## Purpose of ISH

The main purpose of the ISH3 is to seek oral submissions in respect of specific outstanding matters relating to:

- 1. Noise and vibration;
- 2. Landscape;
- 3. Major Hazards;
- 4. Cultural Heritage;
- 5. Traffic and Transport; and
- 6. Habitats Regulation Assessment.

These matters may also be covered in some detail in the Examining Authority's Second Written Questions that will be published on 12 August 2024. At ISH3, we are looking for position statements to be made on key issues and what could, or should, be done to resolve them.

The ExA has sought to provide sufficient detail to assist the parties to prepare for the Hearing. The details set out above are indicative and the ExA may find it necessary to include additional agenda items or to amend the order in which the items are dealt with.

Anyone wishing to attend the Hearing in person, who has not already advised the Case Team of this, should do so as soon as possible.

If you are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, please do not attend the Hearing in person. Contact the Case Team who will ensure you have access to the Hearing virtually.

The event will be livestreamed and a link for watching the livestream will be posted on the <u>project webpage of the National Infrastructure Planning website</u> closer to the Hearing date. IPs and members of the public who wish to observe the Hearing can

therefore view and listen to the Hearing using the livestream, or view and listen to the recording, after it has concluded.

## **Registration Process**

## Procedure at ISH

Guidance under the Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 provides that it is for the ExA to probe, test and assess the evidence through direct questions of persons making oral representations at Hearings. Questioning at the Hearing will be led by the ExA. Cross questioning of a person giving evidence by another person will only be permitted if the ExA decides it is necessary to ensure representations are adequately tested or that an IP has had a fair chance to puts its case.
