## **Proposed A556 Knutsford to Bowdon Scheme**

Thank you for your letter dated 9 May 2013, as you pointed out in your letter the above scheme is in the acceptance stage of the process, and a decision will be made on or before 22 May 2013.

In accordance with the Planning Act 2008 and DCLG guidance on the pre-application process it is only the documents that are submitted to The Planning Inspectorate as part of the application, the Adequacy of Consultation response submitted by relevant Local Authorities and comments on consultation received before the application was submitted that can be considered during acceptance

As your representation was submitted after the submission of the proposed scheme, it cannot be taken into consideration for acceptance, you can however submit a relevant representation if the application is accepted.

If the application is accepted and you submit a relevant representation this will be taken into account by the Examining authority. In doing so, you will also become an interested party and kept informed throughout the process.
