Dear Mr Coombes

I note that proposals for accompanied site visits are due to be with you by noon on Monday. I have the following suggestions for accompanied site visits to Brampton:

1. **Traffic** : With reference to the attached map of unaccompanied visits on 12 May, I note that the Panel do not appear to have visited the Brampton-Huntingdon Road or Thrapston Road from the Brampton roundabout to the A14. This is a road already carrying heavy traffic during peak hours. May I suggest a **morning visit (say 8.15am?)** to follow this route from Brampton racecourse to Huntingdon to experience traffic levels at that time?

This road is particularly busy in the weekday morning peak hours (and almost as busy in the evening) because it provides access to Hinchingsbrooke School (secondary), Hinchingsbrooke Hospital and Huntingdon rail station - where a clear view of the A14 viaduct (near the station access) can be obtained.

The inspection route could then continue around the Huntingdon ring road (AQMA) - unless this was carried out at this time on the previous visit.

2. **Noise and air pollution**

We could then return to Brampton to visit locations where noise pollution is already affecting residents quality of life and where increased air pollution is expected - including the village school.

3. **Flooding** -

Liz Olding's cottage is on Park Road near Centenary Way - you may have seen this location on your previous visit but if you wish to speak further to Liz this could also be included.

Hope this helps.
