consider how to reduce the impact on narrow residential roads in Lelaham, as there were concerns from residents regarding sub-option H1b. Sub-option H1b was favoured by local residents, but there were concerns about the reservoir from an engineering and logistics perspective. Seweral consultation responses suggested an alternative route along Ashford Road, in place of the two proposed sub-options. The route along Ashford Road is the proposed

Our preference would be to install the pipeline within the grass verge on the eastern side of the road. However, the limits of deviation would cover the entire road as there are established trees nearby and other underground features that may need to be avoided. We would also include an amended route to the south of Ashford Road, travelling through an industrial area and avoiding impacts on local businesses.

The route would use open-cut trench techniques along Ashford Road, and the installation area would be reduced to ensure that the road is kept open. This may impact communities near to the order limits and road users, who may face short-term disruption during installation. At the northern and of Ashford Road, we would use a trenchlass technique to cross Ashford Road, Kingston Road a water changel.

Woodthorpe Road

Following feedback from the preferred route consultation and engagement with local stakeholders about potential disruption around Woodthorpe Road, we have moved the order limits further west of the road but recognise that this would mean having a larger working area within local recreation areas.

Ashford Station Approach

Following the selection of sub-option H2c and the responses received at the most recent consultation, we have identified a more appropriate route along Station Approach that would maintain traffic flow around Ashford Station. The previous proposals meant that we would need to close Station Road. disrupting traffic flow out of the station and losing parking spaces along the road. This may have had a disproportionate impact on the footfall of businesses located on the road. In addition, in order to maintain traffic flow in and out of the station we would have had to suspend parking along Station Approach in order to have two-way traffic flow to exit the station. By installing alor Station Approach, Station Road would be kept open as normal and Station Approach would also be kept open by changing the pavement layout and temporarily suspending the parking bays. This refinement would mean that the current traffic movements would not change, temporary loss of parking spaces would be reduced and the duration of installation in Woodthorpe Road would also be reduced.

Logistics Hub

Now that we have a clearer idea of where the pipeline route might go, we are also now sharing the details of our proposed temporary logistics hubs, which will support the installation of the

Brett Aggregates, Littleton Lane, Shepperton

We are considering a logistics hub in your area. The logistics hub would be within the Brett Aggregates site, close to the pipeline route. Logistics hubs are areas used to store meterials and equipment, and to provide staff facilities at a number of key locations. We anticipate that installation of the replacement pipeline will take two years to complete, so we will require these logistics hubs throughout that time. We will also need time to prepare the land before installation and reinstate it afterwards to its former state, where practical.
