Dear Sir,

I have registered my interest, along with other residents and local councils, in connection with the above Pipeline Project that I understand is now under Examination by the Planning Inspectorate.

This has been done on the grounds, inter alia, that Esso failed to consult interested parties and local councils before they revised the planned route across immediately adjacent parkland and submitted the Application to the Inspectorate.

In subsequent discussions, involving local and county authorities plus our MP, Mr Michael Gove, we have been attempting to clarify why the final route chosen by Esso that affects residents of Lightwater has been chosen. To date our efforts have not met with any success.

In pursuing this matter, we have been alerted to some of the processes that the Inspectorate will be following but we remain unclear about the practicalities of how Requesting Changes under Advice Note Sixteen operate and seek your clarification to the points raised below.

The Esso Application discusses several pipeline routes across Turfhill Park and opts for a modification of one designated F1a. We are requesting a return to a previous route designated F1c. and thus are asking for a change within the current objectives of the application, and not a new project. We conclude that this constitutes a material change, but within the existing project application. We seek your advice on whether we need to declare this request before or during the Preliminary Meeting?

We also seek clarification as to whether the local resident bodies, Heronscourt Residents Association and Colville Gardens Residents Association need to produce an Impact Statement for consideration by the Inspectorate and whether Lightwater Parish Council, Surrey Heath Borough Council, Surrey County Council are required to reflect the major concerns of local residents for a material change in the Impact Statements that I understand they will be preparing for Inspectorate use?

During the Examination what information do we, as the affected and interested parties, need to:

- provide and in what format?
- the timing when this has to be provided?
- what written and personal representation would be required?

We do request that you retain this e-mail as part of the ExA documentation for this Application.

My apologies that it has been necessary to seek this additional clarification but your assistance ahead of the next stage of the Examination would be appreciated by all those affected and involved.
