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## **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 Background**

1.1.1 This response to the Planning Inspectorate's ('PINS') advice under Section 51 of the Planning Act 2008 (the 'PA 2008') and acceptance checklist under Section 55 of the PA 2008 (Document Ref. 1.7) has been prepared on behalf of H2 Teesside Limited. It forms part of the application (the 'Application') for a Development Consent Order (a 'DCO'), that has been submitted to the Secretary of State (the 'SoS') for the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero ('DESNZ'), under Section 37 of the PA 2008 in respect of the H2 Teesside Project.

### **1.2 The Purpose and Structure of this Document**

1.2.1 The purpose of this document is to provide the Applicant's response to the advice issued by PINS pursuant to Section 51 of the PA 2008 and comments set out in the Section 55 acceptance checklist following the decision by PINS (on behalf of the SoS for DESNZ) to accept the application for examination on 22 April 2024.

1.2.2 Table 2.1 within Section 2.0 sets out the Applicant's response to the Section 51 advice. The comments made by PINS are reproduced in the second column and the Applicant's response is provided in the third column, with the fourth column confirming which of the Application documents have been updated or where new documents have been provided.

1.2.3 Table 3.1 within Section 3.0 sets out the Applicant's response to the Section 55 acceptance checklist comments. The checklist items and PINS comments are reproduced in the second and third columns respectively, with the Applicant's response and details of which Application documents have been updated in the fourth and fifth columns respectively.
