I would like to register to attend this meeting. I already indicated that I would attend when registering as an interested party and this email if conformation that I plan to attend.

I would also like to speak at the meeting. I want to request that the planning for examination of the scheme has a commitment to include at least one meeting dedicated solely (or primarily) to NMU issues. NMU issues are a critical and complex part of the scheme and deserve a dedicated meeting.

I note that the list of "Principal Issues" listed in Annex C only appears to include the NMU elements as one item in a long list "Severance and access issues relating to public rights of way, non-motorised users, agriculture and the countryside". I would like to see the NMU elements identified as a separate topic and not included in a long list of mostly motorised transport issues.
