Guidance on MCZ assessment for Nationally Infrastructure Projects

Thank you for your letter of 24 April 2017 expressing your concerns.

We are aware of the response that the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy has made in response to your queries; the Planning Inspectorate endorses that response.

If an application for a Nationally Significant Infrastructure is accepted for examination, the Examining Authority will review the evidence relating to Marine Conservation Zones (MCZs) submitted by the Applicant and Interested Parties, including the advice from the relevant Statutory Nature Conservation Body. If necessary, the Examining Authority will address further questions to the Applicant and Interested Parties, with a view to ensuring that the relevant Secretary of State has sufficient evidence available to them to discharge their duties under sections 125 and 126 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009. The Examining Authority will make recommendations on matters relating to MCZs in their report to the Secretary of State.

With regard to an advice note in relation to MCZ assessments, the Planning Inspectorate does not have plans to produce a note at present but will keep this situation under review.
