- 27. The national infrastructure process is administered through the Welsh Directorate of PINS on behalf of Welsh Ministers.
- 28. Provision is made for the fee structure to recognise the resource implications for LPAs in their role as principal consultees, discharging of conditions and enforcement of approved Development Consent Orders (DCOs).

WG enquired about the content and timescales of Local Impact Reports.

This was explained in detail by **SG** and reference was made to the Advice Note on Local Impact Reports:

Planning Porformance Agreements (PDAs)
Planning Performance Agreements (PPAs)
Linked to Recommendation 28 (as set out above), WG queried the use of Planning Performance Agreements.
SG advised that with regard to NSIPs, it is entirely a matter for local authorities how they choose to formalise working arrangements with applicants.
SG also advised that a PPA had been used as part of the Hinckley Point C New Nuclear Power Station between the Applicant and District/County Councils (link below).

Changes to Development Consent Orders
WG enquired about the process of dealing with requests for amendments to developments once they are submitted. SG advised that this is set out in Schedule 6 of the Planning Act 2008 'Changes to, and revocation of, orders granting development consent'.
SG also referred WG to the advice given on the Brig y Cwm energy from waste generating facility at Merthyr Tydfil.
