With regard to the Planning Inspectorate's intention to have accompanied site visits on the 16<sup>th</sup> / 17<sup>th</sup> July'

The Parish Council of Offord Darcy and Offord Cluny would very much appreciate it if such a visit took place, covering the stretch of B1043 from the northern end of Offord Cluny to the top of Offord Hill. The turning into Offord Hill farm will provide a suitable vantage point, that can be safely accessed.

It is our opinion that this will provide visual evidence regarding :-

- i)        The impact on the landscape of the Ouse Valley
- ii)       An example of the resultant loss of viable and valuable farmland
- iii)      The limited effect of any proposed "mitigation" by Highways England.
